Mental Health awareness for public schools in Cebu City pushed

The Cebu City Council approved on Wednesday an ordinance mandating a mental health awareness seminar workshop program in the city's public schools.

City Ordinance 2770, titled institutionalizing the Mental Health Awareness Program for Public Schools in the City of Cebu, was authored by Councilor Mary Ann de los Santos.

The educational intervention aims at helping students understand mental health, counter stigma, and offer avenues that can improve lives by making learning enjoyable.

The Local School Board is tasked to implement CO 2770 in coordination with the City Health Department, Department of Education, and guidance counselors from various schools.

The program will be a co-curricular activity for graduating students that can be done through modular seminars. The seminar workshops will have five parts covering integrated health, mental health, dynamics of life experiences, coping strategies, and psychological first aid. This would cover all senior high students in public schools. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)**

Cebu business calls for unity, inclusive growth on new leaderships

Having new Governor in the Province.new City Mayors in Cebu, Mandaue and Lapu-Lapu, the Cebu Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) and Mandaue Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI) has called on unity, institutional collaboration, and economic reform.

CCCI president Jay Yuvallos has proposed a tripartite alliance between government, business, and civil society.

"This political transition is more than a change in leadership. It is a strategic opportunity to position Cebu as a globally competitive hub for innovation, investment, and sustainable development," Yuvallos said.

MCCI President Mark Ynoc reaffirmed the chamber's commitment to championing inclusive economic sectors which include healthcare, education, food security, and MSME(micro, small, and medium enterprise) development, being the foundation to Cebu's long-term growth and improved quality of life.

"Political colors must now give way to cooperation and shared purpose," he added.

Ynoc commended the outgoing officials, Mandaue City Mayor Jonas Cortes and Governor Gwendolyn Garcia for their service and expressed confidence in the incoming leadership's ability to foster economic resilience.

CCCI and MCCI emphasized that while Cebu remains one of the Philippines' most dynamic economic regions outside Metro Manila -- bouyed by its strategic location, demographic strength, and evolving infrastructure -- it continues to grapple with systemic challenges. These include regulatory deficiencies, infrastructure deficits, and persistent social disparities.

Both chambers identified ease of doing business, enhanced public-private partnerships, and the development of robust innovation ecosystems as critical levers for Cebu's next phase of economic transformation. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)**

Electricity rate in Metro Cebu reduced by P0.62 per kWh for May-June

The Visayan Electric announced yesterday that it decrease the May-June electricity bill by P0.62 per kilowatt-hour (kWh).

This brings the overall residential rate down to P11.16/kWh from last month's P11.78/kWh. For a household consuming 200 kWh, this translates to a savings of P124.

The reduction in rates is attributed to the lower cost of electricity in the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market (WESM), a trading platform where electricity is brought and sold.

"We are very much still in summer, thus our cooling appliances are using more energy to achieve our desired temperature and this consumes more electricity," said Visayan

Electric Senior Assistant Vice President for Engineering Operations, Engr. Mark Anthony Kindica. "If we are not mindful of our energy consumption, our bills could soar unexpectedly," he added.

Visayan Electric continues to remind consumers to be mindful of their electricity usage, as we are still in the dry season.

Although Cebu and nearby provinces have been experiencing scattered rains, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) maintains that the wet season has not yet begun.

Visayan Electric reminds the public to exercise caution when flying kites, especially now that the children are on summer

break and kite flying has become more common.

To ensure safety, please keep these tips in mind:
+Avoid flying kites near power lines or electrical facilities to prevent accidents or power interruptions.

+Use dry string or kite line--never use metallic or wet materials, as these can conduct electricity.

+Choose open spaces such as parks or fields, away from roads and electrical infrastructure.

Supervise children while they are flying kites to ensure they stay safe and follow proper guidelines. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)**

Noong nakraang linggo ay ang Port Operations Service sa pangunguna ni Director Atty. Marlon Fritz B. Broto, MNSA, ay nagsagawa ng high-level operational briefing kasama si District Collector Noel C. Estanislao ng Port of Subic. Ang pakikipag-ugnayan ay dinaluhan din ng mga Hepe ng iba't ibang dibisyon sa ilalim ng POS.

Ang meeting ay nagsilbing isang strategic na oryentasyon sa mga pangunahing operasyon ng port, mga balangkas ng pagsunod, at kasalukuyang mga hamon sa pagpapatakbo. Nilalayan nitong tiyakin ang pinag-isang pagkakaunawaan, isulong ang epektibong koordinasyon, at palakasin ang pagkakanayan ng institusyonal sa pagitan ng Port Operation Service at ng Port of Subic.

Higit pa sa mga usapin sa pamamaraan, binibigyang-diin ng briefing ang hindi natitinag na pangako ng POS sa pagpapaunlad ng matatag, collaborative na pakikipagsosyo sa mga daungan sa buong bansa. Muling pinagtibay nito ang madiskarteng pagtulak ng ahensya na isulong ang trade facilitation, bawasan ang port congestion, at i-maximize ang revenue collection, na naaayon sa mga marching order nina Commissioner Bienvenido Y. Rubio at Deputy Commissioner Vener S. Baquiran.

Ang inisyatiba na ito ay bahagi ng mas malawak na pagsisikap ng POS na itaguyod ang kahusayan sa pagpapatakbo at linangin ang isang kultura ng proactive na serbisyo, transparency, at patuloy na pagpapabuti sa mga port system ng bansa. Keep up the good work Director Broto at District Collector Estanislao.

Ang Bureau of Customs ay patuloy na nakakakuha ng malakas na revenue performance sa ilalim ng pamumuno ni Commissioner Bienvenido Rubio, kagaya na lang ang kontribusyon ng Port of Limay sa national collections.

Para sa unang quarter ng 2025, nakolekta ng Port of

Limay ang PHP 31.9 bilyon, na lumampas sa target na PHP 31.42 bilyon. Nagresulta ito sa surplus na PHP 475.58 milyon, o 1.51 porsiyentong positibong deviation.

"Ang tagumpay na ito ay sumasalin sa dedikasyon ng daungan sa Commissioner's 5-Point Priority Program, na nakatutok sa digitalization, secure trade facilitation, enhanced border protection, optimized revenue collection, at strengthened organizational development," sabi ni Port of Limay District Collector Atty. Kriden Balmogera.

Ang malakas na pagganap ng Abril 2025 ng Port of Limay ay higit na nagpalakas sa kabuuang koleksyon ng BoC. Ang port ay nag-ulat ng kabuuang koleksyon na PHP 11,361,590,005.93, na lumampas sa target nitong PHP 10,458,293,095.35. Isinalin ito sa surplus na PHP 903,296,910.58 o positibong paglihis na 8.64 porsiyento.

Ayon pa kay District Collector Atty. Kriden Balmogera at Deputy Collector Annuar Datudacula ang tagumpay ng Port of Limay ay dahil sa pasusumikap nila na malalagpasan ang koleksyong target at pagpapalakas ng mga hakbang sa pagpapatupad, at patuloy na suporta mula sa mga stakeholder.

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. acknowledged and thanked the Bureau of Customs (BOC) for its significant contribution to the Philippines' successful exit from the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) Grey List. It took three (3) arduous years, ten (10) reporting cycles, and face-to-face encounters with the FATF before the country was finally delisted.

Recognizing the adverse effects of the grey listing, the President issued Memorandum Circular No. 37 in October 2023, directing all relevant government agencies to promptly address the action plan items imposed by the International Cooperation Review Group. The BOC is one of these agencies covered by the Circular for its role in monitoring and ensuring that only legitimate cross-border movement of cash and monetary instruments is allowed. The importance of exiting the grey list was further emphasized when the President called for a high-level meeting on the first hour of the first working day of 2024.

Under the guidance of Department of Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto, the BOC has effectively ensured its enforcement programs were closely aligned with the country's broader fiscal and financial governance priorities.

Working alongside its partner agencies to bolster the

country's compliance with FATF standards, the BOC's robust border enforcement contributed directly to the country's favorable assessment during the FATF On-site Visit in January 2025. The FATF was particularly impressed by the BOC's key reforms, leading to a 455-fold increase in currency declarations and 194 seizures in 2024—surpassing the total interdictions in the last 10 years combined.

During the awarding ceremony, the President thanked the awardees for answering the clarion call. "The individuals we recognized today made this victory possible. They are the ones who worked towards creating a resilient framework to safeguard our financial system from criminal and terrorist activities," the President remarked.

42 institutional partners and over 200 individuals were recognized in the ceremony. President Marcos Jr. personally awarded Certificates of Commendation to Commissioner Bienvenido Y. Rubio and Deputy Commissioner Atty. Teddy S. Raval of the Enforcement Group.

"We view this success as both a validation and a responsibility. The Bureau of Customs will continue to evolve and innovate to safeguard the country against illicit financial flows and uphold its reputation in the global community," said Commissioner Rubio.

In addition to the recognition of Commissioner Rubio and Deputy Commissioner Raval, 10 other BOC officials and employees were also commended for their invaluable contributions to the country's successful exit from the FATF Grey List. The commendations were conferred by National Anti-Money Laundering/Counter-Terrorism Financing Coordinating Committee (NACC) Chairman and Executive Secretary Lucas P. Bersamin. These included key figures from various collection districts and divisions, namely Ninoy Aquino International Airport District Collector Maria Yasmin Obillos-Mapa and Deputy Collector for Operations Wilnora L. Cawile; Port of Clark Deputy Collector for Passenger Service Atty. Danilo G. Ballena, Jr.; Port of Manila Deputy Collector for Operations Atty. Gerard Turiano; Chief of the Prosecution and Litigation Division Atty. Christopher Dy Buco and Atty. Rod H. Pino from the Legal Service; SP/Capt. Vincent Mark S. Malasmas, SP/Lt. Danilo A. Jamito, and Customs Operations Officer V Genilyn D. Minardo of the Enforcement Group; and Ms. Liberty Plana, Chief of the Systems Development Division, Management Information Systems Technology Group.

BOC-NAIA Nasabat ang PhP4.43 Milyong Halaga ng Ipinagbabawal na Droga na nakasilid sa Anim na Parcel

Alinsunod sa direktiba ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. na paigtingin ang kampanya laban sa ipinagbabawal na droga at palakas ang seguridad sa mga pagpasok ng ilegal droga sa bansa, matagumpay na nasabat ng Bureau of Customs – Ninoy Aquino International Airport (BOC-NAIA), sa pakikipag-ugnayan sa Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) at sa NAIA Inter-Agency Drug Interdiction Task Group

(NAIA-IADITG), ang anim na parsela na naglalaman ng ilegal na droga na tinatayang nagkakahalaga ng PhP4,433,000 sa Central Mail Exchange Center (CMEC) sa Lungsod ng Pasay.

Ang mga nasabat na kargamento, na nagmula sa Ireland, Netherlands, at Thailand, ay idineklara bilang mga skincare items, isang board game, at mga materyales sa tubero na may tatak na "Sistema/Shower Set/Pipe Set" at "Kitchen Water Purifier." Sa isinagawang pisikal na inspeksyon, natuklasan ng mga tauhan ng adwana ang kabuuang 1,330 tableta ng Ecstasy at 362 gramo ng heroin na itinago sa loob ng mga pakete. Ang mga nakumpiskang droga ay isinuko sa PDEA para sa mas malalim na imbestigasyon at pagbuo ng kaso laban sa mga sangkot, na posibleng lumabag sa Republic Act No. 9165 (Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002) at Republic Act No. 10863 (Customs Modernization and Tariff Act).

Muling pinagtibay ni Customs Commissioner

Bienvenido Y. Rubio ang paninindigan ng ahensya, at sinabing "Patuloy ang ahensya sa walang humpay na pagsisikap upang maprotektahan ang ating mga Pantalan at Paliparan laban sa pagpasok ng ilegal na droga na banta sa kalusugan at kaligtasan ng ating mamamayan."

Ang pinakabagong operasyong ito ay nagpapakita ng pagtutok ni Pangulong Marcos sa pagpigil sa pagpasok ng ilegal na droga sa bansa sa pamamagitan ng pagpapatibay ng mga hakbang ng pagpapatupad ng batas at mas pinatibay na koordinasyon sa pagitan ng mga ahensya.

Sa pamumuno ni District Collector Atty. Yasmin O. Mapa, patuloy na pinapalakas ng BOC-NAIA ang kanilang mga hakbang sa pagpapatupad ng batas, pagpapahusay ng pagsusuri sa mga kargamento, at pakikipagtulungan sa mga katuwang na ahensya upang masigurong epektibong masabat ang mga ipinagbabawal na droga.

1.3k LGUs reactivate price council to monitor key commodities

MANILA – The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) said 1,350 local government units (LGUs) have reactivated their Local Price Coordinating Councils (LPCCs) to help monitor the supply and prices of rice and other key commodities.

Field reports show 1,269 LGUs are now conducting regular market inspections, 230 have deputized village officials and non-government organizations to monitor price spikes, and 1,201 are coordinating with national agencies to address hoarding and unjustified price hikes.

The DILG issued the directive to the LGUs under Memorandum Circular 2025-044 in support of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s goal of lowering rice prices nationwide, according to a news release Sunday.

The circular was also upon the recommendation of the National Price Coordinating Council and aligned with the Department of Agriculture's "Bantay Presyo" (Price Watch).

The LPCC is chaired by the local chief executive and includes national agency representatives, private sector stakeholders and consumer groups.

The local council's key functions include market inspection, price monitoring, and analysis of commodity price fluctuations.

Cashless transactions

The DILG said LGUs must also adopt electronic payment and collection systems (EPCS) in line with President Marcos Jr.'s push for digital transformation in government.

In a separate circular, the DILG encouraged LGUs to implement EPCS for collecting local taxes, fees and other charges.

Digital payments improve transparency, efficiency and public convenience, thus aligning with the National Retail Payment System Framework and the Data Privacy Act, the DILG said.

Amid digitalization, the DILG clarified that LGUs must still accept cash and other traditional

Beneficiaries all praises for PBBM's 4PH housing units

MANILA – Beneficiaries from various projects under President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s flagship Pambansang Pabahay Para sa Pilipino (4PH) program are all praises after receiving their respective housing units.

The Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) is continuously turning over 4PH units to beneficiaries in various parts of the country.

In the Palayan City Township Project in Nueva Ecija, hundreds of beneficiaries had been processed while some are now enjoying the amenities in the 23-hectare 4PH project in Barangay Atate.

"Sobrang saya kasi iba 'yung bumukod ka, na meron kayong sarili na matatawag ninyo pong sa inyo talaga (I'm so happy because we have now our own house)," Ma. Cassandra Gonzales, one of the beneficiaries of the project, said in a news release on Sunday.

Gonzales thanked President Marcos and DHSUD Secretary Jose Rizalino Acuzar for giving beneficiaries like her a chance to live in a condominium-style housing unit.

In Mindanao, several 4PH projects are also in advanced stages of completion, with units already being turned over to beneficiaries.

Among them are People's Ville in Davao City, Davao del Sur, and Valley View Township in Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental, where beneficiaries have already started moving in.

"Kami po 'yung first na naka-move in dito sa People's Ville pabahay program 4PH ng gobyerno. Isang buwan na po kami. Very comfortable. Maganda talaga, tsaka disente 'yung bahay kumpara sa dati (We are the first to move in here at People's Ville, the government's 4PH housing program. We have been here for a month. Very comfortable. Really nice, and the house is decent compared to before)," Evelyn Cuarta, an online seller, said.

"Ngayon, pag uulan, hindi na kami magworry kung babaha sa labas at tsaka hindi na talaga tutulo. Nagpapasalamat po kami kasi isa kami sa naka-avail sa pabahay, 4PH program ng ating gobyerno. Sa 22 years naming nagrenta, palipat-lipat, sa wakas nagkaroon na rin kami ng maayos at safe na bahay. Nagpapasalamat kami sa lahat ng bumubuo ng Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino Program (Now, when it rains, we no longer have to worry about flooding outside and there won't be leaks at all. We are grateful because we are one of those who availed of the housing, 4PH program of our government. After 22 years of renting, moving around, we finally have a house. We are grateful to all those behind the national housing for the Filipino program)," she added.

Kenneth Jane Rose Gasis, a child

development worker from the local government and one of the beneficiaries of the Valley View Township Project, also thanked President Marcos and Acuzar for choosing his family as among the beneficiaries.

"Sobra po akong na-amaze kasi hindi ko po akalain na ganun 'yung unit na ibibigay sa amin kasi napakaganda po (I'm so amazed because I didn't expect that we been given this kind of unit, very beautiful)," Gasis said.

Acuzar said the government has shown that it can provide sustainable township development through 4PH as evidenced by ongoing projects all over the country.

"Sabi po sa akin ng mahal na Pangulo... kung magbibigay ka ng pabahay, 'wag kamukha noong pabahay noong araw. Bigyan mo ng dignidad 'yung mga mahihirap na magkabahay at maexperience din ang buhay kung ano meron ang mayaman (Our dear President told me, if you are going to provide housing, don't look like the housing of the past. Give the poor the dignity of having a home and also experiencing life like what the rich have)," Acuzar said.

Another 4PH project with turned-over units is the Asenso Yuhum Residences in Bacolod City in Negros Occidental.

Meanwhile, hundreds of units are ready for turnover at the Crystal Peak Estates in the City of San

Other ongoing projects with buildings already in advanced stages of construction are EL Sand Residences in Laoag, Ilocos Norte; Bocaue Bulacan Manor; Abuab Towers in San Mateo, Rizal; Pilar, Bataan; San Miguel in Manila; and Pili in Camarines Sur. **(PR)**

Mongolian FM visits PH May 19-20 for new avenues of cooperation

MANILA – Mongolian Foreign Minister Battsetseg Batmunkh is set to embark on an official visit to the Philippines on May 19 and 20, the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) said Sunday.

Battsetseg will hold a bilateral meeting with her counterpart, Foreign Affairs Secretary Enrique Manalo, and review the state of Philippine-Mongolian relations. She is also scheduled to pay a courtesy call on President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. and meet with Senate President Francis Escudero.

The DFA said her visit to the Philippines, the first by a Mongolian foreign minister since 1984, would help “chart ways forward to further enhance the two countries' diplomatic relations.”

On top of the bilateral cooperation, the DFA said the two foreign ministers would also discuss “strategic issues of mutual concern.”

Battsetseg's upcoming Manila trip reciprocates Manalo's visit to Ulaanbaatar in August 2024, where they convened the 4th Philippines-Mongolia Policy Consultations.

During the meeting, the top diplomats of Manila and Ulaanbaatar discussed ways to promote trade, including the establishment of ties between Filipino and Mongolian business communities, and the potential for further cooperation on tourism, agriculture, English language training, and sports. **(PNA)**

PH backs ASEAN-wide visa, eyes tourism boost from unified entry

MANILA – The Department of Tourism (DOT) has expressed strong support for the creation of a unified ASEAN visa, saying it could help position the region as a single, powerhouse tourism destination.

Tourism Secretary Christina Garcia Frasco made the statement during the SKIFT Asia Forum 2025 in Bangkok, Thailand last Thursday, where she served as one of the key speakers.

The proposal, inspired by the European Schengen visa and the Gulf Cooperation Council's joint visa, is gaining traction among member states of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

“The ASEAN tagline is ‘A destination for every dream.’ And the ASEAN visa certainly is part of that dream,” Frasco said, as quoted in a DOT news release Sunday.

“To be able to unify the ASEAN as a destination... is one that is aspirational for us in the Philippines.”

She bared that there's “similar interest” from other Southeast Asian nations about the unified visa system.

“We are very hopeful that the subject matter will again come up as the Philippines hosts the ASEAN in 2026,” she said.

The Tourism chief underscored the potential of enhanced regional cooperation despite existing competition among ASEAN countries.

“Competition is always very healthy, but collaboration is healthier in a sense that ASEAN coming together to work as a force for good for the world would really benefit all of our countries,” she said.

She cited the Philippines' partnership with Thailand as an example, pointing to the implementation of their “Two Countries, One Destination” campaign.

Frasco also highlighted the Philippines' cultural and culinary diversity as key selling points to ASEAN tourists.

“What we bring to the table... is a story—a story of a proud people that is the result of generations of influence,” she said. “You arrive in the Philippines as a guest, but you leave as family.”

Amid declining arrivals from China, Frasco said the Department of Tourism is expanding efforts to attract visitors from new and growing markets such as India, the Middle East, and the Gulf states.

To cater to Muslim travelers, Frasco said the DOT has recognized more Halal-certified accommodations and restaurants, and launched the Muslim-friendly Marhaba Cove in Boracay island.

She also reported growing arrivals from Australia, South Korea, Japan, and the U.S., attributing the trend to improved connectivity and diversified tourism offerings such as diving, golf, and adventure travel.

“We are able to cater to any type of traveler,” Frasco said. “With the number of islands that we have and the readiness of these destinations, we are excited to welcome people of all nationalities.” **(PNA)**

Buyers give well-textured P20/kg rice stamp of approval

MANILA – A rice vendor at Mandaluyong Public Market II vouched for the quality of the PHP20-per-kilogram rice of the Kadiwa ng Pangulo program, saying it is comparable with more expensive varieties.

Brigida Mesa, 68, said the low-cost rice remains flavorful and well-textured, noting consistent positive feedback from buyers.

“Maganda naman po ‘yung bigas kasi ‘yung presyo lang naman ang bumaba pero ‘yung quality nandoon pa rin (The rice is good because only the price went down, but the quality is still there),” Mesa said, as quoted in a Presidential Communications Office (PCO) news release Sunday.

The PHP20-per-kilo rice was made available on May 13 through the Kadiwa program, which aims to provide low-cost agricultural goods directly to consumers, especially low-income families.

The initiative supports President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s commitment to making rice more accessible amid rising food costs.

Mesa, a long-time rice vendor, said many residents were initially skeptical but later praised the rice's taste and texture.

She added that the current price level gives consumers more value for their money.

“Marami talaga ‘yung nabili kasi biro mo ba naman ‘yung 20 pesos, parang mag-avail na sila ng two kilos na tig-40 pesos. Saka from 29 to 20 pesos, napakalaki ng binaba ng presyo, same quality naman (A lot of people really bought rice because for PHP20, it's like getting two kilos that used to cost PHP40. From PHP29 to PHP20 is a big drop and it's still the same quality),” she said.

Mesa likened the affordability to a buy-one, take-one deal, stressing that the savings allow families to purchase other basic needs.

“Dahil sa Kadiwa ng Pangulo, malaking bagay at malaking tulong talaga sa mga tao dito sa nasasakupan namin sa barangay. Kasi biruin mo ba naman ‘yung 20 pesos, makakabili pa sila ng ibang bagay pa na sa savings nila ... hindi na masyadong maghirap ‘yung mga tao kasi malaki ang matitipid nila (Because of Kadiwa ng Pangulo, it's a huge help to the people in our barangay. With PHP20, they can buy other items from their savings ... people don't have to struggle as much because they save a lot),” she said.

Mesa said the program has brought satisfaction not just to consumers, but also to vendors like her.

“Grabeng laking tulong sa mga tao. Saka kahit ikaw na nagtitinda, masaya ka na na-a-avail nila ‘yung mababa kasi masaya din sila kaya nga nagdagsaan ng pila (It's an immense help to the people. Even as a vendor, it makes you happy that they can access the low price because they're happy, too. That's why the lines are long),” she said.

The program, officially the “Benteng Bigas Meron Na!” or BBM Na!, was initially launched in Cebu province and in eight select Kadiwa ng Pangulo (KNP) Centers in Metro Manila on May 1 and 2, respectively.

Eligible families, or the indigents, senior citizens, solo parents, and persons with disabilities, may purchase 10 kg of rice weekly or a total 40 kg monthly.

The government is eyeing to make PHP20

per kilo rice open to all Filipinos, not just the vulnerable sectors, by 2026. **(PNA)**
