At least three 40-footer Vans which contained misdeclared fresh carrots from China were intercepted at the Bureau of Customs -Port of Manila (BOC-POM). And this is valued over 13.2 million.

The shipment arrived on 2 October 2025, and an Alert Order was issued by POM District Collector Alexander Gerard Alviar after a derogatory report was received.

On 17 October, the shipment had a full examination which Customs Examiners discovered 53,283.88 kilograms of fresh carrots misdeclared as bathroom fixtures, napkins, and storage boxes.

Smuggled Carrots continue

"We are already preparing the necessary legal actions against those responsible. Misdeclaration is a deliberate act to deceive the government and harm our farmers. The BOC will pursue this case with due process and determination," said Assistant Commissioner Vincent Philip Maronilla.

Maronilla emphasized that BOC will ensure accountability through proper legal channels.

A Warrant of Seizure and Detention (WSD) has been issued against the shipment for violation of Section 1400 and 117 or Misdeclaration and Lack of Import Permit, in relation to Section 1113 or Property Subject to Seizure and Forfeiture of the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA).

BOC Commissioner Ariel Nepomuceno reaffirmed the BOC's commitment to President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s directive to protect local farmers and uphold fair trade.

"These illegal shipments directly affect the livelihood of our farmers and the integrity of lawful trade.

Under the President's directive, we are intensifying our border protection measures and improving coordination with other government agencies to stop these unlawful activities at their source. The BOC remains firm in its duty to ensure that only legitimate goods enter the country, safeguarding not only our economy but also the welfare of every Filipino farmer," Nepomuceno stressed.

On the WATCH will sustain its vigilance against all forms of smuggling. This was the cause of my ambush on 16 December 2021 at the Port area in Cebu City.

Power rate declines for Oct-Nov billing in Metro Cebu

The Visayan Electric announced on Thursday that residential consumers can expect lower electricity bills by 1.00/kWh.

This brings the overall residential rate down to 11.51/kWh from 12.51/kWh in the previous month.

For a typical household consuming 200 kWh per month, the decrease translates to about 200 in savings.

The lower rate comes as power prices in the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market (WESM) declined, allowing households to benefit from reduced generation charges that make up most of a customer's electricity bill.

Visayan Electric OIC-President and General Manager Engr. Mark Anthony Kindica expressed optimism, saying, "Every bit of savings counts, especially for families working hard to manage daily expenses. We hope this reduction offers some relief and positivity as we move forward the holiday season." The company also extended its concern to customers affected by recent earthquakes and aftershocks across the franchise area.

Visayan Electric assured customers affected by recent safe and that teams continue to closely monitor the system to keep every home powered and secured.

"We know these times are difficult, and we want every customer to feel assured that Visayan Electric is here-- keeping homes safe, lights on, and families connected," Engr. Kindica added.

As the holiday season approaches, Visayan Electric encourages families to make their celebrations brighter, safer, and energy-efficient. Using LED Christmas lights instead of traditional bulbs, unplugging appliances and charger s when not in use. CTA orders release on seized imported rice

The Court of Tax Appeals (CTA) ordered the release on Wednesday around 40 million worth of seized imported rice from Barangay San Roque, Talisay City, Cebu. In a resolution promulgated on 7 October 2025 signed by Associate justices Ma. Belen Liban, Corazon Flores, and Ma. Rowena

San Pedro, said it is lifting the seizure order against River Valley Distribution INC.(RVDI) and Mixed Load Distribution Network INC.(MLDNI).

CTA-Second Division found out that the 2

companies have fully complied with importation requirements, including payment of all duties and taxes.

The over 20,000 bags of rice were seized in July by the Anti-Agricultural Smuggling and Economic Sabotage Council. RVDI legal counsel Jhonelle Estrada Tan-Kit said the company is studying possible legal steps.

"Protecting the market from smuggling is a noble good, but it must never come at the expense of law-abiding, tax-paying businesses," Kit said. "It marks the end of months of disruption, reputational harm, and operational

paralysis caused by a mistaken enforcement action."

According to a joint compliance filed Oct. 1, the Bureau of Customs confirmed that RVDI imported 1,080,000 kilograms of rice from Pakistan and Vietnam through the Port of Cebu, while MLDNI imported 27,930,000 kilograms from Vietnam through the Subport of Dumaguete.

Police earlier said the seized rice allegedly exceeded the threshold for economic sabotage under Republic Act 12022, or the Anti-Agriculture Economic Sabotage Law which is more than 10 million. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

11 new flights boosting Cebu airport

The Mactan Cebu international Airport (MCIA) announced on Friday that 11 more new flights are coming in the fourth quarter.

In its advisory, the 11 new flights will be introduced by six airlines between October and December as this is when air travel demand is at the highest.

On October 26, Cebu Pacific is bringing in daily flights to El Nino, while Philippine Airlines (PAL) is putting up

weekly trips to Calbayog City.

By November 15, AirAsia Philippines will be having twice daily flights to Kuala Lumpur and thrice a week to Macau. This airline is also pairing with weekly trips to Davao at 18 times, Caticlan by 11 times, and Iloilo four times. By December 2, Firefly will be linking Cebu and Kuala Lumpur on five times a week.

By December 3, Vietnam Airlines will introduce its

weekly flights between Cebu and Hanoi.

Also by December, Jetstar is connecting Cebu and Brisbane on a three times a week schedule. A lone direct flight to Australia.

By December 4, PAL will launch non-stop flights to Guam which gives Cebu the only direct access to a US island territory.

Agri Trucks, PUVs to Enjoy 90-Day Toll Reprieve as CAVITEX Implements New Rates

MANILA, October 24, 2025 — The Toll Regulatory Board (TRB) has approved the toll rate adjustments for the Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) following petitions filed by joint venture partners CAVITEX Infrastructure Corporation (CIC) and Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA) in 2020 and 2023. The new rates will take effect on October 28, 2025.

To help ease the impact of the toll increase, CAVITEX' "Abante Program" will be reactivated — a toll reprieve initiative allowing registered public utility vehicles (PUVs) and agricultural trucks to continue paying old toll rates for 90 days from implementation.

Transport groups not yet enrolled may contact 1-35000 or email customer care@mptc.com to know more about the program and how to avail.

"We appreciate the government's affirmation to honor its contractual obligations with the Private Investors and Toll Operators," said CAVITEX management. While the rate adjustments are necessary to ensure continued maintenance, safety, and improvement of the expressway, we also recognize the need to support sectors most affected by rising transport costs. The toll reprieve initiative seeks to strike a fair balance between infrastructure sustainability and public welfare.

New Toll Rates

The TRB resolution grants the 2020 and 2023 petitions, authorizing the implementation of provisionally approved toll rates to support ongoing upgrades and maintenance activities.

CAVITEX R1 Portion (Seaside to Zapote) – VAT-inclusive rates effective October 28, 2025:

Talagang hindi titigil ang misipag na Customs Commissioner Ariel Nepomuceno hanggat di nawawakasan ang smuggling at ibang gumagawa ng katiwalian sa Aduana.

SMC Infrastructure, Metro Pacific Tollways, complete interoperability of Luzon expressways

The long-anticipated interoperability of expressways operated by SMC Infrastructure and Metro Pacific Tollways Corp. throughout Luzon is now complete, with both firms officially launching the One RFID program Tuesday in Calamba, in ceremonies attended by President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos, Jr.

"We are proud to announce the successful completion of interoperability between our electronic toll collection (ETC) systems, Autosweep and Easytrip. This latest feature will directly benefit motorists who will register for a new ETC account, as they will only need one radio frequency identification (RFID) and account to travel seamlessly across the Luzon expressway network," both companies said in a joint statement.

The One RFID program covers all toll roads in Luzon such as Tarlac-Pangasinan-La Union Expressway (TPLEX), Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX), North Luzon Expressway (NLEX), NLEX Connector, Skyway System, NAIA Expressway, Manila-Cavite Expressway (Cavitex), Cavitex-C5 Link, Muntinlupa-Cavite Expressway (MCX), Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX), South Luzon Expressway (SLEX), and the STAR Tollway.

Registering for the One RFID program is optional. Motorists with existing, separate Autosweep and Easytrip RFIDs and accounts may choose to join the toll interoperability program, but those who choose to maintain two separate RFID accounts, may also do so, the companies said.

This project was initiated by government through the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB), in line with their mandate to improve the efficiency of the country's expressway network.

The private operators had been working closely with government over the years, to make the vision of toll interoperability a reality.

"The road to One RFID was not easy, as it required extensive work on the part of all stakeholders. Both ETC providers made significant upgrades to their



existing infrastructure to integrate their systems, while conducting rigorous testing to ensure smooth and seamless interoperability," the firms said.

With the completion of the interoperability project, the expressway operators said their focus will now be on roll-out—making registration to the One RFID program more convenient and accessible—as well as continuous improvements to the system, to ensure overall better experience at the expressways for motorists.

"We express our gratitude to the leadership of the DOTR led by Secretary Giovanni Z. Lopez and TRB

Executive Director Jose Arturo M. Tugade for their steady hands in steering this project towards the finish line. Their valuable guidance helped us navigate the existing regulatory environment, which simplified settlement mechanisms, so that motorists can enjoy a smooth and secure experience," the companies said.

Turning Tables: A Working Student's Journey from the Production Floor to Magna Cum Laude

Porac, Pampanga — In a moment filled with pride and emotion, 25-year-old Kenneth Calma, a production employee at Meken Food Corporation, graduated Magna Cum Laude with a degree in Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education from Pampanga State University last August 12. But behind the medal and the applause is a story of grit, sacrifice, and unwavering love for family.

For Kenneth, earning a college diploma was not just a personal dream—it was also the dream of his entire family. Born and raised in Balubad, Porac, he is the son of Rosito and Reyna Calma, a barangay tanod and a devoted housewife. Growing up in a household with eight siblings, life was never easy. But it was always filled with hope.

Kenneth's siblings worked tirelessly to support the family. Linuel and Genesis served as house boys for Meken's Executive Officers, Lito and Adrian Garcia. Merwin worked in the warehouse, while Jennica and Jivon joined the packaging crew. His brother Rosito, with the help of the Garcia family, graduated with a degree in Accountancy from Holy Angel University and became the family's breadwinner, until illness struck. While his twin brother, Kevin, was not able to finish his studies.

At a young age, Kenneth knew that the card he was dealt with was not easy. Yet, he never let that stop him. While still in Grade 12, he began working as an on-call worker at Meken, doing everything from sweeping warehouse floors to carrying goods and cleaning homes. He was determined to help, to contribute, and to dream.

In 2020, Kenneth became a regular employee at Meken, working as a checker in the packaging section. Then he resigned in 2021 at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, but he continued part-time work in the warehouse while enrolling at Don Honorio Ventura State University (now Pampanga State University) to pursue a degree in Elementary Education. In 2023, he reapplied and returned to Meken as a production worker.

His days were long and his nights even longer. Kenneth worked from 6 PM to 2:30 AM, often extending his shift just to earn a little more for tuition. After a few hours of sleep, he would go to school from 7 AM to 4 PM. The exhaustion was real, he often fell asleep in class, but his teachers understood. He was excelling, despite the odds.

There were moments of doubt, even depression. Kenneth admitted that he initially kept his studies a secret from his supervisor, afraid of losing the job he loved. But he held on, driven by a promise to himself and to his mother, who always dreamed of having a teacher in the family.

With tears in his eyes, Kenneth shared, "Wala po lahat ng ito kung wala yung nanay ko at pamilya ko. Lahat ng ginagawa ko ay para sa kanila. Gusto ko baguhin yung cycle ng buhay namin para mabago ang buhay namin."

And he did. With years of hard work, sleepless nights, and relentless determination, Kenneth graduated Magna Cum Laude.

His achievement is not just his—it belongs to his family, his community, and to Meken, which stood by him through it all.

Meken played a vital role in Kenneth's journey—not just as an employer, but as a support system. From the production floor to the executive offices, Kenneth and his

Over 150 participants composed of local entrepreneurs, members of various cooperatives across Cavite, Public Employment Service Office (PESO) Managers from different local government units, and representatives from



various Provincial Government of Cavite offices gathered on October 24, 2025, for the event “Empowering Cavite Entrepreneurs Through Technology.”

Held at the Admin Function Hall of the New Provincial Government Center, the program was spearheaded by the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in partnership with Board Member Camille V. 4 CALABARZON young farmers fly to Israel for 11-month agri-internship



Four promising young farmers from CALABARZON are set to broaden their horizons as they embark on an 11-month internship in Israel under the Philippine-Israel Internship Program for the Youth—a joint initiative of the Department of Agriculture (DA) through the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) and Israel's AgroStudies international training center and Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.

These CALABARZON delegates are Ma. Norilyn Miras, Dailyn Ayes, and Karlo Pujalte from Infanta, Quezon; and Aldwin Jeus Diolola from Siniloan, Laguna. Meanwhile, Jerald Mangaya from Pangil, Laguna, is also preparing to join soon to complete the CALABARZON delegation.

The program aims to equip young Filipino farmers with advanced knowledge and hands-on experience in agricultural extension systems, national agricultural programs, innovations, and best farming practices in Israel. Prior to their departure, they underwent a series of pre-departure activities designed to ensure their holistic readiness for the international learning experience. These included an orientation and briefing on Israeli culture and traditions, which introduced them to the social norms, religious practices, and customs of their host country.

They also attended a lecture on business enterprise plan development, aimed at nurturing their entrepreneurial mindset. The session guided participants in developing viable business plans, helping them translate

their upcoming practical training into real-world agricultural enterprises when they return home.

38 interns from the country have already been deployed, while 12 other interns are still waiting for their deployment.

For Ma. Norilyn Miras, one of the interns, the experience represents both an opportunity and a responsibility.

"I expect the AgroStudies Internship Program to give me a strong combination of practical experience, professional knowledge, and personal growth," she shared. "I want to learn modern and sustainable farming methods that I can apply when I return, helping develop modern and resilient agriculture in our country."

Through the AgroStudies Internship Program, these CALABARZON delegates are expected not only to gain new skills and knowledge but also to become catalysts of agricultural transformation in their communities by bringing innovation, leadership, and a renewed passion for farming that can inspire other Filipino youth to pursue a future in agriculture. **News by: Archie C.
