



4th quarter CTEC meeting highlights collaboration for expanded skills training in Cavite



The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority – Cavite in partnership with the Office of the Provincial Public Employment Service Manager (OPPESM) successfully convened the 4th Quarter Community Training and Employment Coordinators (CTEC) Meeting on November 27, held at the 2nd Floor Function Hall, New Provincial Government Center in Trece Martires City. The gathering brought together TVET coordinators from various local government units across the province, reinforcing Cavite's commitment to expanding community-based skills development and employment opportunities.

The program formally opened with an inspiring message from Ms. Rizalie Pinpin-Enero, OPPESM Head, who acknowledged the vital role of CTECs in driving inclusive growth by ensuring that Caviteños have access to quality skills training and livelihood opportunities.

The meeting highlighted key updates and accomplishments in Technical-Vocational Education and Training (TVET) implementation in Cavite. Ms. Rowena D. Nomio, Community-Based Training (CBT) Focal of TESDA, presented the 2025 accomplishments on livelihood programs, vocational education, and community-based training initiatives implemented across different LGUs. Her report underscored the continuous and collaborative efforts to uplift communities through accessible skills training and livelihood support.

Adding depth to the discussion, Mr. Allan T. Pastrana, TESDA Specialist II and Regional CBT Focal, conducted an orientation on Community-Based TVET Programs, emphasizing their importance in addressing local skills gaps and supporting grassroots development. His presentation provided coordinators with updated guidelines and strategies to enhance program implementation in their respective localities.

The meeting concluded with strengthened coordination among LGUs and TESDA partners, paving the way for more impactful and responsive TVET programs for Caviteños in the coming year. (JDP)

The Bureau of Customs-Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) together with the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) intercepted high-grade marijuana or Kush valued at P14.9 million at the NAIA Terminal 3 in Pasay City.

The interdiction operation was conducted on November 28, 2025 which resulted into the seizure of a luggage with 18 vacuum-sealed transparent pouches containing approximately 9,940 grams of dried leaves suspected to be Kush.

"We will remain steadfast and sustain our dedication in upholding our duty to secure the safety of the country's borders," said NAIA District Collector Atty. Yasmin Mapa. "Those who seek to misuse our borders for illegal activities will be met with decisive action. Our duty stands clear, and that is to protect our people from the dangers of illegal drugs," said Customs Commissioner Ariel

Cebu hosts first TESDA diploma skills course for semiconductors, electronics

The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) has tapped Cebu to host its first ever skills training course on semiconductors and electronics.

TESDA Deputy Director General for Administration & Innovation Galo Glinio II said the pilot diploma program for semiconductors in Cebu is the first as he emphasized the role in transforming the tech sector and addressing emerging skills needs.

He explained that the program is free and supported by scholarship funds, prioritizing young people but inclusive of everyone, even those without a high school diploma.

This TESDA program is dubbed as ladderized

Philippine Qualification Framework (PQF).

It serves as a proof of concept for a scalable national model that addresses workforce gaps in high-technology, supports industry upgrading and enhances the global competitiveness of Filipino technicians and technologists.

A total of seven Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), five Technical-Vocational Institutions (TVIs) one TESDA-Administered School took part in developing 30 program applications or learners.

The semiconductors and electronics industry has been contributing to the Philippine economy of about 45 billion dollars, bigger than the Information Technology - Business Processing Outsourcing industry.

The semiconductors and electronics tops our export sector with 62.4 percent merchandise exports in 2022.

The goal is to produce 128,000 semiconductors engineers and technicians by 2028.

The global semiconductor industry has rebounded strongly since 2024, driven by advances in artificial intelligence, data centers, electric vehicles, and next-generation electronics.

Asia continues to lead this growth, with countries such as Taiwan, Malaysia, Singapore, Vietnam, and Thailand deepening their specialization and collaboration across the semiconductor value chain. **(By RICO MIRASOLOSMENA)**

Indian national arrested for opium

Police operatives arrested on Friday, an Indian national allegedly selling opium inside his minimart in Cebu City.

Lalith Chellaram Sangwani, 42, was apprehended by the members of the Philippine National Police Drug Enforcement Group (PDEG-7) with the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA-7) around 3:20 pm at the Arcade Building, F. Cabahug Street, Barangay Kamputhaw, Cebu City.

He is currently residing in the said barangay.

The operatives seized 24 bottles containing suspected opium from him.

Opium is a key ingredient used to produce illegal substances such as heroin, codeine, and morphine.

The opium weighed 320 grams and has a standard drug price of 208,000.

Informations were received that Sangwani was selling illegal drugs aside from his minimart business.

PDEG-7 through its acting commander of Special Operation Unit, Police Lt. Col. Eduardo Guevara Jr.

conducted a one-week surveillance.

Then a search warrant was issued by Regional Trial Court (RTC) 7th Judicial Region Branch 17 in Cebu City signed by Executive Judge Anacleto Debalucos.

Other items seized from Sangwani were plastic bag containing cash amounting to 163,455,000, 24 ATM cards from various banks, six cellular phones, and a watch.

Charges for violation of Section 11, Article II of Republic Act 9165 or the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002 has been filed against Sangwani. **(By RICO MIRASOLOSMENA)**

Cebu welcomes Australia, Vietnam, Malaysia flights

The Mactan Cebu International Airport Authority (MCIAA) and Aboitiz InfraCapital Cebu Airport Corporation (AICAC) welcomed on Wednesday, three new international flights from and to Brisbane, Australia, Hanoi, Vietnam, and Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

According to Australian Ambassador to the Philippines Marc Innes-Brown, "This is a tangible demonstration of the Australian government's commitment to do more business with the Philippines and facilitate greater economic links."

He indicated that the move is aimed at long-term connection between the regions, while also hoping to boost the short-term recovery of Cebu's economy.

"The timing of the introduction of this service will hopefully make a contribution to Cebu's recovery from the terrible typhoon a few weeks ago," Innes-Brown stressed.

These flights are operated by JetStar Airways, an Australian low-cost aviation group launched in 2004, which operates over 130 routes to more than 50 destinations. JetStar is under the wing of Qantas Group.

The Philippines and Australia had updated their air services agreements in September, with the intention of doubling passenger capacity from 35 to 70 weekly flights to primary Australian cities by the fourth quarter of 2026.

JetStar already launched direct flights from Perth to Manila in November, and currently operates five routes from Western Australia to Asia - Manila, Singapore, Bangkok, Phuket and Bali.

The Department of Tourism (DOT) cited that the direct access to Central and Southern Philippines will be of economic benefits for Cebu and Philippine tourism.

Travelers from Brisbane will have easy reach of Cebu's beach resorts, Cebu City's Spanish colonial landmarks, and ferry connections to neighboring islands such as Bohol and Siquijor.

Secondly, a strong and growing Australian market. Australia is one of the Philippines' top inbound markets, with a loyal visitor base.

Around 53 percent of Australian visitors are repeat travelers who return to favorites like Cebu City, Boracay, and Puerto Princesa.

From January to November 2025, Australia climbed to fourth largest source market, which accounts to 5.6 percent of total arrivals, with 293,588 visitors and roughly 16 percent year-on-year growth.

DOT data disclosed that 66 percent of Australian visitors are vacation-focused rather than business travelers. Which means they are primed to spend on leisure

activities, accommodations, and dining.

About 58 percent purchase local food products and delicacies.

Meanwhile, another International flight from Hanoi, Vietnam arrived on 3 December 2025 at the Mactan Cebu international Airport (MCIA). This is the first ever Cebu and Vietnam direct connection.

The inaugural flight was welcomed by Ambassador to the Philippines Lai Thai Binh. This is operated by Vietnam Airlines.

While the newest Kuala Lumpur -Cebu connected landed at MCIA on Tuesday. This is operated by Firefly Airlines. **(By RICO MIRASOLOSMENA)**

ACT Inc. at FFCCCII, tagumpay ang kanilang outreach program! BOC, aktibong nakikipagtulungan sa Balikbayan and OFW Action Center (BOAC)

Napakaganda ang tulungan ng Assembly of Customs Travelers, Inc. (ACT Inc.), at Federation of Filipino-Chinese Chamber of Commerce and Industry Inc. dahil sa magandang program nila para sa mga nangangailangan.

Itong nakaraang linggo ay matagumpay ang kanilang Year-End Celebration and Outreach Program na ginananap sa Barangay Sta. Lucia, Dolores, Quezon.

Ang outreach program ay pinangunahan ni Welfare Committee vice chairman Nelson Licup, at ng Philippine National Police Provincial Police Strategy Management Unit sa ilalim ni PLTCOL AI Loren P. Bigay at PLTCOL William G. Angway Jr., na may buong koordinasyon at suporta mula kay Barangay Captain Emer Bujactin.

Para sa ating mga bagong bayani sa ibang bansa, bawat balikbayan box ay simbolo ng kanilang taong sakripisyo at pagsisikap na masuportahan ang kanilang mga pamilya sa Pilipinas. Noong 04 Disyembre 2025, muling nabigyan ng pag-asa ang mga Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) nang suportahan ng Bureau of Customs (BOC), sa pamamagitan ng Balikbayan and OFW Action Center (BOAC), ang pagsampa ng kaso laban sa Makati Express Cargo, Inc. (MECI) sa National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) sa Pasay City.

Itinatag ang BOAC bilang bahagi ng kampanya ni Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno upang pangalagaan ang interes ng mga OFWs at palakasin ang mga sistema na magga- garantiya na ang kanilang mga padala ay maipoproceso nang tama, maayos, at may integridad.

Sa pamumuno ni Deputy Commissioner Michael C. Fermin ng Internal Administration Group, aktibong nakikipagtulungan ang BOAC sa mga apektadong OFWs sa pagkalap ng mga hinaing, pagsiyasat sa mga reports, at pagtukoy sa mga karampatang kaso laban sa mga mapang-abusong kumpanya.

Ang prosesong ito ang naging susi upang tuluyang makapagsampa ng kaso ang mga OFWs laban sa MECI - isang mahalagang bahagi sa patuloy na misyon ng BOAC na protektahan ang kanilang karapatan at tiyakin na ang sinumang responsable ay haharap sa mata ng batas.

Ibinahagi din ni Deputy Commissioner Fermin ang patuloy na pagtutulong ng BOC, NBI, Department of Finance, at kaukulang mga embahada sa pagbuo ng matibay na kaso laban sa mapang-abusong logistics operators, "We have already met with the Philippine Embassy and the Embassy of Qatar to discuss ways to halt these operations and ensure accountability even overseas. We hope this step sends a clear message that the

Philippine government will not tolerate this kind of abuse against our kababayans, especially during the holiday season."

Sa pamumuno ni Commissioner Nepomuceno, patuloy na nakikipag-ugnayan ang BOAC sa national government upang siguruhin na ang lahat ng apektadong balikbayan boxes ay maipapadala pa rin sa kanilang mga recipients.

Ayon kay Commissioner Nepomuceno, "Patuloy na isusulong ng Bureau of Customs ang mas maayos at transparent na sistema sa proseso ng balikbayan boxes at papanagutin ang sinumang lalabag sa karapatan ng mga OFWs, alinsunod sa direktiba ng ating Pangulo na pagtuunang maigi ng pansin ang mga hinaing ng ating mga kababayan. Bukod sa pagsuporta sa kanilang mga pamilya, sila rin ay katuwang ng gobyerno sa patuloy na pagpapaunlad ng ekonomiya ng bansa."

Pinaalala naman ni Atty. Angelito DLP Magno, O cer-In-Charge - Director ng NBI, ang kahalagahan ng inter-agency cooperation. "Sa tulong ng ating BOC at ng iba pang ahensya ng gobyerno, ibibigay natin lahat ng ating maibigay na tulong para mabantayan ang karapatan nila (OFWs). Umpisahan natin na imbestigahan ito, alamin natin kung saan ang magiging puno't-dulo nito para kung sino man ang kailangang managot sa pamamagitan ng pagkalap natin ng ating mga ebidensya ay mapanagot sila."

Nagpaabot naman ng pasasalamat ang 14 complainants na karamihan ay mula sa Middle East sa gabay at tulong ng BOC mula sa initial reporting ng kanilang reklamo hanggang sa pormal na pagsampa ng kaso.

Isa rin sa kanila ang nagsabi, "Sa ating mga kababayang OFWs, mag-ingat tayo sa mga kumpanyang pinagkakatiwalaan natin sa pagpapadala ng balikbayan boxes. Nagpapasalamat din ako sa BOC sa mabilis nilang aksiyon at pagtulong sa pagsampa ng kaso, at sa NBI sa mainit na pagtanggap at pagtulong na mapanagot ang mga responsable sa kasong ito."

Ang hakbang na ito ay bahagi ng mas malawak na misyon ng BOC na palakasin ang integridad sa operasyon ng customs, pangalagaan ang kapakanan ng OFWs, at sugpuin ang anumang uri ng unlawful trade practices.

Pinapaalalahanan din ng BOC ang lahat ng OFWs na maging mapanuri at iwasang makipagtransaksyon sa mga kahina-hinalang freight forwarding companies sa ibang bansa - lalo na iyong may nakaraang kaso ng kapabayaang, non-delivery, o anumang paglabag sa batas - upang matiyak na ligtas at maayos makararating sa kanilang pamilya ang kanilang pinaghirapang mga padala.
