



Danao Mayor says "No to DPWH infra projects"

Danao City of approximately ₱89.35 million.

Durano argues that the proposed works were largely road repairs and office construction, ignoring the catastrophic damage left by Typhoon TINO.

Durano has called on President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. to reprogram these funds toward urgent bridge reconstruction and flood mitigation.

According to the DPWH website portal, Danao City had a total of 132 Infrastructure projects from 2016 to 2025 which amounted to ₱3.4 billion, with ₱417 million allocated for five flood control projects implemented from 2022 to 2023.

The city's technical review found that DPWH was planning to tear up and re-concrete roads that are still "structurally sound and serviceable."

"Sad to note that the projects submitted by the DPWH to Mayor Nito for 2026 are not among the city's priority projects," Vice Mayor Ivy Durano said.

She cited that there are still many roads in Danao that truly need to be concreted, why tear up those that are already in good condition?."

The city insists that climate resilience and disaster risk reduction should dictate the 2026 budget. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

WattWatch launched in Visayas

The Department of Energy - Visayas Field Office (DOE-VFO) launched on Friday the WattWatch Campaign in Cebu, a long-term program aimed at addressing the environmental and economic impacts of wasteful energy use.

DOE-VFO Regional Director Renante Sevilla reiterated energy conservation is a shared responsibility, adding that small efforts by individuals can collectively help secure a more sustainable future.

"Simple acts like turning off unused lights, choosing efficient appliances, and improving our daily habits," he said.

"Every watt matters, and every watt saved helps our economy, our environment, and our energy security," he added.

"Aside from your registration from the SEC as a legal company, you have to have a certification to invite investors," Radaza cited.

"Be warned that there are many online lending companies that are illegal, you maybe enticed to loan but they would ask you seed money," He added.

consumption is essential.

"For example, if a household consumes around 100 kilowatts-hours per month, we want to see at least a 10-kilowatt-hour reduction," She stressed.

Citing Cebu has about half a million households, and achieving this level of reduction could already make a significant difference in overall power demand.

DOE-VFO aims to produce at least 1,000 certified WattWatchers in the Tri-Cities of Cebu, Mandaue, and Lapu-Lapu.

The DOE will partner with the Department of Education (DepEd) and tap senior high school students as pilot "WattWatchers," or advocates of energy conservation as instilling energy-saving habits at an early stage.

Cebu City now can sell P20/kilo rice

After months of delay, the Presidential Rice program on selling ₱20 per kilo will now be availed in Cebu City.

This after the divided Cebu City Council voted to implement it.

Mayor Nestor Archival may now sign with the national government which is an agreement that governs how they will conserve and sell the cheap rice.

In a special session by the City Council, the majority of its members voted for the implementation despite from the opposition led by Vice Mayor Tomas Osmeña.

"I would like to remind you of what happened in Mandaue, where there were so many hundreds of sacks of rice that were exploited...we are opening ourselves up to criticism," Osmeña said.

"Until the proponent can come up with an intelligent system safeguarding the resources of the city, I move to oppose the resolution," he added.

The Cebu City Legal Office had favorable legal opinion on the matter especially with the amended memorandum of agreement (MOA).

Under the amended agreement, the city

government will treat as consigned goods all rice deliveries from Food Terminal INC.(FTI), the national agency that supplies rice under the Kadiwa ng Pangulo program.

Ownership remains with FTI until the rice is actually sold, distributed, or otherwise validly disposed of.

The set up protects the city government's money.

City Attorney Briccio Joseph Boholst said the city acts as a consignee-administrator responsible for safekeeping, inventory reporting, and liquidation of rice.

There will be no obligation to pay for rice arises upon its delivery.

The city will disburse public funds only after actual sale or disposition of the product. This is consistent with established principles of government fiscal responsibility.

The legal opinion further noted that proceeds from rice sales are considered trust funds, subject to segregation, proper liquidation, and remittance only after verification. These provisions anticipate possible audit issues.

"This Office finds this arrangement legally significant as it clearly distinguishes the transaction from a sale and prevents premature transfer of ownership," said Boholst.

Archival requested FTI to initially deliver rice in limited batches, with sales and remittance handled directly by the agency.

"I will request for an initial 50 sacks of rice. I will prepare a memorandum of understanding. We will take the rice and they will deliver and sell it. We will pay them afterward," the mayor said.

He added that FTI May sell rice at ₱20 per kilo in designated selling area in the barangays.

For the pilot phase, the government allotted 10,000 sacks of rice.

Archival stressed that Cebu City would avoid the problems encountered in Mandaue City. Mandaue City reported spoilage of hundreds of sacks of rice.

Under the ₱20-per-kilo rice program, FTI supplies rice purchased at around ₱33 per kilo. The agency sells it at ₱20 while the national government and participating local governments cover the ₱13 subsidy.

The resolution authorizing the program passed narrowly with 7-6 with one abstention, after several deferrals.

Eligible beneficiaries include indigent families, senior citizens, persons with disabilities, solo parents, disaster victims, and indigenous peoples. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

Cavite holds 4th quarter joint CPPOC, PADAC, PTF-ELCAC council meeting; LGUs honored for excellence in barangay justice and security

The Cavite Provincial Peace and Order Council (CPPOC), Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC), and Provincial Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (PTF-ELCAC) convened their 4th Quarter Joint Meeting on December 17 at The Bayleaf Hotel in the City of General Trias, reaffirming the province's unified approach to maintaining peace, order, and community security.

ATI CALABARZON Trains Over 7,000 Farmers, Agri Stakeholders in 2025

In 2025, the Department of Agriculture (DA) capacity builder, the Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) in CALABARZON, equipped a total of 7,084 individuals with the knowledge and skills necessary to help steer a competitive and prosperous agriculture and fisheries sectors towards a vibrant economy.

As the catalyst and knowledge bank of the Philippine agriculture and fishery extension (AFE) system, the DA-ATI CALABARZON trained 4,783 farmers; 1,209 agricultural extension workers (AEWs) from various local government units; 555 DA staff; and 537 students, agri-enthusiasts, and individuals from the general public.

Training and other extension initiatives by the DA-ATI CALABARZON primarily focused on good agricultural practices, farm mechanization, climate-resilient agriculture, smart farming, and integrated nutrient and pest management.

These programs were not limited to the production aspect, as the agency also equipped the aforementioned individuals with technologies along the agricultural value chain, including post-harvest technologies, processing, and marketing—across different banner programs like rice, corn, livestock, Coconut Farmers and Industry Development Plan (CFIDP), High Value Crops Development Program (HVCDP), organic agriculture, and National Urban and Peri-urban Agriculture Program (NUPAP), and additional extension services.

John Mark Sto. Domingo, an agricultural and biosystems engineer from Teresa, Rizal, also shared how the DA-ATI CALABARZON helps extension workers like him in performing their duties at the grassroots level.

In his impression of the Training on Testing and Evaluation of Agricultural and Fisheries Machinery held last June, he said: "This training is a great help for me to understand how procurement and acceptance testing work in acquiring farm machinery. That's why every one of us ay sobrang eager ding pumasa – 'cause it will give us a chance to evaluate the machinery that we're acquiring more thoroughly. Because in the end, we want our farmers to receive those interventions na up-to-standards and fit

talaga sa kung ano ang needs nila."

Moreover, social technologies, including training facilitation and management, and extension communication, were also imparted to participants, especially AEWs, farmer-leaders, and farm cooperators.

These accomplishments reflect the unwavering dedication of the DA-ATI CALABARZON in empowering its stakeholders through a resilient and responsive agriculture and fisheries extension system in the region.

Meanwhile, Dr. Rolando Maningas, Center Director of the DA-ATI CALABARZON, shared a glimpse of the agency's plans as it gears towards 2026.

"For 2026, we will solidify our efforts to modernize and mechanize the agri-fishery sector by reinforcing technologies, innovations, quality extension services, inclusivity, and skills-based trainings that respond to the evolving needs of our farmers and fishers," said Dr. Maningas.

He added, "At the same time, we will strengthen our role as a nexus in empowering and catalyzing our extension workers as key change agents in the region, ensuring that our services and their impacts are met on the ground and will truly lead to 'masaganang agrikultura at maunlad na ekonomiya."
