

PGC continues health initiatives with medical and dental mission in Trece Martires City

On January 8, the Provincial Government of Cavite successfully conducted a Medical and Dental Mission in Barangay Cabezas, Trece Martires City, marking the continuation of the PGC's health initiatives for the new year.

The activity served a total of 582 patients, with 379 receiving medical consultations and 49 availing of dental services. Diagnostic services were also provided, including 100 fasting blood sugar (FBS) tests, 32 electrocardiogram (ECG) procedures, and 22 X-ray examinations. Free prescribed medicines were likewise distributed to patients.

Medical and dental services were delivered by health professionals from the General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH), with the assistance of the Office of the Provincial Governor (OPG) medical mission team.

The mission was attended by local officials, including 7th District Board Member Aldrin Anacan, Councilor Joyce Anne Mojica, Councilor Anne Jomille Humarang, and barangay officials.

The activity underscored the provincial government's sustained commitment to bringing accessible and responsive healthcare services closer to communities, as it continues to roll out health programs aimed at addressing the medical needs of Caviteños throughout the year. (R. Tanael)





The Bureau of Customs has surpassed its target collection for 2025 or 1.9 percent, or ₱17.726 billion. Preliminary figures from January to December 2025 show that the BOC generated around ₱934.400 billion in revenues.

This positive deviation was achieved despite the challenges including lower import volumes, the suspension of rice importation, and global commodity price fluctuations.

Cebu City Mayor Nestor Archival admitted on Wednesday that the withdrawal of the World Bank's (WB) funding to the Cebu Bus Rapid Transit System (CBRT) is a "concerning setback."

"The World Bank is one of the big institutions that offer funding for public transport. I would say that what they are saying is true and the withdrawal of funding proves it," he said.

He added though that plans are underway to talk with the Department of Transportation (DOTr) about looking for new funders for the project's remaining phases.

"As you can see, 10 years have passed but the project has not been completed. As long as the loan remained unused, we paid a commitment fee. The World Bank noticed that we did not meet the deadline so they pulled out the funding," Archival cited.

BOC exceeds 2025 target

The BOC conducted 1,024 enforcement operations that resulted in the seizure of smuggled and prohibited goods valued at ₱61.707 billion.

"2025 was more than numbers or milestones-- it was a year that showed the Bureau of Customs can transform, proving that integrity, service, and trust are not just ideals, but values we put into action every single day," said BOC Commissioner Ariel Nepomuceno.

Cebu City Landfill tragedy!--- As we opened the 461th Fiesta Senor Sto Nino de Oro celebration on 8 January 2026, at about 4:17p.m. in the same day, the controversial Binaliw Landfill in an upland barangay of the city had landslide and its facility collapsed.

As of this writing, 3 was confirmed dead, 36 missing or trapped, and 12 rescued.

The landfill is now operated by Enrique Razon's company Prime Waste Integrated Solutions Inc (PWIS).

The landfill has long been complained especially by the residents due to bad odor, environmental risks, and

safety concerns.

During the collapse there were 94 employees in the area.

Barangay Binaliw is connected with Barangay Panopoy in the town of Consolacion.

And according to Consolacion Mayor Teresa Alegado, 70% to 80% of its workers are residents of her town.

Prayers that these missing 36 are still alive.

Cebu BRT in its latest implementation status and results report. The report was released on 25 December 2025.

WB cited unresolved right-of-way issues, delayed resettlement, and weak institutional arrangements as key reasons for poor project progress. It also retained the project's overall risk rating at "high."

As of October 31, 2025, only 2.38 kilometers of dedicated BRT lanes have been constructed. This is far below the 12.16 kilometer target set for the project's closing period in September 2026.

Only the Civil Works Package 1 was substantially complete which excluded the Capitol Station segment.

Remained unfinished were key systems such as the bus depot and intelligent transport systems.

Still at zero were the outcome indicators, including daily ridership, emissions savings, and passenger satisfaction.

Financial data said that only \$40.62 million, or about 35 percent, of the \$116- million loan from the World Bank's International Bank for Reconstruction and Development has been disbursed as of December 2025.

A separate \$25- million trust fund linked to the project also remains unused, leaving around \$100 million in undisbursed financing.

Archival disclosed that World Bank has assured the city in providing technical assistance and help Cebu with potential partners under public-private partnership (PPP) scheme, even if direct funding has been revoked.

He clarified that the Cebu BRT is owned by the Department of Transportation (DOTr) with the city government acting only as a beneficiary.

"For now, this is something that saddens us because funds have been revoked," the mayor added. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

Dead Whale shark at Bantayan island

The Regional Maritime Unit in Central Visayas (RMU-7) reported on Wednesday that a dead Whale shark was seen along coastal barangay Cabac in the Municipality of Bantayan, Cebu.

Police Colonel Mario Cristo Lucero, RMU-7

Regional Commander told DAILY TRIBUNE that the Whale shark was estimated to be 9.3 meters in height, 2.40 meter in with 1.25 meters in splash.

"It was the operatives of our Northern Bantayan Maritime Law Enforcement Team (MLET) as of now are still

towing the carcass of the whale shark," Lucero said.

The whale shark has laceration from the back to the its heart that may caused the death. Ang taong 2025 sa BOC ay naging makabuluhan at naging matagumpay sa koleksyon ng revenue, at maspinadali ang proseso ng kalakalan, at laging nakatuon sa seguridad ng hangganan, at mga reporma sa institusyon, na nagpapatibay sa papel nito sa pambansang kaunlaran at katatagan ng ekonomiya.

At syempre ang pagproteksyon sa hangganan ay nanatiling pangunahing priyoridad ng BOC noong 2025, dahil pinaigting nito ang mga pagsisikap na pigilan ang pagpasok ng mga ipinagbabawal, maling pagdedeklara, at undervalued na mga kalakal at batay sa preliminary data para sa taon, nagsagawa ang BOC ng 1,024 enforcement operations na nagresulta sa pagkakasamsam ng mga smuggled at ipinagbabawal na produkto na nagkakahalaga ng humigit-kumulang ₱61.707 bilyon.

Ang mga resultang ito ay sumasalamin sa pinalakas na koordinasyon ng katalinuhan, pinahusay na profile ng panganib, at mas malapit na pakikipagtulungan sa mga ahensyang nagpapatupad ng batas at regulasyon.

Ang Kawanihan ay nagpatuloy din sa pagpapahusay ng pangangasiwa sa mga naka-bond na

bodega at pinalawak ang paggamit ng mga hindi mapanghimasok na teknolohiya ng inspeksyon upang matiyak ang pagsunod sa regulasyon habang pinapaliit ang pagkagambala sa lehitimong kalakalan.

Sama-sama, pinalakas ng mga inisyatibong ito ang mga panloob na kontrol, pinalakas ang pananagutan, at pinahusay na access ng publiko sa mga serbisyo sa customs kaya naman dahil dito ay nakakuha ang BOC ng pagkilala at suporta mula sa mga stakeholder nito sa buong sektor ng negosyo at kalakalan.

Over 116,000 Calabarzon children benefit from DSWD supplementary feeding program

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has provided critical nutrition support to more than 116,000 children in the CALABARZON Region through its Supplementary Feeding Program (SFP), reinforcing government efforts to address malnutrition during early childhood.

In 2025, a total of 116,809 children enrolled in child development centers across 121 cities and municipalities benefited from the program, receiving ₱350.43 million worth of meals and nutrition interventions designed to improve and maintain healthy growth. Prior to implementation, around 9,000 children were identified as nutritionally at risk, including those classified as stunted, wasted, overweight, or obese.

As of December 31, 2025, 73,077 children have already completed the program's required 120-day feeding cycle, while the remaining beneficiaries are expected to finish within the first quarter of 2026.

Among the five provinces, Laguna recorded the highest number of beneficiaries with 28,599 children, followed closely by Cavite with 28,102. Batangas served 23,396 children, Rizal reached 18,817, and Quezon accounted for 17,895, underscoring the wide coverage of the SFP across the region.

Jennylyn Rapiso, a National Child Development Center (NCDC) Teacher in Victoria, Laguna, shared that feeding sessions typically consist of hot meals with rice and viand, complemented by nutritious snacks such as nutribun paired with milk. These meals are prepared to be age-appropriate and nutritionally balanced, supporting children's physical and cognitive development.

Beyond improving children's nutrition, the program has also positively influenced family practices at home. Liezel Estrada, a parent of a child-beneficiary from Barangay Longos, Kalayaan, Laguna, noted that her child developed healthier eating habits, including a greater preference for vegetables.

"Natutunan ko din dito kung paano gawing mas masustansya ang mga niluluto kong pagkain sa aming bahay," Estrada shared, adding that the knowledge she gained from the program helped improve the overall nutrition of her household.

Parents like Estrada actively supported the program by volunteering in food preparation throughout the feeding period. Through hands-on participation, they gained practical skills in proper food handling, meal planning, cooking, and basic nutrition, enabling them to sustain healthy practices beyond the program's duration.



In CALABARZON, the SFP was implemented through a fund transfer scheme to local government units (LGUs). Local social welfare and development offices oversaw the procurement of supplies, conduct of feeding sessions, monitoring of children's nutritional status, and fund liquidation, ensuring transparency and effective service delivery.

The success of the SFP highlights the importance of collaboration among national government agencies, local government units, parents, and communities in ensuring that young children receive the nutrition and care they need during their most critical years. (CCM/PIA CALABARZON/DSWD 4A Facebook)

P950-M warehouse project breaks ground in Batangas, to boost job, investment opportunities



LIPA CITY, Batangas (PIA) — The Philippines is strengthening its role in the ASEAN region's supply chain following the groundbreaking ceremony of Amplefield Malvar Inc. at the LIMA Technology Center, Lipa City, Batangas, recently.

Malaysian investment firm Amplefield Ltd. has committed an estimated P950 million to build 13 warehouse buildings seen to provide job and investment opportunities once operational this year.

The project will cover the construction, operation, and maintenance of the warehouse buildings that will be sold or leased to companies registered with the Investment Promotion Agency (IPA). This initiative is seen to expand the region's capacity for industrial spaces for export-oriented and supply-chain-driven locators.

Andrew Koh, President of the Singapore Philippines Association Inc. (SPA), noted that the project will create new employment opportunities and drive technology transfer, both of which are crucial in the country's role in the global value chain.

"[The project] is exactly the kind of partnership

that builds sustainable economic growth."

The move is designed to promote incentives and streamline processes to attract foreign investments, create jobs, and boost exports, Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA) Director-General Tereso Panga said, assuring that South Luzon will remain a reliable and competitive partner for long-term growth.

"In PEZA, we say investments grow when they are invested right. With your trust in doing business in Philippine ecozones, rest assured that your investments will be protected, and we are fully committed to supporting you as you grow your business."

Housing major ports and industrial hubs, Batangas Province is crucial in the country's logistics and industrial sectors.

Returning Calabarzon OFW-teachers get financial aid, livelihood support from DMW



CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) - The Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) in Calabarzon has continued to provide financial and livelihood support to returning overseas Filipino workers (OFWs), including teachers, as well as to distressed OFWs and their families across the region.

In a report, DMW Calabarzon said that in December 2025, more than 60 returning OFW teachers received educational financial assistance worth ₱20,000 each under the Sa Pinas, Ikaw ang Ma'am at Sir (SPIMS) program.

According to DMW, the SPIMS program is a reintegration initiative designed to support returning OFW teachers and encourage those abroad to come home and serve permanently in the country's education sector.

Aside from financial aid, beneficiaries were allowed to secure plantilla positions in the Department of Education (DepEd) without undergoing the usual hiring process, allowing them to continue their teaching careers seamlessly in the Philippines.

DMW Calabarzon also extended financial and livelihood support to distressed OFWs and their families. Beneficiaries received assistance through the Agarang Kalinga at Saklolo para sa mga OFWs na Nangangailangan (AKSYON) Fund to address urgent needs such as hospitalization, legal concerns, and daily expenses.

Meanwhile, others were granted livelihood assistance under the Livelihood Program for OFW Reintegration (LPOR) to help them start businesses or secure stable employment.

Eigraner Bocotan, one of the beneficiaries, thanked DMW Calabarzon for the support, noting that the programs have provided much-needed relief and opportunities to rebuild their lives after returning home.

DMW IV-A Regional Director Atty. April R. Casabuena reaffirmed the agency's commitment to supporting OFWs, highlighting the Department's fourth year of providing assistance and programs for overseas Filipinos and their families. **(PIA4A)**

LLDA safeguards Laguna de Bay watershed through tree-growing activity



CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) – The Laguna Lake Development Authority (LLDA) reinforced its commitment to multi-sectoral environmental protection and climate resilience initiatives by tapping community stakeholders in rehabilitating and protecting the Laguna de Bay watershed.

In a tree-growing activity conducted under the Laguna de Bay Watershed Greening Program in Barangay Langgam, San Pedro City, Laguna in December 2025, 300 participants from various government agencies, private institutions, and partner organizations gathered to support and advance the environmental cause.

LLDA Community Development Division Chief Jaime Mora expressed appreciation for LLDA's partner institutions, noting that effective environmental action often begins with mobilizing committed stakeholders.

"Tree planting does not end with the act of planting, we all need to sustain care and protection of the

seedlings to ensure their survival and long-term impact. The mix of forest and fruit-bearing trees was intentionally selected so that, in time, the fruit-bearing species would provide direct benefits to the host community. Also, planted seedlings will be monitored and reported under the One Million Trees Challenge," he stated.

During the activity, participants planted hundreds of assorted forest and fruit-bearing tree seedlings within the identified watershed area despite the challenging terrain. The initiative not only aimed to rehabilitate degraded portions of the watershed but also to prevent soil erosion, improve water quality, and reduce the risk of flooding in nearby communities.

It also reinforces the importance of collective action in safeguarding Laguna de Bay, which serves as a vital source of livelihood, water supply, and ecological balance in the region.

As part of the program, Forester Azyl Abino,

Division Manager of the Watershed Management Division of the Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System (MWSS), delivered an advocacy-oriented presentation highlighting the vital link between healthy watersheds, forests, and water security.

"Watershed degradation undermines water infrastructure investments, noting that forested areas have significantly higher groundwater availability, reduced soil erosion, and lower flood discharge compared to denuded and urbanized areas. Healthy forests can delay downstream flooding by up to five hours, providing critical protection to lowland communities," she said in a statement.

Through sustained tree-growing, monitoring, and community engagement activities, LLDA reiterates that in strengthening watershed resilience, shared responsibility is vital to protect Laguna de Bay for the sake of the present and future generations. **(AM/PIA CALABARZON)**

Gatchalian: P9-B allocated for ARAL program under 2026 Budget

MAYNILA – Nearly PHP9 billion under the 2026 national budget will expand the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program to accelerate learning recovery, Senator Sherwin Gatchalian assured.

According to the Department of Education's (DepEd) Middle of School Year Assessments, Grade 3 to 6 learners improved their reading readiness by an average of five points, while Grades 7 to 10 learners had improvements of between six to nine points.

Gatchalian said these gains translate to 3.42 million Grades 3 to 6 learners and 1.72 million learners in Grades 7 to 10, inching closer to grade-level reading proficiency.

"Bahagi ng makasaysayang pondong inilaan natin para sa sektor ng edukasyon ngayong taon ang buong suporta para sa pagpapatupad ng ARAL Program (Part of the historic funding we have allocated to the education sector this year is full support for the implementation of the ARAL Program)," Gatchalian said in a news release on Sunday.

Gatchalian, sponsor of the 'Academic Recovery and Learning (ARAL) Program Act, said the PHP9 billion allocation "is an important step to help us curb the education crisis we have been facing for a long time."

Under the 2026 national budget, PHP8.96 billion is allocated for the ARAL Program to engage 440,000 tutors and reach 6.7 million learners for School Year 2026-2027. (PR)
