

## More than 600 residents benefit from PGC's Medical and Dental Mission in Barangay Halang, Naic

In an exclusive interview with DAILY TRIBUNE, the governor said this will be Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) scheme.

WTE technology converts non-recyclable waste such as plastics, paper, and yard waste into usable energy

through the processes of incineration, gasification, pyrolysis, and anaerobic digestion.

On January 21, Baricuatro met with Jonji Madara, president and CEO of MetPower Venture Partners, a third proponent to present a WTE solution for Cebu.

If pursued this would likely be in a provincial property, Balili property in the City of Naga.

In a separate interview with City of Naga Mayor Valdemar Chiong, he said consultations will be conducted in the city especially in the barangays where the WTE will operate.

"We still have to do consultations with the people," he told DAILY TRIBUNE.

"But we in the City of Naga are compliant on the solid waste act since landfill has been outlawed," Chiong stressed.

Tentatively set by the third week of February is an Environmental Summit to map out solutions to the province's pressing environmental challenges.

The summit will bring together stakeholders from national and local governments, advocacy groups, and the private sector to discuss issues, including "future solutions in climate proofing."

The summit was proposed after the Binaliw landfill tragedy in Cebu City.

Recently, Cebu City Mayor Nestor Archival expressed his not being interested on WTE for the city.

WTE proposals for the Cebu Province was the result of the recently concluded Cebu International Investment Summit (CIIS) 2026 held January 12-15.

It was reported that between ₱5-7 billion investment are pouring in Cebu Province for WTE project.

## 2 firms eyes Cebu BRT

The Department of Transportation (DOTr) bared on Wednesday that two consultancy firms has expressed interest to continue the Cebu Bus Rapid Transit System (CBRT) in Cebu City.

DOTr said the accepted valid proposals were filed by Dohwa Engineering Co. Ltd., and Botek Bosphorus Technical Consulting Corp.

There was this third submission by Trans-consult

Ltd. but was rejected due to incomplete documents.

The two accepted proposals will undergo as next stage, an evaluation of their financial proposals.

Recently, CBRT's financier, the World Bank (WB) announced to pull out of the project due to delays in implementation.

The Phase 1 of the project from Cebu South Bus Terminal along N. Bacalso avenue to Cebu Capitol along

Osmeña Blvd in Cebu City were already completed.

The remaining Phases of the CBRT designated 2A and 3A, cover 13 stations and 62 stops from Mambaling to Talamban.

The project broke ground the Phase 1 in 2023 and initially estimated full operations in 2025 but was later pushed to 2028.

Once completed, the CBRT system is expected to serve up to 169,000 passengers per day. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

## Danao City Police seizes smuggled cigarettes

The Danao City Police Office (DCPO) confiscated on Saturday, 17 January smuggled cigarettes in Barangay Poblacion.

The smuggled cigarettes was valued at ₱26,880 and seized from a street vendor identified as Nelyn.

"This operation demonstrates our firm commitment to protecting the public and enforcing the law. The sale of smuggled goods undermines legitimate businesses and deprives the government of revenues

needed for public service. We will continue to intensify our efforts to curb all forms of illicit trade in the province," said Police Colonel Abubakar Undang Mangelen, director of the Cebu Provincial Provincial Office (CPPO).

Confiscated were at least five imported brands of cigarettes. The operation stemmed from intelligence reports revealing that smuggled cigarettes were being transported in the area.

On 10 January 2026, CCPO with Santander

Police Station in southern Cebu confiscated ₱20 million worth of smuggled cigarettes in a checkpoint in Barangay Poblacion.

With the two successful operations, CCPO is urging the public to support the campaign by reporting suspicious and illegal activities in their communities as authorities remain steadfast in promoting public safety and lawful commerce across Cebu Province. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

## Power advocates calls for integrated, protected water, power systems

The Cebu Electricity Rights Advocates (CERA) has called on authorities on Friday 23 January to secure water supply being the backbone to economic resilience.

"The water supply in Cebu is currently not resilient to with stand issues and in a dangerous fragile state because of how both are treated separately," says CERA Convenor Nathaniel Chua.

He stressed that True resilience requires shifting from a mindset of simply "increasing capacity" to one of Critical Infrastructure Resilience, where water and power systems are integrated and protected.

Citing at present, water security remains hostage to grid instability.

In an interview with DAILY TRIBUNE, Chua proposes that Metropolitan Cebu Water District (MCWD) growth pillar should be strengthened by prioritizing dedicated, non-interruptible power lines from Visayan Electric to all major MCWD pumping stations. Beyond small diesel generators, major hubs such as Jaclupan and Lusaran must be equipped with on-site, high-capacity

energy storage or micro-grid baseload solutions to maintain water pressure during "Yellow Alerts." Expansion without climate-resilient gardening is a wasted investment.

CERA further emphasizes the need for consumers safeguards. A zero-consumption fee moratorium would ease the burden on households, while measurable targets for reducing non-revenue water would ensure accountability.

An enhanced lifetime program must be established to protect low-income families, and the Central Cebu Protected Landscape (CCPL) should be recognized not merely as an environmental zone but as a critical economic asset requiring funded protection against encroachment.

Low water pressure in hydrants is already a visible consequence of the failed synergy between the power grid and MCWD pumping stations.

CERA stresses that baseload power is the pre-requisite for water security.

Metro Cebu faces a supply gap of 300 million liters per day, threatening both households and economic

growth. Addressing this requires stable power for MCWD pumping stations, a clear roadmap for new plants to meet the projected 150-MW annual growth in demand, and tariff reforms alongside reduced system losses and stronger transmission lines to attract investors.

While interconnection with other islands is a technical milestone, Cebu must also increase local generation capacity to safeguard against transmission disruptions.

Renewable energy and Waste-to-Energy (WTE) projects are welcome additions, but they remain supplements rather than substitutes for reliable baseload power.

With regional energy forecasts showing a fighter supply-demand balance by 2026, CERA urges government and private sector collaboration to prioritize the development of reliable, island-based facilities. Consumers deserve water and energy systems that are resilient, transparent, and built to secure both household needs and long-term economic growth. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

## PGC extends Medical and Dental Mission to Gentriseños

Another round of a successful Medical and Dental Mission was conducted by the Provincial Government of Cavite in Brgy. Pasong Camachile 1, Grand River Side, General Trias City on January 21.

The initiative benefited Gentriseños with a wide range of free health services designed to promote wellness and early detection. Medical consultations under the OPD reached 428 patients, while diagnostic services included 101 fasting blood sugar (FBS) tests, 24 ECG procedures, and 18 X-ray services. Meanwhile, 46 patients received dental care through the Rural Health Unit (RHU) of City of General Trias.

The mission was made possible through the combined expertise of the GEAMH medical team and the RHU dental team of General Trias City, who worked hand in hand to deliver efficient and compassionate care. To further support patients' recovery and well-being, free medicines were distributed by the Office of the Provincial Governor (OPG) medical team, ensuring continuity of treatment beyond the consultation.

Adding support to the activity, Councilors Kyle Salazar and Jay Columna graced the event, underscoring the importance of strong local leadership and collaborative governance in advancing community health initiatives.

# BOC nagtala ng P934.4B na revenue collection noong 2025

**K**ahanga-hanga ang Collection Performance ng Bureau of Customs sa taong 2025 dahil sila ay nakakolekta ng may kabuuang P934.4 bilyon.

Sa magandang pamumuno ni Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno, ipinakita ng BOC ang innovation, efficiency, at commitment to excellence sa revenue collection, na nagpapatibay sa mahalagang papel nito sa pagpapanatili ng fiscal growth para sa bansa. Direktang sinusupportahan ng pagganap na ito ang mga programa ng gobyerno at ang bisyon ni Pangulong Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. para sa isang mas malakas, mas umaasa sa sarili na ekonomiya ng Pilipinas, habang tinitiyak na mananatiling mahusay, transparent, at tumutugon sa mga pangangailangan ng mamamayang Pilipino ang pagkolekta ng kita.

Nakamit ng BOC sa taong 2025, ang kabuuang koleksyon ng kita na P934.4 bilyon, na higit sa P916.674 bilyon noong nakaraang taon ng P17.7 bilyon o 1.9%. Ang paglago na ito ay hinihimok ng mahigpit na mga hakbang sa pagpapatupad ng BOC, mahigpit na pagsubaybay sa mga deklarasyon ng pag-import, at pagsisikap na matiyak na ang mga importer ay nagbabayad ng wastong mga tungkulin at buwis.

Sa kabila ng mga panlabas na hamon, kabilang ang bahagyang pagbaba sa dami ng import, ang pagsuspende ng rice importation, at pagbaba ng presyo ng langis at mga bilihin sa daigdig, nakatulong ang mga hakbang ng BOC na mapanatili ang katatagan ng

pananalapi habang pinatitibay ang integridad ng mga operasyon ng kalakalan at customs ng bansa.

Bilang karagdagan sa mga pagsisikap na ito, isinulong ng BOC ang mga inisyatiba ng digital transformation nito sa Electronic Payment Portal (ePay) na isinama na ngayon sa Landbank Linkbiz portal, na nagbibigay-daan sa mga importer at iba pang stakeholder na ligtas at maginhawang ayusin ang mga tungkulin at buwis sa customs sa 24/7 na batayan.

Binabawasan ng pagsasamang ito ang mga manu-manong proseso at pagkaantala sa pagbabayad, kasama ang nalalapit na pagsasama ng Maya set upang higit pang palawakin ang naa-access na mga opsyon sa digital na pagbabayad.

Samantala, pinalalakas ng in-house na PCAG Audit Tracker System (PCATS) ang mga kontrol sa post-entry sa pamamagitan ng sistematikong pagsubaybay sa mga boluntaryong pagsisiwalat at pag-flag ng mga hindi pagkakatumag sa mga deklarasyon sa pag-import at pag-export sa maagang yugto, na nagpapahintulot sa mga potensyal na isyu na matugunan bago pa man magsagawa ng mga pag-audit o inspeksyon.

Sa pagpapalakas ng mga pagsisikap sa proteksyon ng kita ng Bureau, ang legal service sa ilalim ng Revenue Collection and Monitoring Group ay pinabilis at pinadali ang paghawak ng mga kaso na may kaugnayan sa kita sa loob ng unang dalawang buwan ng pagpapatupad ng mga panloob na hakbang sa kahusayan.

Pinaikli ng mga pagpapahusay na ito ang mga timeline sa pagpoproseso na nakakaapekto sa pangongolekta, pagtatapon, at pagpapadala sa National Treasury, na nagbibigay-daan sa pagpapatupad at mga aksyon sa pag-audit na mas mabilis na maisalin sa aktwal na mga kita.

Ang Bureau of Customs – Port of Clark na pinamumunuan ni District Collector Jairus Reyes ay nakapagtala ng kabuuang mahigit P183.54 milyong halaga ng iligal na droga na nahuli noong 2025, na binibigyang-diin ang pinaigting na pagsisikap nito sa proteksyon sa hangganan at anti-smuggling na operasyon.

Ang pinakamalaking bahagi ng mga nasamsam ay kinabibilangan ng Methamphetamine Hydrochloride o "shabu," na nagkakahalaga ng higit sa P117.76 milyon, habang mahigit P65.77 milyon ay binubuo ng iba pang iligal na droga tulad ng marijuana, ecstasy, cocaine, ketamine, at mga kaugnay na substance.

Binigyang-diin ni District Collector Reyes na ang mga makabuluhang seizure ay naging posible sa pamamagitan ng pinahusay na mga sistema ng profiling, mapagbantay na mga pamamaraan sa pagsusuri, at malapit na pakikipagtulungan sa mga kasosyo sa pagpapatupad, na nagpapatibay sa pangako ng Port na pangalagaan ang mga hangganan ng paliparan mula sa mga ilegal na droga.

# PhilHealth Implements One-Time Interest Waiver to Help Employers and Members Settle Contributions

**P**hilHealth welcomes the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to implement a one-time waiver program for incurred interests from missed premium payments. This is a concrete measure to help employers, self-employed individuals, and other covered members settle long-standing contribution obligations and restore good standing with the National Health Insurance Program.

The waiver policy underscores the administration's commitment to fairness, economic recovery, and sustained access to healthcare by addressing the accumulated burden of interest arising from missed premium payments.

To provide clarity, the one-time waiver applies strictly to interest charges, and does not cover unpaid premium contributions. The policy is designed to assist employers and self-employed individuals whose arrears have ballooned primarily because of compounded interest, while ensuring continuous delivery of benefits of employees and members of PhilHealth.

To further ease the financial burden on covered entities, PhilHealth is providing a one-year settlement window from the effectivity of the Circular, during which

outstanding premium contributions may be paid. Employers who settle earlier within the prescribed period may qualify for greater reductions in interest, including partial or full waiver, depending on the length of the payment term.

For the employed sector, the guidelines for availing waiver will be published soon. Meanwhile, the detailed implementing mechanics for the self-employed sector are being finalized and will be issued separately to ensure proper guidance and orderly implementation.

As part of the program safeguards, employers availing of the one-time waiver are required to register their employees under the Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) and ensure completion of the First Patient Encounter (FPE), in line with PhilHealth policy. This requirement reinforces the intent of the waiver—not only to recover missed contributions, but also to connect workers and their families to accessible primary care services.

PhilHealth encourages all eligible employers and members to take advantage of this limited, one-time opportunity, and advises the public to await official announcements for further details on implementation timelines and payment arrangement options, particularly for the self-employed sector.

# No more shifting scheme at GenTri public school with new school building



**G**ENERAL TRIAS CITY, Cavite (PIA) — Education Secretary Sonny Angara has underscored the vital role of local government units in addressing the country's classroom shortage during the inauguration of a new classroom building at Santiago Elementary School in General Trias City on Tuesday, January 20.

In his message, Angara highlighted the national government's commitment to collaborating with LGUs to build school facilities and solve the persistent classroom shortage in public schools.

"Ito ang innovative approach ni Presidente [Ferdinand Marcos Jr.]. Dati kasi, ang gumagawa ng classrooms ay either DepEd lang o DPWH (Department of Public Works and Highways) lang."

Angara also lauded the local government for its effort to build 100 classrooms, which significantly helped ease school congestion in the city.

The secretary added, "In partnership with the city, nakapagpatayo ng 100 classrooms in three years. Thank you for prioritizing building classrooms."

With the new classroom building, Santiago Elementary School can provide an improved learning

environment to its students.

Principal Reinalyn Mutalla noted the importance of sufficient learning facilities in providing quality education, especially in public schools.

"It strengthens our capacity to deliver quality, inclusive, and future-ready education for every child entrusted to our care."

Catering to an estimated 2,443 learners, Santiago Elementary School adopts a shifting scheme due to the lack of classrooms. With the new building, Mutalla said that they will not need to adopt this scheme anymore.

"Hindi na po kami three days [with] two shifts para ma-accommodate silang lahat. We can now also provide a better learning environment to our learners, and inspire our teachers to achieve more."

The new building includes 16 classrooms that are fully-equipped with 50-inch smart TVs, armchairs, fire alarms, emergency lights, and proper signage. DepEd said each classroom was designed to address classroom shortages and enhance the learning environment for students and teachers. **(PB-PIA CALABARZON)**
