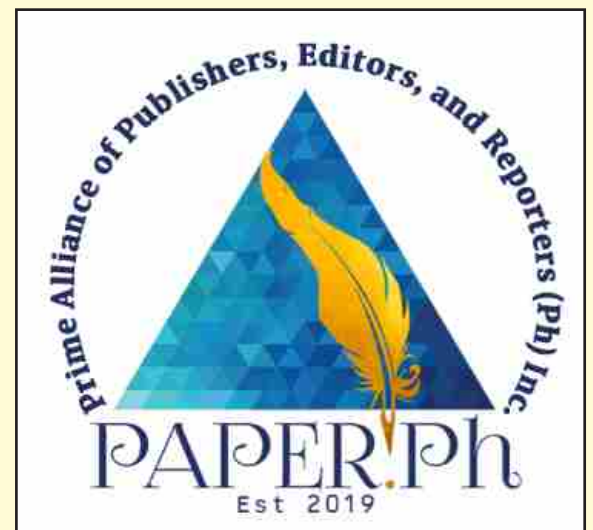

While Cebu City has begun its roll out for Benteng Bigas, Cebu Province will have it on April 15.

Cebu Governor Pamela Baricuatro explained that the rice supply for the province still have to be transported to Cebu. The province targets 20,000 sacks of rice to be sold at ₱20 per kilo.

"We have to make sure that we are food-secure here in Cebu, especially rice," the governor said, adding

Windmills to rise in Alegria, Cebu

An 80 Megawatts Windmill Power project in Alegria, Cebu has finally been approved by President Ferdinand Marcos JR. after years of delay.

In an exclusive interview with Alegria Vice Mayor Verna Magallon, she said "DOE (Department of Energy) has been updating us regularly about this development."

"Mayor Maggie Magallon had visited their office 3X including last month," the vice mayor added.

The project has been suspended due to ownership transition from MC Project Solutions Inc. to Alternergy Holdings Corporation.

The project involves an estimated capital investment of ₱7.93 billion and its goal is to produce 1

that the provincial government is willing to cover hauling and transportation costs from identified source regions.

Newly installed National Food Authority in Central Visayas (NFA-7) Acting Regional Manager Liza Balagot disclosed that the NFA central office initially allocated only 2,000 sacks for Cebu.

Balogot noted that Cebu May source additional supply from Registereds 4 and 6.

Baricuatro directed the Provincial Agriculture Office (PAO) to immediately dispatch the rice upon arrival to prevent delays and avoid spoilage in warehouses.

The rice program involves a partnership with the Food Terminal INC.(FTI) with NFA committed to maintaining adequate buffer stock for food security and disaster response.

Qualified beneficiaries May purchase up to 30 kilos of rice per month, with a maximum of 10 kilos per transaction. Rice farmers May buy up to 50 kilos monthly,

while fisherfolk are limited to 10 kilos.

Beneficiaries must present valid sector-specific IDs, such as senior citizen IDs issued by the Office of Senior Citizens Affairs; PWD IDs from the Persons with Disability Affairs Office or Department of Social Welfare and Development; and 4Ps beneficiary certification. Transport workers must show identification issued or endorsed by the LTFRB-7 or their respective LGUs.

Cebu Power players urged to use RE

The Cebu Electricity Rights Advocates (CERA) urged on Thursday local distribution utilities and the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) to prioritize Philippine-grown renewable energy to shield consumers from the skyrocketing fuel prices.

CERA Convenor Nathaniel Chua told DAILY TRIBUNE cited on heavy reliance on imported fossil fuel would make Cebu "dangerously exposed" to the conflict in Iran that had already destabilized global benchmarks.

"When crude oil jumps from \$70 to \$110 per barrel, our peaking power plants-- which we rely on during the hot summer months- become prohibitively expensive," Chua said.

"This is a man-made crisis. By failing to transition to indigenous renewables and failing to build the necessary

grid links, our energy leaders have left us at the mercy of global volatility," he added.

It is urged that Cebu's primary power distributors-- Visayan Electric, Cebu Electric Cooperative(CEBECO), and Mactan Electric Company (MECO)-- to increase the share of indigenous renewable energy in their supply portfolios.

"Our utilities are currently tethered to a sinking ship," he stressed.

"With the Asian index for natural gas jumping 150% to \$25/MMBtu and coal surging to \$140 per metric ton, the 'pass-through' pricing system is hitting Cebuanos directly in the pocket. We demand that Visayan Electric, CEBECO, and MECO stop doubling down on coal and gas. They must contract more local solar, wind, and geothermal

projects nearing completion namely: the 4.6MW Dupinga run-of-river project in Nueva Ecija, the 28-MW Solana Solar project in Bataan, the 128-MW Tanay Wind project in Rizal, and the 64-MW Alabat Wind in Quezon Province.

Alternergy aims to achieve at least 500MW of clean energy capacity by next year which begins with a landmark undertaking in southern Cebu.

On April 1,2026, President Marcos Jr. has signed two new petroleum service Contracts that will allow industry players to explore additional indigenous resources in Cebu and Leyte. SC No. 89 was awarded to Indonesia-based oil and gas firm Texcal Energy Mahato INC.

Texcal Energy aims to revive the Alegria Oil and Gas Field after three years of dormancy.

power -- sources that don't increase in price just because there is a conflict in the Middle East," Chua narrated.

Currently, over 80 percent in the country's energy mix remains dependent on coal, Liquefied Natural Gas(LNG) , and oil.

Around 50 percent of Cebu's local generation comes from coal plants in the cities of Naga and Toledo, leaving the province vulnerable to "war-time" pricing.

CERA has called on NGCP to accelerate the upgrade of interconnections between Cebu, Negros, and Mindanao.

"Cebu is surrounded by renewable-rich neighbors, yet we are starving for affordable power," Chua said.

Negros has a surplus of solar and geothermal while Mindanao has vast untapped renewable potential. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

CPA suspends port charges for 2 months

The Cebu Port Authority (CPA) announced on Thursday that it will providing discounts and suspending the collection of port charges for two months to mitigate the impact of rising fuel prices on the domestic shipping industry.

The arrangement was after CPA officials led by General Manager Francisco Commendador III met with Cebu Governor Pamela Baricuatro this week.

The Order was contained in CPA Memorandum Circular 4, series of 2026, by the Cebu Port Commission.

Effective April 18, the CPA will implement the following measures:

*40% discount on Berthing fees for domestic vessels calling at Cebu ports.

*40% discount on anchorage fees for domestic vessels within CPA jurisdiction.

*Suspension of roll-on/roll-off wharfage fees for cargo vehicles transporting purely agricultural products, including 6- wheelers, prime movers without trailer (7,600-15,000 kg); 8-wheelers, tank lorries, and 10-wheel straight trucks

(20,000-25,000kg); and 10-wheel prime movers with trailers (26,000 kg and above).

*Suspension of passenger terminal fees in all CPA-operated terminals.

*Suspension of fees for single entry' pass, watering permit, bunkering permit, and other harbor control center (HCC)-Approved permits.

Commendador said the initiative aims to support stakeholders and the riding public, while ensuring continued port operations during the fuel crisis. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

PCO: Zero tolerance for fake news peddlers amid energy emergency

MANILA – Malacañang (PCO) on Sunday warned against the spread of fake news related to the country's energy situation, saying violators will face legal consequences.

In a statement, Acting Presidential Communications Office (PCO) Secretary Dave Gomez said individuals who deliberately fabricate and disseminate false information to exploit the ongoing energy challenges will be held accountable "to the fullest extent of the law."

"Spreading fake news and disinformation undermines public trust, destabilizes our economy and threatens the welfare of every Filipino," Gomez said.

The statement came after the Palace flagged a viral social media post that urged the public to stock power banks, solar equipment, flashlights, candles, food, medicine and water for an "energy lockdown" starting April 20. The post also encouraged users to share the information.

Another post announcing an "emergency lockdown" starting April 10 also made its rounds on social media, supposedly due to the Covid-19 Cicada variant, a post the Department of Health denied.

He reminded the public that publishing false news is punishable under Article 154 of the Revised Penal Code, with penalties of up to six months imprisonment. When committed online, penalties may be doubled under the

Cybercrime Prevention Act.

Gomez said there will be "zero tolerance for those who maliciously and deliberately commit these acts to advance their personal or political vested interest."

"Any attempt to mislead the public about energy security, supply or pricing to sow confusion will be treated as a serious offense," he stressed.

The Palace media arm also said it has intensified monitoring of social media platforms and information channels to detect and counter disinformation campaigns, particularly those that may mislead the public on energy supply, pricing and security.

Gomez said the agency's anti-fake news desk, in coordination with the Department of Justice, is prepared to file charges against individuals found spreading deceptive information or attempting to manipulate markets.

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has declared a one-year state of national energy emergency as the government implements measures to address the impact of global oil price volatility amid tensions in the Middle East.

The PCO urged the public to rely on official sources and verified information, emphasizing the need for responsible use of social media.

"To every Filipino on social media: Stop and think before you post or hit 'share'," Gomez said.

"In these difficult times, sharing unverified posts

can cause public harm. So, always verify information through official government channels before you spread it." (PNA)

Bilang pagtugon sa direktiba ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. na paigtingin ang koleksyon ng pondo kasabay ng pagpapabuti ng serbisyo publiko, muling nalampasan ng Bureau of Customs (BOC) ang kanilang target para sa Marso 2026. Nakapagtala ang kawanihan ng kabuuang P84.426 bilyon na gagamitin para sa mga mahahalagang programa at serbisyo ng pamahalaan para sa mga Pilipino.

Base sa paunang datos, nahigitan ng BOC ang target na P83.237 bilyon ng may halagang P1.190 bilyon (1.4% na pagtaas). Mas mataas din ito ng P4.067 bilyon o 5.1% kumpara sa P80.359 bilyon na nakolekta noong Marso 2025.

Binigyang-diin ni Customs Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno na ang magandang performance ng BOC ay direktang magbubunga ng mas maayos na serbisyo publiko, pondo para sa mga imprastruktura, at suporta sa mga social programs na pakikinabangan ng milyunmilyong Pilipino.

“Ang bawat pisong nakokolekta natin ay direktang napupunta sa mga programang magpapabuti sa buhay ng ating mga kababayan. Ito ang tunay na sukatan ng aming serbisyo—isang pamahalaang may malasakit, may pananagutan, at may tunay na pakinabang para sa mamamayan,” pahayag ni Commissioner Nepomuceno.

Bulacan Governor Takes Bold Step to Ease Fuel Burden for Jeepney Drivers Amid Soaring Oil Prices

As oil prices continue to soar, Bulacan Gov. Daniel R. Fernando is leading by example, personally funding a crucial relief effort to support jeepney drivers who serve as the lifeblood of the province’s public transportation system. Beginning March 30, the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) launched a fuel subsidy program distributing P500 worth of free gasoline to members of the Bulacan Federation of Jeepney Operators and Drivers Association, Inc. (BFJODA).

In this initial rollout, 500 jeepney drivers from Malolos, Baliwag, Plaridel, Pulilan, and Santa Maria received free fuel directly from the governor’s own resources—a testament to his commitment to alleviating the financial strain on frontline transport workers.

Marcos calls on Filipinos to embrace compassion, unity

MANILA— President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. called on Filipinos to embrace kindness and unity, urging them to translate faith into action as the nation celebrates Easter Sunday.

Marking the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the culmination of Holy Week, Marcos said the occasion is a reminder that hope endures and renewal is always possible.

“On this day, the empty tomb stands as a testament that life conquers death and hope prevails over despair,” the President said in his message.

He stressed that beyond reflection, Easter calls for concrete acts of compassion and solidarity.

“As a people known for resilience and deep faith, let us carry the light of Easter into our daily lives, not only in words, but in action,” he said.

Marcos urged Filipinos to “choose compassion over indifference” and “unity over division,” emphasizing that these values are essential in building a stronger nation.

“For in every act of kindness, in every hand extended to help, we become instruments of renewal for our entire nation,” he said.

The President further urged Filipinos to “rise with renewed purpose, unyielding hope, and a deep sense of responsibility for one another.”

“Let us build a nation where kindness is instinct and unity is our strength. For when we stand together guided by faith, bound by love of country, and driven by a shared vision, there is no challenge we cannot overcome.”

Office of the Presidential Adviser on Peace, Reconciliation and Unity (OPAPRU) Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr. said Easter is a reminder to everyone that “God is by our side” even in the most challenging moments.

“The resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ embodies such an unwavering faith that endures hardship, embraces sacrifice and rises up,” Galvez said in a statement.

Galvez said this religious celebration shows that forgiveness, reconciliation, and healing are always possible despite the challenges facing the world today.

“With patience, understanding and trust, we can overcome our divisions and move forward in purpose, unity and faith,” he said.

He also urged Filipinos to continue carrying the

message of hope in their hearts by always choosing compassion, offering forgiveness, and working together to bring genuine, long-lasting peace to the nation.

PH-Myanmar engagement continues after military leader's election win

MANILA— Malacañang on Friday said the Philippines will continue engaging with Myanmar following the election of military leader Min Aung Hlaing, who was elected president through a parliamentary vote.

Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said the Philippines is taking note of recent political developments in Myanmar, particularly the election of Min Aung as president.

“The Philippines will continue to engage relevant authorities and stakeholders in Myanmar through Foreign Affairs Secretary Ma. Theresa P. Lazaro, in her capacity as Special Envoy of the ASEAN Chair to Myanmar, as well as through our respective embassies,” Castro said.

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) has sought to mediate the crisis through its Five-Point Consensus, which calls for immediate cessation of violence, inclusive dialogue, humanitarian assistance, and the appointment of a special envoy.

In November 2025, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. appointed Lazaro as the Philippines’ Special Envoy of the ASEAN Chair to Myanmar, as part of the

country’s role in supporting regional efforts to address the crisis in Myanmar.

Castro said the Philippines remains committed to supporting ASEAN’s collective efforts and urged renewed momentum toward the “full and effective” implementation of the Five Point Consensus.

The Philippines, she said, hopes to achieve the cessation of violence and facilitating the delivery of humanitarian assistance to the people of Myanmar.

Min Aung, who has led Myanmar’s military government since the February 2021 coup, was elected president by a military-dominated parliament, consolidating his hold on power amid ongoing political turmoil.

The 2021 coup ousted the civilian government led by Aung San Suu Kyi and triggered widespread protests, armed resistance, and international condemnation, plunging the country into prolonged instability.

Since then, Myanmar has faced escalating violence between the military and various resistance groups.

‘Fake news,’ Palace says on alleged energy lockdown starting April 20

MANILA — Malacañang on Friday refuted claims that there will be an “energy lockdown” beginning April 20.

“Fake news ito (That is fake news),” Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said in a text message to reporters.

Castro was reacting to a social media post urging everyone to inform their family and friends about the alleged energy lockdown.

The post called on the public to prepare their “power bank, solar equipment, rechargeable fan, flashlight, candles, lamps, foods, medicines [and] water” in anticipation of the supposed implementation of the energy lockdown.

Netizens were also encouraged to share the false information shared on social media.

Malacañang earlier said no energy lockdown is seen for now as the government continues to secure alternative fuel source amid the ongoing tensions in the

Middle East.

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has declared a one-year state of national energy emergency to address potential disruption in fuel supply and stabilize the country’s energy sector.

The government is also set to expand the fuel subsidy program for the transport sector nationwide starting April 6, as part of its efforts to cushion the impact of rising oil prices amid conflict in the Gulf region.

The Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) said Iran will allow the “safe, unhindered, and expeditious” passage of Philippine-flagged vessels, energy sources, and all Filipino seafarers through the Strait of Hormuz.

The DFA said the assurance was made during Thursday’s phone call between Foreign Affairs Secretary Ma. Theresa Lazaro and Iranian Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi.

It said the development is vital for the Philippines,

as it will not only secure the safety of Filipino seafarers operating in the area but “also help ensure energy security for the country.” (PNA)

DFA, DOE discuss energy cooperation with Iran amid Mideast crisis

MANILA — Foreign Affairs Secretary Ma. Theresa Lazaro and Energy Secretary Sharon Garin sought to deepen energy cooperation between the Philippines and Iran in a meeting with the latter’s top envoy to Manila on Wednesday.

The two secretaries met with Iranian Ambassador to the Philippines Yousef Esmailzadeh in Pasay City a day after Malacañang instructed the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) to initiate talks with Tehran to ensure the safe passage of Philippine-bound ships through the Strait of

Hormuz.

In a post on X, Lazaro said the two sides discussed “key avenues for cooperation,” and that the meeting builds on the momentum of Iran and the Philippines’ previous 2025 political talks.

“Building on the momentum of our Political Consultations last November 2025, we are committed to deepening our cooperation across all fronts, particularly energy cooperation,” she said.

The DFA declined to provide further details when asked about the details of possible cooperation being eyed by Manila and if any agreement was made related to ship passage in the Strait of Hormuz.

Tehran’s has maintained a de facto blockade on the Strait of Hormuz following the joint military operations mounted by Israel and the United States on February 28, which targeted its nuclear sites and killed its Supreme Leader.

The blockade on the waters, which is one of the world’s most critical maritime chokepoints, has since sent energy markets into shock, with rising oil and fuel prices prompting governments to implement austerity measures. Marcos last week declared a state of national energy

'No SPA, No Payment' for PhilHealth self-paying members starts April 1

The Philippine Health Insurance Corp. (PhilHealth) is reminding self-paying members to secure their statement of premium account (SPA) before paying their premium contribution, as the "No SPA, No Payment" policy takes effect on Wednesday.

Janimhe Jalbuna, head of the public affairs unit of PhilHealth 6 (Western Visayas), said that through the SPA, members would know how much premium they will pay for a given payment period.

Members can obtain their SPA from PhilHealth Regional Offices, Local Health Insurance Offices, or access the member portal link: <https://memberinquiry.philhealth.gov.ph/member/> or via spagen.philhealth.gov.ph.

Jalbuna said that in the past, voluntary members could pay over the counter in regional offices or accredited collecting agents.

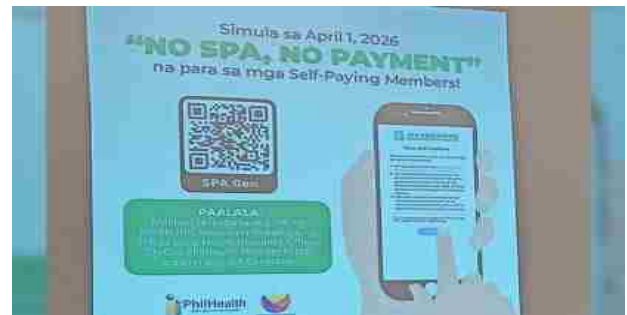
They only need to declare the period and the amount they intend to pay.

"This time, our payment is digitized. Meaning, depending on their declared income in the database. Our system automatically generates the corresponding premium contribution that they need to pay," she said in an interview on Wednesday.

She added that members can visit their office for assistance, or communicate through PhilHealth-6's Facebook page or Messenger for their SPA concerns.

Data showed that of the more than 7.69 million registered PhilHealth members in Western Visayas as of February, 762,867 are voluntary or self-paying members.

They consisted of professional practitioners, self-earning individuals, Filipinos with dual citizenship, or living abroad, land-based migrant workers, and those 21 years old and above with the capacity to pay. (PNA)

Pag-IBIG grants special benefits package to repatriated OFWs

MANILA – In line with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to provide necessary assistance to overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) affected by the Middle East crisis, the Pag-IBIG Fund has approved a special benefits package, allowing qualified members to access their savings and receive temporary relief on housing loan payments as they recover and rebuild their lives.

Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling, who also chairs the 11-member Board of Trustees of Pag-IBIG or the Home Development Mutual Fund, said the package is timely as the repatriation of war-affected OFWs continues.

"Ito po ang ambag ng Pag-IBIG Fund sa hangarin ni Pangulong Marcos Jr. para sa whole-of-government approach sa pagtulong sa ating mga bayaning OFWs (This is the contribution of the Pag-IBIG Fund to President

Marcos Jr.'s desire for a whole-of-government approach in helping our heroic OFWs)," Aliling said in a news release Sunday.

Under the approved benefits package, qualified OFW members may apply to withdraw up to 100 percent of their Pag-IBIG regular savings, including employee share, employer share and dividends earned, even before its 20-year maturity; withdraw up to 100 percent of their Modified Pag-IBIG II (MP2 Savings), inclusive of returns earned, even before its five-year maturity; or avail of a three-month moratorium on housing loan payments, free from interest and penalties, with the loan term extended by three months.

"Through this benefits package, qualified members may access their Pag-IBIG savings and receive temporary relief on housing loan payments, giving them more room to provide for their families and meet urgent needs during this difficult time," he said.

As of February 2026, Pag-IBIG Fund has 891,427 registered OFW members in the Middle East, including 86,234 MP2 savers and 40,024 housing loan borrowers.

The largest numbers are in Saudi Arabia, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates and Kuwait.

"We recognize that for this assistance to be truly responsive, it must be made available to qualified members in a manner that is fast, clear, and accessible," Pag-IBIG Fund Chief Executive Officer Marilene Acosta said.

"That is why we will make applications for these

benefits available online through Virtual Pag-IBIG, while also ensuring that our more than 200 branches, OFW Centers and service offices are ready to assist members and their families."

Pag-IBIG Fund said members may access its services from Monday to Friday in office-based branches and from Tuesday to Saturday in mall-based branches, as well as through its digital service channel, Virtual Pag-IBIG.



Establishing Full Connectivity from Cavite to Taguig PBBM Inspects Newly Opened CAVITEX C5 Link Segment 3B

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. inspected the newly opened final segment of the CAVITEX C5 Link.

The newly opened stretch runs from Airport View Subdivision to the Sucat Interchange in Parañaque City.

The project is a joint venture between Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation's (MPTC) subsidiary, Cavite Infrastructure Corporation (CIC), and the Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA).

Joining the President in the inspection were Transportation Secretary Banoy Lopez; Public Works Secretary Vince Dizon; Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA) Chairman Alex Lopez; MPTC President Emeritus Mr. Jose Maria Lim; MPTC President and CEO Gilbert Sta. Maria; and Transportation Undersecretary Steve Pastor.

Segment 3B completes the 7.7-kilometer CAVITEX C5 Link. It connects Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) to C5 Road in Taguig City, reducing travel time from the usual 1.5 hours to just 15 minutes.

The opening follows the earlier completion of Segment 3A-1 (C5 Flyover to Merville), Segment 3A-2 (Merville to RSG and Airport View), and Segment 2 (Sucat Interchange to R1 Expressway) between 2019 and 2024.

To immediately serve the motoring public,

Segment 3B will initially open under a modified scheme for a seamless bidirectional travel. Eastbound motorists will have direct access to Bonifacio Global City (BGC), while westbound travelers will have a smoother route toward Parañaque, Las Piñas, Bacoor, and Kawit, Cavite.

Designed as a six-lane expressway (three lanes per direction), the at-grade section will temporarily operate with four lanes (two lanes per direction) while Right-of-Way (ROW) concerns are being addressed. Once the DPWH acquires the pending ROW, the remaining portion of the service road will also be completed and opened in its planned two-lane-per-direction configuration. Construction of the additional expressway lanes will then begin to complete the full six-lane capacity for the entire stretch.

The CAVITEX C5 Link provides efficient access to NAIA and C5, via key interchanges at the R1 Expressway (Coastal Road), Sucat Road (Dr. A Santos Avenue), and C.P. Garcia Avenue (C5 Road). The expressway is projected to serve around 36,000 motorists daily.

By diverting heavy traffic, including commercial trucks, the expressway eases congestion on major arterial roads across Cavite and southern Metro Manila. It also strengthens the logistics link between the industrial hubs of Cavite and the commercial centers of the National Capital

Region, supporting regional economic growth.

Segment 3B will be free for all classes until further announcement. Motorists will only pay the existing toll fees for CAVITEX C5 Link Segments 2, 3A-1, and 3A-2. Any updates will be announced by the Toll Regulatory Board (TRB) in coordination with CAVITEX management.
