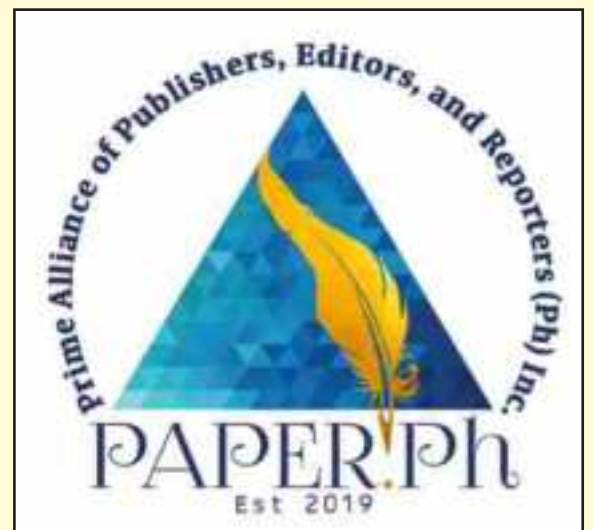

CV needs Investment, policy reforms to prevent stagflation risks

Central Visayas region is being suggested to pursue "coordinated" reforms in energy, logistics, industry, and governance to prevent the region from stagflation risks and cushion the impact of external economic shocks.

This was pointed on Wednesday by Ser Percival K. Pena-Reyes, senior research fellow at the Ateneo Center for Economic Research and Development.

This as the region continue to post inflation levels above the national average, a trend that reflects deeper structural vulnerabilities that cannot be addressed through short-term interventions alone.

"This is really about resilience," Pena-Reyes said.

He warned that the region's exposure to imported fuel, inter-island logistics, and global demand cycles makes it especially sensitive to external shocks.

"We'll be hearing about stagflation more often because our risk of getting there is mounting. We are not there yet, but the risk is mounting," Pena-Reyes stressed.

By stagflation it means that a period marked by high inflation, weak economic growth, and rising unemployment, poses a difficult challenge for policy-makers because measures used to tame inflation can further dampen economic activity.

He cited that long-term stability will depend on whether the region can implement reforms that simultaneously manage inflation while sustaining growth.

"These policies in combination should be tight enough to break inflation, but also smart enough not to break growth," he narrated.

Energy security must be treated as a core economic strategy, not just an infrastructure concern, as fuel dependence drives inflation across multiple sectors.

"Energy resilience, increasingly, will determine inflation stability, investment attractiveness, and long-term competitiveness," Pena-Reyes said.

Thus the region must accelerate renewable energy investments, upgrade transmission infrastructure, and expand distributed solar and battery storage systems to reduce reliance on imported fuel.

"Without lower and more stable energy, the region risks repeated inflationary cycles," he warned. While on Logistics, Central Visayas being an island economy, remains highly exposed to shipping and transport costs that directly affect food and commodity prices.

As Pena-Reyes proposes for ports modernization, improved cargo handling, stronger cold-chain systems, digitalized customs processes, and reduced urban freight congestion to improve efficiency.

"The goal, is to reduce the structural inflation premium caused by geography and make the movement of goods faster and less costly," he added.

On Tourism, he pushes for stronger economic diversification, noting that over reliance on tourism, retail, and consumption makes the region vulnerable to global disruptions.

"Over-reliance brings vulnerability to global recessions, pandemics, geopolitical shocks, and fuel price

spikes," he added.

He recommended though the expansion on higher value industries such as Information Technology and digital services, advanced manufacturing, healthcare, maritime services, and creative industries.

"Tourism remains a major growth engine, but it must be complemented by more resilient sectors," Pena-Reyes said.

He further suggested the strengthening on human capital as an essential part for long-term competitiveness.

Which May include expanding STEM Education, technical-vocational training, digital upskilling, and stronger industry-academe linkages.

He urged investments in climate-resilient agriculture, irrigation systems, watershed protection, fisheries management, and disaster-resilient infrastructure to stabilize supply chains and protect vulnerable communities.

Central Visayas' inflation rate accelerated to 5.6 percent in January from 3.8 percent in December 2025. It further climbed to 6 percent in February and 7.4 percent in March. This surged to 10.8 percent in April.

The average regional inflation rate pegged to 7.5 percent in the first four months of 2026.

Rotational power outages hit Metro Cebu

The National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) on Thursday extended the red and yellow alert status in the Visayas including Metro Cebu due to insufficient power supply as there is high electricity demand.

The Visayan Electric announced that they will implement rotational brownouts in several locations after the Visayas grid had been placed under red alert status.

Power interruptions will be expected in portions of Cebu City, City of Naga, Mandaue City, and San Fernando. From 6:45 p.m. to 7:45 p.m., supply of electricity will be suspended in portions of Cebu City and Mandaue City.

Rotational brownouts will cover Barangays Banilad, Carreta, Cebu Business Park, Hipodromo, Kalubihan, Kasambagan, Labangon, Mabol, Punta Princesa, Sambag 1, San Antonio, San Jose, San Roque, Subangdaku, Tipolo (Mandaue City), and Tisa.

Visayan Electric has also implemented rotational brownouts in Barangays Tinaan, Bairan, Balud, Banilad, Bugho, Cabungahan, Camputhaw, Central Poblacion, Colon, East Poblacion, Greenhills, Inoburan, Jaguimit, Lahug, Langtad, Lantawan, Lutac, Luz, Mabol, Mainit, North Poblacion, Panadtaran, Patag, Pitalo, Sangat, South Poblacion, Tangke, Tonggo, and West Poblacion.

"We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your understanding," said Visayan Electric.

NGCP said that grid data showed available capacity stood at 2,568 megawatts (MW), while peak demand reached 2,413 MW, having only a thin operating margin.

Meanwhile, the Cebu Electricity Rights Advocates (CERA) has called on legislators and regulators to conduct comprehensive review of electricity bill components that may help lower power costs in the country.

CERA Convenor Nathaniel Chua told DAILY TRIBUNE that several charges in the current electricity billing system continue to burden consumers.

"We understand that these charges exist because of existing policies and laws such as the Electric Power Industry Reform Act (EPIRA).

Chua raised the question of whether these charges are still relevant and why consumers continue to shoulder them. Citing that these charges and taxes contributed to making electricity in the Philippines among the most expensive in Southeast Asia.

While generation, transmission, and distribution charges are understandable since they correspond to actual services directly used by consumers.

Consumers continue to question the collection of universal charges, lifeline subsidies, senior citizens subsidies, the Feed-in Tariff Allowance (FIT-All), Green Energy Auction Allowance (GEA-All), and Value Added Tax (VAT). (By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)

87 kls " Hot meat lechon" seized in Cebu City

The Department of Veterinary Medicine and Fisheries (DVMF) in Cebu City confiscated on Monday three lechons weighing 87 kilos in Barangays Apas and Lahug.

Meat Inspectors said the lechons lacked a Meat Inspection Certificate and a licensing permit.

According to Dr. Jessica Maribojoc, DVMF head insisted that the seizures was to prevent the possible spread of animal diseases and hazardous to public health.

She assured though that the confiscated meat products will be either be buried or incinerated to prevent them from re-entering the market.

Cebu City Ordinance No. 2189 and Republic Act No. 9296 was violated or having no permits.

The ordinance and the law mandates that meat products sold for public consumption must undergo proper inspection to ensure they are safe and sourced from accredited slaughterhouses. (By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)

Fuente Osmeña Circle eyed for greener, pedestrian-friendly makeover

The Cebu City Government in partnership with the Cebu Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) bared on Monday that the Fuente Osmeña Circle will be rehabilitated for a more greener and pedestrian-friendly park.

The project will focus on safety, accessibility, and environmental design.

This will be the long-standing concerns on the deteriorating infrastructure and inefficient public use of the space.

In a meeting of Cebu City Mayor Nestor Archival and CCCI officials, it was discussed to evaluate existing

conditions and identity practical improvements aimed at making the space safer and more functional for daily users.

It was disclosed that the facility is already outdated with multiple structural issues such as damaged jogging paths, uneven surfaces, and walkways interrupted by exposed manhole covers.

CCCI pointed out poorly designed exits and sudden changes in elevation that increase the risk of accidents for pedestrians and joggers.

Furthermore, movement within the area is complicated by pathways disrupted by mature trees and the placement of utilities and transformers.

Designers plan to retain Cebu City's landmark by highlighting the fountain as the focal point and preserving visual connections along Osmeña boulevard toward the Cebu Provincial Capitol.

The redevelopment concept introduces clearer pedestrian layout, with expanded walkways, defined access points, and more direct routes connecting visitors to the fountain.

There will be more seating and open spaces to be incorporated to encourage people to use the park beyond transit purposes.

The rehabilitated facility will include play areas, kiosks, restrooms, security stations, event grounds, and adaptable spaces for public gatherings and recreation.

It will be modelled like Rizal Park, the Washington Monument, Columbus Circle, and La Defense.

Sustainable measures will include increasing planted areas, adding shaded pathways, installing vegetation buffers to limit noise and pollution, and protecting existing large trees. (By RICO MIRASOL OSMENA)

Bagong Timpla sa Aduana: Tapat na Serbisyo at Pamumunong May Malasakit, Bagong Pwersa ng CPRIG at Tagumpay sa Koleksyon ng Port of San Fernando

Kapag binanggit ang salitang "Aduana" o Bureau of Customs (BOC), ano ang madalas na unang pumapasok sa isip ng ordinaryong Pilipino? Sa mahabang panahon, ang ahensyang ito ay naging kasingkahulugan ng mga salitang "padulas," "lagay," at "korapsyon." Madalas itong laman ng mga balita dahil sa mga kontrobersya at palagiang nangunguna sa listahan ng mga ahensya ng gobyerno na may pinakamaraming reklamo mula sa taumbayan.

Ngunit tila nag-iiba na ang ihip ng hangin.

Kamakailan ay isang kahanga-hangang balita ang umusbong na hindi dapat palagasin nang walang pagkilala: nawala na ang Bureau of Customs sa nakakahiyang listahan ng mga "most complained agencies" sa bansa. Ito ay isang napakalaking tagumpay na hindi nangyari sa isang iglap lamang. Ito ay bunga ng isang tahimik ngunit epektibong rebolusyon sa loob mismo ng ahensya—ang pagbabalik ng tapat na serbisyo.

Sino ang nasa likod ng pagbabagong ito? Walang iba kundi ang isang uri ng pamumuno na bihirang makita sa mga nagtataasang posisyon sa gobyerno. Ang kasalukuyang liderato ng BOC ay hindi lamang kilala sa kasipagan, kundi lalo't higit sa pagiging mabait at may mababang loob sa lahat ng mga empleyado—mula sa pinakamataas na opisyal hanggang sa mga rank-and-file na kawani.

Sa halip na kamay na bakal at pananakot, malasakit at mabuting ehemplo ang pinairal. Kapag ang isang pinuno ay marunong makinig, rumespeto, at magpahalaga sa kapakanan ng kanyang mga tao, nag-iiba ang kultura sa lugar ng trabaho. Ang mga empleyado ay nagiging inspirasyon na magtrabaho nang marangal dahil nararamdaman nilang sila ay pinapahalagahan, at hindi lamang itinuturing na mga makina. Ang ganitong pagpapakumbaba mula sa itaas ay mabilis na bumaba at niyakap ng buong ahensya.

Dahil sa maayos na pamumuno at pagpapataas ng moral ng mga empleyado, unti-unting winakasan ang nakaugaliang sistema ng korapsyon sa Aduana. Ang pagkawala nila sa listahan ng mga inirereklamong ahensya

ay malinaw na patunay na bumabalik na ang tiwala ng mga negosyante at ng taumbayan sa mga proseso ng Customs. Wala nang paligoy-ligoy, nababawasan na ang "red tape," at higit sa lahat, ang kaban ng bayan ay napoprotektahan.

Ang nangyayari ngayon sa Bureau of Customs ay isang napakagandang pamantayan para sa iba pang sangay ng pamahalaan. Pinatutunayan nito na ang talamak na korapsyon ay hindi isang sumpa na hindi kayang lunasan. Sa pamamagitan ng masipag, mapagkumbaba, at may malasakit na liderato na nakakakuha ng suporta ng mga tapat na empleyado, kayang-kayang linisin ang kahit na anong ahensya.

Isang mainit na pagpupugay sa liderato at sa lahat ng kawani ng Bureau of Customs. Nawa'y magtuluy-tuloy na ang ganitong kultura ng tapat na serbisyo. Ang inyong pagbabago ay hindi lamang kahanga-hanga; ito ay nagbibigay ng pag-asa na ang isang malinis at tapat na gobyerno ay posible pala sa Pilipinas.

Pinangunahan ni District Collector Clarence Anthony D. Gammad ng Bureau of Customs – San Fernando, La Union (BOC-SFLU) ang seremonya ng pagtataas ng watawat noong nakraang linggo, kasama ang mga opisyal at kawani ng pantalan upang ipagdiwang ang isang mahalagang tagumpay sa koleksyon.

At sa kanyang mensahe, personal na nagpaabot ng pasasalamat si District Collector Gammad sa lahat ng naging bahagi ng operasyon—mula sa mga frontline staff na tinitiyak ang maayos na takbo ng araw-araw na trabaho, hanggang sa management team para sa kanilang matatag na suporta at gabay upang maabot ang target para sa buwan ng Abril. Binigyang-diin niya na ang tagumpay na ito ay bunga ng tunay na pagkakaisa, dedikasyon, at kooperasyon ng bawat isa dahil lampas ang kanilang target collection.

Batay sa rekord, nalampasan ng BOC-SFLU ang kanilang revenue collection target para sa Abril 2026 matapos makapagtala ng kabuuang koleksyon na Php 606.981 milyon. Ito ay mas mataas ng 8.11% kumpara sa itinakdang emerging target na Php 561 milyon.

Ang magandang performanceng ito ay iniuugnay sa pagpapatupad ng mga estratehikong inisyatiba na naaayon sa mga direktiba ni Customs Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno, gayundin sa walang sawang sipag ng mga tauhan sa ilalim ng pamumuno ni District Collector Gammad.

Bilang tanda ng pagpapahalaga, iginawad ang mga Certificates of Commendation sa lahat ng empleyado bilang simple ngunit makabuluhang paraan ng pasasalamat sa kanilang pagsisikap at teamwork na naging susi sa tagumpay ng pantalan.

Ang nakamit na milestone na ito ay sumasalamin sa direksiyong itinakda ni Commissioner Nepomuceno sa pamamagitan ng kanyang IAM Program, na naglalayong itaas ang antas ng serbisyo, pananagutan, at mas malapit na pagtutulungan sa lahat ng tanggapan ng Bureau of Customs.

Sa gitna ng pinaigting na kampanya ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. laban sa talamak na ismagling sa bansa, isang bagong pwersa ang pormal nang itinalaga upang magbantay sa ating mga hangganan.

Sa ilalim ng pamumuno ni Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno, malugod na tinanggap ng Bureau of Customs (BOC) ang 29 na bagong graduate ng Customs Police Rapid Intervention Group (CPRIG). Ang mga opisyal na ito ay sumailalim sa matinding Customs Police Rapid Intervention Group Special Operations Training (CPRIG-SOT)—isang programa na idinisenyo upang bumuo ng isang "elite tactical unit" na handang reresponde sa anumang banta sa seguridad at high-risk enforcement operations.

Hindi biro ang pinagdaanan ng mga bagong kawal na ito. Sa loob ng apat na buwan, sinanay sila ng mga eksperto mula sa AFP Special Forces at Presidential Security Group (PSG). Bahagi ng kanilang inaral ang tactical intelligence, marksmanship (pagbaril), Close Quarter Battle (CQB), at maging ang pag-inspeksyon sa mga barko o Vessel Boarding, Search and Seizure (VBSS).

Sa kanyang mensahe, binigyang-diin ni Commissioner Nepomuceno na ang mga bagong opisyal ang magsisilbing "standard bearer" o huwaran ng integridad sa kawanihan. Aniya, nasa balikat nila ang responsibilidad na panatilihin ang disiplina at propesionalismo sa bawat operasyong kanilang gagampanan para sa sambayanang Pilipino.

Sinegundahan naman ito ni Armed Forces of the Philippines Chief of Staff General Romeo S. Brawner Jr. na nagsilbing guest of honor. Ayon kay General Brawner, ang galing at lakas ay walang saysay kung wala itong kaakit na integridad at disiplina. Ang bawat krimen na kanilang mapipigilan ay malaking ambag sa katatagan at seguridad ng ating ekonomiya.

Ang pagtatapos na ito ay simbolo rin ng mas matibay na pagtutulungan ng BOC, AFP, at Philippine Navy. Sa pamamagitan ng ganitong mga pagsasanay, masisiguro natin na ang ating mga pantalan at paliparan ay hindi na basta-basta malulusutan ng mga ilegal na droga, kontrabando, at iba pang banta sa pambansang seguridad. Sa 29 na bagong miyembro ng CPRIG, nawa'y manatiling buhay ang inyong pagmamahal sa bayan sa bawat huling hininga ng inyong tungkulin.

Pinangunahan ng DA-Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) CALABARZON, katuwang ang National Nutrition Council (NNC) CALABARZON, City Agriculture Office at City Health Office ng Tanauan City ang aktibidad na nilahukan ng 30 buntis at BNS mula sa iba't ibang barangay.

Binigyang-diin sa seminar na mahalaga ang wastong nutrisyon mula sa pagbubuntis hanggang sa unang dalawang taon ng bata upang maiwasan ang malnutrisyon at masuportahan ang tamang paglaki at pag-unlad ng mga bata.

Sa kanyang pambungad na mensahe, sinabi ni Dr. Rolando V. Beyond Financial Aid: Bulacan's 'Tulong Pang-Edukasyon' Empowers 2,600+ Students With Support, Skills, And Hope For A Brighter Future

More than just providing much-needed financial relief, the Provincial Government of Bulacan's "Tulong Pang-Edukasyon Para sa Bulakenyo" program has emerged as a comprehensive support system, uplifting 2,646 high school and college students across the province



with grants, practical life skills, and guidance to help them stay on track toward their dreams.

During the general assembly held May 7 at the Bulacan Capitol Gymnasium — in partnership with Landbank of the Philippines — qualified scholars received direct cash assistance ranging from ₱3,000 to ₱3,500, credited straight to their Landbank accounts. For students like Crystal Joyce of Dr. Yanga Colleges Inc., this aid is more than just numbers: it is a lifeline that eases the heavy burden of tuition and school expenses.

"Malaking tulong din siya sa mga gastusin and [malaking] dagdag rin siya," Joyce shared, noting that this is her first time benefiting from the program.

But the initiative goes far beyond financial support. Recognizing that education success depends on more than just resources, organizers integrated essential learning sessions: Landbank representatives taught students how to save wisely, build emergency funds, and maximize the Perang Inimpok Savings Option (PISO) account — planting the seeds of financial responsibility early on.

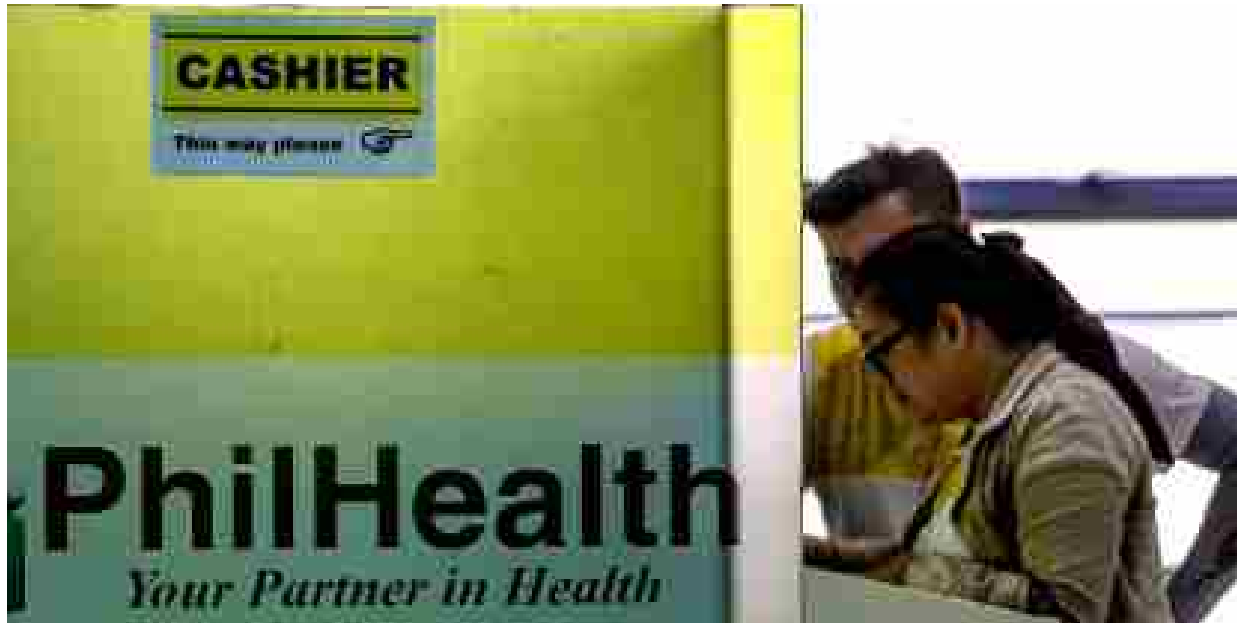
The program also addressed the holistic well-being of learners, with talks on mental health, stress management, and gender sensitivity led by experts from the Provincial Health Office and Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office — acknowledging that a student's mental and emotional health is just as vital to their success as their academic performance.

Governor Daniel R. Fernando and Vice Governor Alexis P. Castro emphasized that these grants are investments in Bulacan's future. In their message to the scholars, they urged dedication and perseverance:

"Kaya pagbutihin po natin, 'wag po tayong magpabaya sa pag-aaral. Ang hangad po namin para sa inyo ay makapagtapos ng pag-aaral," wika ni Gov. Fernando.

Over 4K YAKAP clinics provide free primary care to 33.2M Filipinos



MANILA — Some 33.2 million Filipinos are now covered under the state health insurer's expanded primary care program, marking a significant surge in healthcare accessibility nationwide.

In a news release on Friday, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) announced that its Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) now reaches 33.2 million beneficiaries through 4,287 accredited clinics.

The expansion represents a 457-fold increase in primary care support compared to 2021 figures.

PhilHealth President and CEO Dr. Edwin Mercado said the program serves as a proactive "sandigan" (reliable defense) for Filipino families.

"Ang pagpili at pagpapa-empanel sa inyong YAKAP Clinic ay hindi lamang pagsunod sa proseso, ito ay ang pagtitiyak na may sandigan ang inyong pamilya bago pa man dumating ang sakit (Choosing and empaneling with a YAKAP Clinic ensures that families have support before illness strikes)," Mercado said.

"Sa YAKAP, layon nating protektahan ang kalusugan ng bawat Pilipino upang hindi na humantong sa malubhang karamdaman na mas mahirap at mas mahal gamutin (Our goal in YAKAP is to protect every Filipino's health to prevent severe conditions that are more difficult and expensive to treat)," he added.

The YAKAP package allows registered members to access free medical consultations, essential laboratory tests, and outpatient cancer screenings.

It also includes the GAMOT benefit, providing up to PHP20,000 worth of essential medicines annually.

To sustain the momentum, PhilHealth conducted 191 empanelment drives this week, utilizing outreach missions to register residents in remote areas.

Members may also register digitally through the eGovPH Mobile App or the PhilHealth Member Portal. The aggressive rollout follows the directive of President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. to institutionalize quality primary healthcare as a fundamental right for every Filipino. (PNA)

Makiling Center strengthens partnerships to safeguard protected area, buffer zones

LOS BAÑOS, Laguna (PIA) — The University of the Philippines-Los Baños (UPLB) Makiling Center for Mountain Ecosystems (MCME) continues to strengthen partnerships with government agencies, local government units, private institutions, and environmental groups to address the growing challenges in protecting the Mount Makiling Forest Reserve.

In an interview with the Philippine Information Agency, MCME university extension specialist Leonardo Barua said Mt. Makiling covers around 4,200 hectares of forest reserve, making conservation efforts challenging given the center's limited manpower.

"Mt. Makiling is 4,200 hectares na forest reserve and kakunti lang kung tutuusin yung staff ng Makiling Center para pangalagaan itong bundok na ito, and that's why we are reaching out sa mga partners para tulungan kami na pangalagaan yung bundok," Barua said, emphasizing the importance of collaborative efforts in preserving the mountain ecosystem.

Located between Laguna and Batangas, Mt. Makiling is one of the country's ASEAN Heritage Parks due to its recognized forest reserves and biodiversity areas. The mountain serves as a critical watershed that supplies water to nearby communities, agricultural lands, and parts of Laguna de Bay. It is also home to hundreds of plant and animal species, including endemic flora and fauna found only in the Philippines.

Managed by the University of the Philippines Los Baños through the MCME, Mt. Makiling has long been recognized for its ecological, educational, and scientific importance. The forest reserve is frequently used for biodiversity research, environmental education, ecotourism activities, and forest conservation initiatives.

According to Barua, the center has been encouraging private institutions to align their corporate social responsibility initiatives with environmental protection efforts within Mt. Makiling.

Instead of conducting short-term activities at different locations, companies are encouraged to adopt points along the mountain's boundaries and participate in long-term tree-planting and forest-nurturing activities.

"Number 1 siguro dito yung pakikipag-partner namin sa mga private institutions instead na ang kanilang mga CSR activities ay kung saan-saan gagawin, instead na sila ay nag-a-adopt ng mga certain points ng mga boundaries ng Makiling na hindi niyo kailangang pag-exert-an ng certain efforts. Nagko-conduct kami dito ng tree planting and nurturing activity kung saan aabot ng years



ang span ng partnership with them," he said.

Barua also cited boundary protection as one of the center's recent concerns, particularly in ensuring that nearby private properties do not overlap with the protected forest reserve.

To address this, MCME has been coordinating with the National Mapping and Resource Information Authority and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources to help maintain and verify the official boundaries of Mt. Makiling.

"For here we are partnering with national agencies like NAMRIA, DENR para siguraduhin na intact yung ating boundaries at, siyempre, kung tayo ay hihingi ng tulong sa mga volunteers, mga NGOS and advocates, definitely kailangan namin ng tulong para siguraduhin na intact yung ating boundaries," Barua stated.

He likewise called on volunteers, non-government organizations, and environmental advocates to support conservation efforts and help protect the mountain's natural resources.

Meanwhile, Barua highlighted the important role

of local government units in protecting the areas surrounding Mt. Makiling, particularly the designated buffer zones located outside the forest reserve's boundaries.

He said that existing presidential proclamations identify surrounding areas as environmentally sensitive zones, where land-use activities should be carefully regulated.

"We are partnering with LGUs and DENR para siguraduhin na yung land use sa mismong labas lang ng boundary hindi siya mababago nang sobra," Barua said.

He warned that excessive urbanization near the mountain could result in the so-called "edge effect," wherein developments such as subdivisions and other infrastructure projects may gradually affect portions of the protected forest ecosystem.

Because of this, the Makiling Center assures its close coordination with direct stakeholders to ensure that development activities around Mt. Makiling remain balanced with environmental protection efforts and biodiversity targets, not only in the Philippines but across Southeast Asia. **(AM/PIA-4A)**

DOH Simbakalusugan brings essential healthcare services to Calabarzon communities

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Health (DOH) in Calabarzon continues to expand access to healthcare services in communities across the region through its Simbakalusugan program, with residents of Talim Island in Rizal province as the latest beneficiaries.

In partnership with the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines – Episcopal Commission on Health Care (CBCP-ECHC), the program aims to bring quality, affordable, and compassionate healthcare services closer to communities, particularly those in geographically isolated and disadvantaged areas.

According to DOH Calabarzon, more than 350 residents of Barangay Janosa in Talim Island, Binangonan, Rizal benefited from the medical mission conducted on May 9.

Among the services provided were medical consultations, vital signs assessment, tuberculosis screening through chest X-ray, electrocardiogram (ECG), dental services including tooth extraction, oral prophylaxis, and fluoride varnish application, mental health counseling, HIV testing and counseling, nutrition services, and the distribution of free medicines.

Beyond the delivery of medical assistance, the Simbakalusugan program highlights the growing collaboration among government agencies, faith-based organizations, healthcare workers, and local communities in advancing inclusive and community-centered healthcare services.

The Simbakalusugan initiative was introduced by DOH Secretary Teodoro Herbosa during the third National Hospital Chaplaincy Conference last year and was formally launched on February 14 in Imus City, Cavite as part of the observance of the 34th World Day of the Sick.

Since its official launch, the program has continued to reach underserved communities across



Calabarzon through a series of medical outreach missions.

On April 11, DOH Calabarzon, together with the CBCP-ECHC, Diocese of Antipolo, and Sta. Cecilia Parish, conducted a Simbakalusugan activity at Sta. Cecilia Parochial School in Barangay Maly, San Mateo, Rizal.

Earlier, on February 22, another Simbakalusugan mission was held in Barangay Cuyambay, Tanay, Rizal, where residents from nearby communities and members of

Indigenous Peoples groups from remote sitios also received medical assistance and healthcare support.

Through Simbakalusugan, the DOH Calabarzon reaffirmed its commitment strengthen efforts to make essential healthcare services more accessible to vulnerable and hard-to-reach communities while promoting solidarity and shared responsibility in public health service delivery. **(PIA4A with reports from DOH 4A)**

Spokesperson: DSWD to support Mayon evacuees until alert level downgrade

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has assured Albay residents displaced by Mayon's ongoing effusive eruption that the government will provide support until the volcano's alert level is lowered and they can return to their communities.

During a media forum, DSWD Spokesperson and Assistant Secretary Irene Dumlao said that the agency has the resources to sustain food relief for families and individuals staying in temporary shelters established for evacuees from areas near the active volcano.

At an emergency meeting of the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, Ma. Antonia Bornas, chief of the Volcano Monitoring and Eruption Prediction Division (VMEPD) at the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology, noted that the agency is considering prolonged eruption.

Bornas said that the volcano's structure continues to inflate, indicating that magma is still ascending within it.

As of May 15, the ongoing effusive eruption of the country's most active volcano has lasted for 130 consecutive days.

"Ang tanong sa ngayon ay, paano kung tumagal itong restiveness ng Mayon Volcano? Kaya po natin ipagpatuloy ito," said Dumlao, who leads the agency's Disaster Response and Management Group.

(There is this question: What if this unrest of Mayon Volcano continues? We are prepared to sustain this assistance.)

She noted that the whole of DSWD has stockpiled 4,696,978 family food packs and has standby funds exceeding P1.2 billion.

Dumlao said that the DSWD is currently monitoring the situation for 1,132 families, or 4,106 individuals, who are staying in 12 evacuation centers, in addition to 26 families, or 85 persons, seeking temporary shelter outside these centers.

DSWD's Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center reported at the forum that more than 70,000 families, totaling approximately 286,000 individuals, have been impacted by the volcano's intensified activity.

Dumlao said that the department has distributed 100,257 family food packs, 1,402 boxes of ready-to-eat food, and 7,634 non-food items. Furthermore, they have provided P56,856,500 in cash assistance to the evacuees.

This financial assistance has been offered through various programs, including Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations, Emergency Cash Transfer, and Cash-for-Work, she added.

Dumlao said that the DSWD is coordinating with local government units in Albay to ensure that their field office is well-equipped with sufficient resources.

"This has been the agreement with the provincial government since early this year, where we distribute family food packs every 15 days," said Dumlao. (PIA Bicol)



PhilHealth expands YAKAP, GAMOT programs across Calabarzon

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) Region IV-A has expanded the implementation and reach of the Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) and the Guaranteed and Accessible Medications for Outpatient Treatment (GAMOT) program across the Calabarzon region.

According to PhilHealth Region IV-A, a total of P592 million has already been released for YAKAP claims, while P9.4 million has been allocated for medicines dispensed through accredited pharmacies across the region under the GAMOT program.

The PhilHealth YAKAP program is designed to provide comprehensive primary healthcare services to all Filipinos. Among the benefits available to members are free consultations and laboratory services, as well as cancer screening services for colorectal, lung, liver, and breast cancer in selected hospitals based on recommendations from doctors in YAKAP clinics.

PhilHealth said it has expanded medicine coverage under the program. From the original 21 essential medicines under YAKAP, an additional 54 types of medicines have been included through the GAMOT program. Under the medicine assistance component, each member may receive up to ₱20,000 worth of medicines annually through accredited GAMOT pharmacies.

At present, there are already 289 accredited YAKAP clinics operating across the region to provide healthcare services, including 75 clinics in Quezon Province, 112 in Laguna, and 102 in Cavite.

Josephine, a resident of Calamba City, Laguna, said she is thankful for the PhilHealth YAKAP and GAMOT programs because they helped lessen her medical expenses, particularly for consultations and maintenance medicines.



"Maraming salamat po sa Philhealth para sa programang ito. Malaking tulong po ito upang magamit sa pagpapakonsulta sa doktor at makabili ng aking maintenance na gamot para sa aking sakit," Josephine said.

To improve the security and efficiency of transactions, PhilHealth has also implemented digital initiatives such as the PhilHealth Check Utility (PCU) for liveness verification, the use of Electronic Medical Records (EMR), and enhanced internet connectivity in healthcare facilities.

Meanwhile, PhilHealth Region IV-A has also been conducting registration drives across the Calabarzon region to encourage more residents to enroll and avail themselves of the agency's healthcare programs and benefits. The initiative aims to strengthen public awareness and ensure wider access to primary healthcare services and medicines under the YAKAP and GAMOT programs. (with reports from Philhealth)
