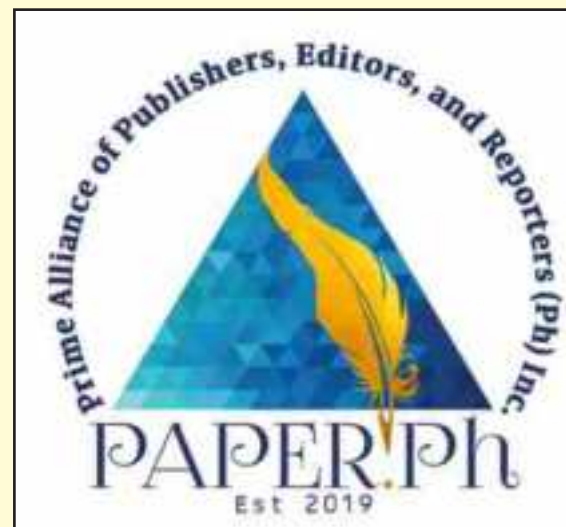

Cebu Customs Chief faces criminal, graft, customs law violations

Cebu Customs District Collector Alexandra Yap-Lumontad has been charged before the Office of the Ombudsman for permitting irregularities within cigarette manufacturing operations at the Mactan Export Processing Zone (MEPZ) specifically in the unauthorized use or forgery of official seals, stamps, and signatures on clearance documents.

In a document furnished to Waterfront News, BOC Cebu Stakeholder alleged that Lumontad allowed the use of falsified/ forged official seals or stamps on clearance documents for cigarette products.

"The falsification of commercial documents used in trade within the economic zone. Facilitation of trade operations despite the presence of manufactured "spurious" or forged tax/ customs stamps," the complaint said.

For allowing the release of goods despite knowledge of falsified documentation would constitute violations of Article 2126 of the Civil Code.

Secondly, there is civil liability for damages caused to the National Treasury and third, there is grave misconduct and conduct prejudicial to the Best Interest of the Service.

The complaint suggested that Lumontad has violated the Revised Penal Code (RPC) and the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA).

In the RVP, the complaint cited Article 161 (Forgery of the Seal of the Government)- forging the great seal of the Government or the signature/ stamp of the Chief Executive.

1st Agriculture and Fishery Provincial Forum strengthens support for Cavite farmers and fisherfolk

The Department of Energy (DOE) bared on Wednesday that the power relief in the Visayas will take three months as several major generating units are scheduled to return to service.

In a press briefing with DOE Undersecretary Mario Marasigan, he said that the KEPCO SPC Unit 2 resumed operations on June 2, 2026, while the Panay Energy Development Corporation (PEDC) Unit 3 is targeted to return on July 3.

The Therma Visayas Unit 2 is scheduled back to online by August 2 and the Therma Visayas Unit 1 on August 30.

It is expected that the return of the four generating units will help ease supply constraints in the Visayas grid,

which currently remain unsolved pressure from multiple plant outages.

As of June, the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) disclosed that 10 power plants were on forced outage, which include nine units have been offline since May.

Another eight generating units have been unavailable since the early 2021, while 17 plants are operating at reduced capacity.

This would total to 1,023.7 Megawatts of generation capacity unavailable to the grid.

NGCP attributed the extended yellow alert to additional forced outages involving several generating units and 64 MW increase in projected electricity demand.

Thus yellow alert is being declared when operating reserves fall below the level required to address potential contingencies in the transmission system.

DOE revealed that the peak demand for the Visayas has exceeded 2,700 MW, while available supply declined to as low as 2,244 MW due to outages at Therma Visayas, PEDC and KEPCO SPC plants.

To address the supply gap, the Mindanao-

Visayas interconnection is operating at its full capacity of 450 MW, which allowed surplus power from Mindanao to the Visayas grid.

The DOE has pursued additional ancillary services, power barges, modular diesel generators and battery Energy storage systems.

A 30-MW battery energy storage facility in Mactan, Cebu is undergoing final testing and commissioning. Negotiations are underway for at least 20-MW of modular diesel generation capacity. Two recently commissioned renewable energy projects have also been added of about 69-MW to the Visayas grid.

Cebu-Russia air connect pushed

If Aklan Province was able to air connect with Russia, why not Cebu? This was raised by Armi Lopez Garcia, the honorary consul of the Russian Federation in the Philippines.

During the Moscow-Cebu Business Forum last week, local officials led by Governor Pamela Baricuatro and the Russian delegation said direct flights remains the key factor in unlocking stronger tourism flows between the two destinations.

"We need to push for direct flights.. the distance is the challenge, but the interest is there," Garcia said.

Despite the challenges, the recent launch of chartered direct flights between Russia and Aklan (Boracay) was proof that the market is viable. With the support of the Local government units and tourism stakeholders, the flights to Aklan were established and brought about 200 Russian tourists weekly.

According to Garcia, Russian airlines had already

expressed interest in launching services, but International sanctions affecting Russia complicated efforts to move the plans forward.

"They also said that if the Philippines allows them, they can bring in 600,000 tourists in that winter season. That was a very big promise -- an impressive number," Garcia added.

Unlike other foreign visitors, Russian travelers typically stays in the Philippines up to 30 days under the country's visa-free entry arrangement for Russian citizens. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

Cebu posted highest among stunted kids

The National Nutrition Council in Central Visayas (NNC-7) reported on Sunday that stunted children continue in Cebu in a 2023 National Nutrition Survey and the 2025 Operation Timbang (OPT) Plus Report.

This was presented during the 52nd Nutrition Month Sales Conference, showing 20,664 cases of stunted children in 2023.

NNC-7 Nutrition Officer III Nasudi Soluta said stunting results from long-term nutritional deprivation and recurrent illnesses, which affects a child growth and development.

"We've already talked to the Cebu Provincial Nutrition Committee about this," Soluta said as she assured that efforts to address the problem are underway.

Among the highly urbanized cities (HUCs), Cebu City ranked third with 2,436 children classified as low height-for-age. Toledo was fifth with 1,835 cases, and

Carcar City with 1,612 cases.

On the nationwide level, Cebu was first with Camarines Sur with 19,560 as second and Quezon with 15,269 as third.

"Stunting in Cebu has really been an issue, a problem for a long time now," she added.

The survey reported those provinces and cities with high numbers of underweight, overweight, and wasted children.

Cebu Province ranked ninth with 3,141 wasted Children. Cebu City ranked sixth among HUCs with 516 cases and Toledo City ranking fourth with 463 cases.

The underweight children, Cebu Province ranked second nationwide with 8,672 cases.

Among HUCs, Cebu City ranked fifth with 1,223 cases, with Toledo City in sixth rank having 858 cases and Carcar City ranking ninth with 605 cases.

For the overweight cases, Cebu Province and Cebu City both ranked fifth nationwide.

In Central Visayas which still includes Negros oriental and Siquijor, Stunting affected 40,674 children or 6.33 percent.

This was followed by underweight children with 18,735 or 2.90 percent, overweight with 12,212 children or 1.91 percent and wasted children with 7,152 or 1.11 percent.

Soluta presented the region's current hunger and food security standing based on the 2023 Expanded National Nutrition Survey (ENNS).

35.6 percent of households in Central Visayas experienced moderate to severe food insecurity which is higher than the national average of 31.4 percent.

NNC-7 emphasized that safeguarding natural resources is essential to ensuring sustainable food systems and good nutrition for present and future generations. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

350 senior citizens joins Yakap-Gamot in Madrideojos town

The Cebu Provincial Government in partnership with the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) in Central Visayas and the National Commission on Senior Citizens (NCSC) has covered 350 Senior Citizens to enroll with Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP) in the Municipality of Madrideojos in Bantayan island.

PhilHealth-7 Acting Regional Vice President Jenet Ann Advincula urged senior citizens to maximize their PhilHealth benefits through YAKAP.

"Please register in all our health services of

government, let's take advantage of these," she said.

An on-site registration, membership record updating, ID card printing, and assistance on YAKAP Clinic selection. Who resulted into the enrollment of 350 Senior Citizens to the YAKAP program.

The Madrideojos Rural Health Unit (RHU) conducted the on-site First Patient Encounter (FPE), which is a mandatory initial health screening and baseline data collection. This collaboration allowed senior citizens to immediately begin accessing preventive and primary care services under the program.

In the Madrideojos, there are 33,287 registered PhilHealth members and dependents as of 2025.

Cebu Governor Pamela Baricuatro expressed her appreciation to PhilHealth and other participating government agencies as she emphasized the importance of collective efforts in providing dignity, security, and meaningful services especially to the elderly population.

Article 171 or Falsification by Public Officer-- a public officer taking advantage of their official position to falsify a document by counterfeiting or feigning any handwriting, signature, or rubric.

And Article 172 or Falsification by Private Individual and Use of Falsified Documents-- pertains to the use of these documents in any trade or commercial transaction.

On the CMTA or Republic Act 10863, Lumontad violated Section 1401 or Unlawful Importation or Exportation-- facilitating the movement of goods through fraudulent documents. Citing Section 1424 or Export Misdeclaration--- if the manufactured cigarettes were for export and used forged stamps to evade proper duties or regulations.

On the Administrative and Anti- Graft laws, the complaint noted there was violation on Section 3(e) of Republic Act 3019 (Anti-Graft and Corrupt Practices Act) as causing undue injury to the Government or giving any private party unwarranted benefits through manifest partiality or evident bad faith.

And violation of the principle of performing duties with the highest degree of responsibility and integrity of Republic Act 6713 or the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials.

With the allegations, the complaint has recommended that a formal preliminary investigation be initiated to determine the

extent of the District Collector's involvement.

Secondly, complaint seek preventive suspension to prevent the tampering of records within the Cebu District Office.

And for the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) be opted to verify the authenticity of the "Sin Tax stamps involved.

Waterfront News tried to interview, Collector Alexandra Yap-Lumontad but refused to answer.

Recently, the Philippine National Police in coordination with the Bureau of Internal Revenue raided Baisesin Global Corp., registered Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA) company.

Seizure of P1.1 billion worth of counterfeit tobacco products and manufacturing equipments.

The raid was conducted on April 10, 2026 in Barangay Basak LapuLapu City Cebu. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

Pinangunahan ni Customs Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno, kasama si National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) Director Atty. Melvin A. Matibag, ang inspeksyon sa ₱35.4 milyong halaga ng mga imported na produktong agrikultural na nasabat mula sa isang cold storage facility sa Nueva Ecija. Ang operasyong ito ay bahagi ng patuloy na pagsisikap ng Kawanihan na ipatupad ang mga batas sa customs, tiyakin ang pananagutan sa paggalaw ng mga imported na kalakal, at suportahan ang mga layunin ng pamahalaan sa seguridad sa pagkain (food security).

Nagmula ang operasyon sa impormasyong ibinigay ng NBI hinggil sa di-umano'y smuggling ng produktong agrikultural at posibleng paglabag sa Anti-Agricultural Economic Sabotage Act at sa Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA). Batay sa ulat na ito, ang Bureau of Customs-Intelligence Group (BOC-IG) at ang Customs Intelligence and Investigation Service-Manila International Container Port (CIIS-MICP), sa pakikipagkoordinasyon sa NBI at Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), ay nagsagawa ng enforcement operations sa nasabing pasilidad.

Sa loob ng bodega, natuklasan ng mga awtoridad ang iba't ibang imported na produktong agrikultural, kabilang ang: 6,088 sako ng maliliit na dilaw na sibuyas mula sa Holland, 1,080 sako ng malalaking dilaw na

sibuyas mula sa China, 3,780 sako ng malalaking pulang sibuyas mula sa China at 12,350 sako ng bawang mula sa China.

Ang mga nasabat na kalakal ay may kabuuang tinatayang halaga na ₱35,437,198.00. Isang Warrant of Seizure and Detention ang ipinalabas noong Mayo 21, 2026, dahil sa paglabag sa Seksyon 224 ng CMTA. Sinusuportahan ng operasyong ito ang direktiba ni Pangulong Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. na palakasin ang seguridad sa pagkain, pangalagaan ang sektor ng agrikultura, at tiyakin ang mahigpit na pagsunod sa mga regulasyon sa customs at kalakalan.

Bukod dito, nagsasagawa na ang NBI ng imbestigasyon laban sa importer at iba pang may pananagutan para sa posibleng paglabag sa Anti-Agricultural Economic Sabotage Act. Nagsasagawa rin ang BOC ng internal na imbestigasyon upang malaman kung may mga tauhan silang sangkot sa ilegal na pag-aangkat at pagbibiyaha ng mga nasabat na kalakal.

Kaugnay nito, muling pinagtibay ng BOC-MICP, sa ilalim ng pamumuno ni District Collector Atty. Felipe Geoffrey K. De Vera IV, ang komitment nito sa maagang pagprotektang sa hangganan, patas na kalakalan, at pananagutan sa lahat ng operasyon.

Samantala, disidido si Commissioner Nepomuceno na hulihin ang mga utak sa likod ng mga operasyon ng smuggling habang muli niyang binabalikan ang mga naunang talakayan sa pagpapalakas ng kooperasyon sa Department of Justice (DOJ) at sa NBI, na ngayon ay nasa ilalim ng bagong pamumuno. Layunin nitong mapatingkad ang magkasamang imbestigasyon at makabuo ng matitibay na kaso laban sa mga matataas na opisyal na nagkakasala.

Sa kanyang pagsasalita noong Mayo 2026 Collectors' Conference, sinabi ni Commissioner Nepomuceno na ang pinag-ibayong pakikipagtulungan sa DOJ at NBI ay nakasentro sa pagbuo ng mas estratehikong

pamamaraan sa imbestigasyon at pagbuo ng kaso (case build-up), na may layuning lumampas sa karaniwang pagpapatupad ng batas at tumuon sa mga indibidwal at grupong nasa likod ng malalaking ilegal na aktibidad.

Ang pagsisikap na ito ay sumusuporta sa direktiba ni Pangulong Marcos Jr. na paigtingin ang kampanya laban sa smuggling sa pamamagitan ng pagtiyak na ang mga kaso ay hindi lamang basta naisasampa kundi masusing iniimbestigahan at binubuo upang epektibong matumbok at mapatungan ng pananagutan ang mga pangunahing sangkot sa mga operasyong ito.

Ayon kay Commissioner Nepomuceno: "Hindi natin hahayaan na kumita ang mga smuggler habang nalulugi ang ating mga magsasaka at nalalagay sa alanganin ang food security ng bansa. This operation sends a clear message that the Bureau of Customs, together with our partner agencies, will continue to pursue those who undermine legitimate trade and exploit our agricultural industry."

"Hindi namin kayang gawin ito nang mag-isa. Kailangan magtulungan ang mga ahensya ng gobyerno lalo na sa pag-iimbestiga at pagbuo ng kaso para masigurong napapanagot hindi lang ang maliliit na sangkot kundi pati ang mas malalaking tao at grupo na nasa likod nito."

Idinagdag pa niya na ang mas masusing koordinasyon sa DOJ at NBI ay makatutulong sa pagpapatibay ng mga kaso at magbibigay-daan sa mas mabilis at mas epektibong aksyon laban sa mga lumalabag sa batas. Ang hakbang na ito ay magtitiyak na ang mga pagsisikap sa pagpapatupad ng batas ay magbubunga ng mga kongretong resulta sa pagprotektang sa kita ng pamahalaan, pagsuporta sa mga legal na negosyo, at pangangalaga sa interes ng mamamayang Pilipino, alinsunod sa Integrity, Accountability, and Modernization (IAM) Movement.

SSS begins early June rollout of 2026 pension hike, citing need for early relief for pensioners

TUEZON CITY, June 2, 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) today begins the early rollout of the second tranche of the Pension Reform Program (PRP) to 4.1 million pensioners, advancing the originally scheduled September pension increase to provide SSS pensioners with earlier financial relief.

Finance Secretary and Social Security Commission (SSC) Chair Frederick D. Go and SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the agency is releasing approximately ₱6 billion in additional pension benefits from June to August 2026 to help pensioners cope with inflationary pressures and higher energy costs.

"We are releasing the second tranche of pension increases ahead of schedule to support millions of pensioners and their families, helping them meet their daily needs and enjoy greater financial security sooner," Go said. "With the early implementation, we hope to provide timely relief to our pensioners and their families as they continue to face every day financial challenges," de Claro said.

He explained that SSS pensioners as of May 31, 2026, will be eligible to receive the pension hike beginning June 1, 2026, while those whose contingencies fall between June 1 and August 31, 2026, will receive their increased pension starting September 1, 2026.

Under the second tranche of the PRP, retirement and disability pensioners will receive a 10% increase in their monthly pensions, while death and survivor pensioners will receive a 5% increase.

"We recognize that rising prices and economic uncertainty continue to place pressure on Filipino families and businesses," de Claro added. "Through the PRP, SSS

ensures that our pensioners have access to timely, affordable and reliable financial support when they need it most."

The PRP is the first-ever multi-year pension increase in SSS history. Under the program, pensioners will receive annual increases in their pensions every September from 2025 to 2027.

DepEd readies IP schools for SY 2026-2027

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — The Department of Education (DepEd) is strengthening its IP Education (IPED) Program to close the digital and structural divide for Indigenous students, emphasizing that education in the Philippines remains inclusive.

In a press conference during the Oplan Balik Eskwela kick-off last June 4, DepEd CALABARZON Regional Director Carlito Rocafort said that schools under the IPED Program are given priority in key programs such as the School Infrastructure and Computerization to address the digital and learning facility gaps in the region's last-mile and IP schools.

"Itong mga eskwelahan na ito, ito 'yung priority ngayon na mabigyan ng mga facilities and other infrastructure at mga computer na magagamit ng ating learners."

The IPED program, which caters to the specific cultural needs of IP learners, remains crucial in pushing for holistic development and cultural preservation especially in public schools. Currently, the region hosts 77 schools spread across seven division offices that are part of the IPED curriculum network based on the community's specific social and cultural context.

"Dito po sa Region 4-A, may mga IP group rin



tayo. As for the implementation ng ating IP education, we have seven schools division offices."

According to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), the CALABARZON region is home to Dumaga, Aeta, and Sama-Bajau who are

predominant in Rizal, Quezon, and Batangas provinces.

With schools reopening on June 8 for academic year 2026-2027, the CALABARZON region is expected to have around 3,867,516 learners across 6,018 schools. (PB-PIA CALABARZON)

YAKAP reaches 66 schools, 7K beneficiaries ahead of school opening

MANILA — The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) is strengthening health protection for students, teachers, and personnel of the Department of Education (DepEd) through its YAKAP (Yaman ng Kalusugan Program) initiative.

The state insurer, in a news release on Friday, said that President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has directed related government agencies to ensure public schools are ready and to protect the welfare of students in preparation for the June 8 school opening.

To date, a total of 66 schools have already benefited from the program, recording an initial running total of 7,084 beneficiaries composed of students, teachers, and school personnel.

This figure is expected to increase in the coming days through the continuous collaboration between PhilHealth and DepEd to promote a healthier student community.

Through YAKAP, essential health services are brought directly closer to schools and communities. Because of this, illnesses are identified and addressed at an earlier stage, helping reduce classroom absenteeism

among students and work absences among parents caring for sick children.

Schools are designated among the priority areas for YAKAP's implementation so that students, from a young age, can receive regular health guidance from their chosen primary care provider.

Under the YAKAP program, the 7,084 beneficiaries can receive medical consultations, required laboratory and diagnostic procedures, and medicines based on the checkup and recommendation of their primary care provider.

"Ang aming pakikilahok sa Brigada Eskwela ay higit pa sa paghahanda ng kanilang kapaligiran. Eligible beneficiaries may register for the YAKAP program using the eGov App or by visiting PhilHealth Local Health Insurance Offices. (PNA)
