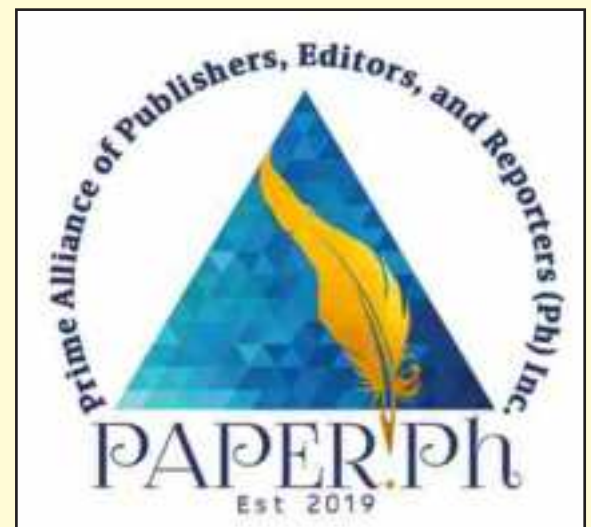

Cavite strengthens response against online child exploitation

TAGAYTAY CITY, Cavite (PIA) — Law enforcers and the judiciary emphasized the importance of technology and digital evidence in the effective investigation and prosecution of child abuse and exploitation cases.

Last June 29 to 30, 2026, judges, prosecutors, and personnel from the Women and Children Protection Desks (WCPD) in Tagaytay, Silang, Alfonso, and General Emilio Aguinaldo underwent a two-day capacity building for the Management of Child Abuse and Exploitation Cases through the Effective Utilization of Technology and Digital Evidence.

Composed of lawyers and law enforcers, the capacity building activity focused on handling cases violating Republic Act No. 11930, particularly Online Sexual Abuse and Exploitation of Children (OSAEC) and Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials (CSAEM) cases in the face of digitalization.

The participants also included judges, prosecutors, and Women and Children Protection Desk (WCPD) personnel from Imus, Tagaytay, Silang, Alfonso, General Emilio Aguinaldo, and Amadeo, as well as members from the Regional Committee Against Exploitation and Trafficking Task Force (RCAETTF).

In a statement, the city government of Tagaytay underscored its commitment in protecting children from abuse, exploitation, and trafficking. "We continue to strengthen collaboration, build capacity, and uphold our shared commitment to protecting every child from abuse, exploitation, and trafficking."

Led by the Tagaytay City Justice Zone, through its Committee on Youth and Children the two-day training aimed to strengthen the justice sector's response to child abuse and exploitation in the digital age.

"Their invaluable expertise provided participants with practical strategies for the effective investigation and prosecution of child abuse and exploitation cases using technology and digital evidence."

The governor as part of the program led the ceremonial administration of Vitamin A and Iron supplements to toddlers during the launching of the 52nd National Nutrition Month 2026.

The provincial government is set to distribute 600,000 Vitamin A capsules and 300,000 iron supplements to Rural Health Units in all cities and municipalities of Cebu.

"If you ask me what kind of Cebu I dream of, my answer is simple. A Cebu where every family has the opportunity to live a healthy and dignified life," Baricuatro said.

"We talk of economic growth, quality education, and tourism but our people are hungry, lacking nutrition," She stressed.

Emphasizing the importance of investing in nutrition as the

foundation of development.

"Malnutrition is not only a health concern. That is why I am grateful that Nutrition is not only being seen as a side program but as a priority.

Cebu Province recorded the highest volume of malnutrition cases with 20,664 stunted children, 3,141 experiencing wasting, and 8,672 classified as underweight.

114k kids to benefit Supplemental Feeding Program in CV

The Department of Social Welfare and Development in Central Visayas (DSWD-7) bared on Friday that more than 114,000 children attending child development and daycare centers in Cebu and Bohol will benefit from this year's Supplemental Feeding Program of the DSWD.DSWD-7 Regional Director Shalaine Mari Lucero told DAILY TRIBUNE that out of the 114,833 children covered by the program in the region, 86,629 are from Cebu and 28,204 from Bohol.

SFP was rolled out on June 22, 2026, as part of its

Intervention to address malnutrition among children and support their overall health during their early years.

Under the program, beneficiaries receive either cooked meals or other approved food items, with fresh milk or milk-based products.

The timeline of the program increased for the year from 120 days to 180 days.

Food supplies have been distributed to 28 local government units in Central Visayas through contracted community-based organizations and associations under

the Sustainable Livelihood program (SLP).

The feeding program comes as child malnutrition continues to affect several cities and municipalities in the region.

Cebu Province alone has 20,664 stunting cases among children below five years old, according to the data from the National Nutrition Council's 2025 Operation Timbang Plus Report.

NBI-BOC inspects P3-B seized smuggled cigarettes from China

National Bureau of Investigation Director Atty Melvin Matibag and Bureau of Customs (BOC) Commissioner Ariel Nepomuceno led on Saturday the inspection of the 25x20 footer container vans which contained smuggled cigarettes from China valued at P3 billion at the Gothong Wharf in Mandaue City, Cebu.

This as Matibag disclosed that they are now building up a strong case on several Cebuano businessmen that are involved in the illegal activity.

"In due time upon filing the appropriate Anti-Agricultural smuggling and economic sabotage laws," He said. Tandia Cargo Handling Services has been identified as the processor of the confiscated shipments.

"It's not only the driver or personnel caught that we are filing cases but the incorporators of the company," Matibag stressed.

Commissioner Nepomuceno for his part said that this is the first time that Tandia Cargo transacted with the Bureau of Customs.

"We have requested the Securities and Exchange

Commission (SEC) the incorporators of Tandia and we will not hesitate to file cases that strong," He said.

During the press conference, Matibag and Nepomuceno updated the media on successful enforcement operations, the significance of the confiscations, and the government's continuing campaign against the illegal tobacco trade and other forms of smuggling.

Joining the activity is the newly designated District Collector of the Bureau of Customs -Port of Cebu, Atty. Zsae Carrie C. De Guzman, who officially assumed office on July 6, 2026, succeeding former District Collector Alexandra Yap-Lumontad.

The seizure of the illicit cigarettes was carried out during the leadership of former District Collector Alexandra Yap-Lumontad.

The enforcement operation commenced on July 2, 2026, following the issuance of a Letter of Authority and Mission Order under Section 224 of the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA).

Acting on intelligence information from the National Bureau of Investigation and the Philippine National Police-Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (PNP-CIDG), the BOC Cebu inspected twenty five (25) 20- foot container vans at Gothong private wharf in Mandaue City.

The inspection resulted in the discovery of illicit cigarettes with an estimated value of P980 million, marking one of the largest anti-smuggling operations conducted in the region.

District Collector De Guzman expressed his commitment to making the Port of Cebu the friendliest port in the country by fostering a culture of integrity, professionalism, mutual respect, and excellence in public service, in line with the Bureau's core mandates of revenue collection, trade facilitation, and border protection.

A month ago, NBI- Cebu Office seized 5x40 container vans in Gothong Wharf and another 6x40 in Barangay Bacayan Cebu city. The seizure valued at P890 million. **(By RICO MIRASOLOSMENA)**

CERA warns unreliable power affects Cebu's growth

The Cebu Electricity Rights Advocates (CERA) warned on Thursday that the power unreliability in Cebu will affect the continued growth and attractiveness to investors as a critical factor.

CERA Lead Convenor Nathaniel Chua told DAILY TRIBUNE that Cebu's status as one of the country's leading investment destinations is now being challenged by persistent grid constraints and thinning power reserves.

"Reliable electricity demand is no longer just a utility concern- it has become a pre-requisite for Economic growth. Without a stable and resilient power system, Cebu risks slowing investments, higher business costs, and reduced investor confidence," Chua stressed.

Electricity demand in Cebu continues to grow by approximately 150 megawatts (MW) annually.

From a peak demand of around 1,260 MW in 2024, the province is projected to require more than 2,100 MW by 2030.

Throughout 2026, the Visayas Grid has repeatedly operated on thin reserve margins despite the return to service of the 150-MW Panay Energy Development Corporation (PEDC) unit 3.

CERA noted that Cebu depends on roughly 700 MW of imported electricity from Luzon and Mindanao through submarine transmission interconnections, making the province vulnerable to disruptions occurring outside

Cebu.

Existing 138- kilovolt transmission lines are likewise approaching their operational limits, although ongoing investments by the National Grid Corporation of Philippines are expected to strengthen the system over the long term.

CERA disclosed that these disruptions do not only extend to the power sector, but investors in data centers, advanced manufacturing, and business processing outsourcing prioritizes reliable electricity before capital commitments.

"The market is no longer looking for raw land alone. Investors are looking for energized land-areas with dependable electrical capacity capable of supporting modern industries and future expansion," Chua said.

CERA calls for the protection of critical utility corridors and strategic energy infrastructure, as it warned that losing these assets to competing land uses could delay future transmission projects and weaken Cebu's long term energy security.

As CERA urged government agencies, the power industry, and local governments to accelerate investments in power generation, transmission, and grid modernization while safeguarding critical utility Infrastructure needed to support Cebu's expanding economy.

"Cebu's economic success cannot outpace it's

energy infrastructure. Reliable, affordable, and resilient electricity is essential not only for consumers but also for protecting jobs, attracting investments, and securing the province's long term competitiveness," Chua said. **(By RICO MIRASOLOSMENA)**

Isang mas moderno, episyente, at transparent na Bureau of Customs (BOC) ang humaharap sa publiko ngayon. - Post Clearance Audit Group (PCAG) sa pamumuno ni Asst. Comm. Vincent Philip Maronilla: Nagsilbing pangunahing bantay post-importation. Sa pamamagitan ng masususing audit, tiniyak ng PCAG na walang nakalulusot na maling deklarasyon ng buwis, na nagpasok ng bilyon-

bilyong karagdagang kita sa pamahalaan.

Ani rin ng ahensya ang pormal na pagkilala at suporta mula sa mga prestihiyosong grupo ng negosyante tulad ng Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI) at Cebu Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) dahil sa pagpapanatili ng patas na kalakalan.

Sa matatag na pundasyong inilatag ng IAM Program at sa pagkakaisa ng buong puwersa ng Bureau of Customs, tiniyak ng ahensya ang mas magandang kinabukasan para sa ekonomiya at seguridad ng bansang Pilipinas.

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MALOLOS CITY ON HIGH ALERT FOR TYPHOON SEASON - MAYOR NATIVIDAD

Malolos City is fully prepared for the typhoon season, with local authorities maintaining high alert status for the past month. "We have established protocols for

all weather conditions, including heavy rainfall, high tides, and typhoons," Mayor Christian Natividad stated.

The City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) and Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (BDRRMO) teams are completing specialized training today. "All units are prepared for both prevention and rapid response to ensure public safety during emergencies," the Mayor added. Information has been disseminated to all barangays, with four major meetings held since preparations began.

"Our geo-hazard mapping has identified vulnerable areas, and we have instructed residents on necessary precautions and response protocols," the Mayor stated.

Regarding past severe flooding and the efficacy of previous interventions, the Mayor expressed concern: "We have long sought funding for flood mitigation. While



some funds have been allocated for flood control, certain projects have proven ineffective, and some have exacerbated the situation by obstructing water tributaries."

The city is coordinating with the DPWH to remove non-functional sheet piles and clear obstructed waterways. "The DPWH has suspended funding and work on all pending flood control projects, even those with critical issues. It is like being told not to treat a wound," the Mayor stated.

He emphasized the need for aligned planning across barangay, city, provincial, and national agencies, noting, "Interventions that help one area often harm another. We require uniformity in planning and execution to ensure that solutions are effective for everyone."

PAGCOR Awards P10 Million in Educational Assistance to Bulakenyo Scholars

Governor Daniel R. Fernando accepted a P10-million educational assistance grant on behalf of the Provincial Government of Bulacan. The check was formally turned over by Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) Chairman and CEO Alejandro H. Tengco during the Monday flag ceremony held yesterday at the Bulacan Capitol Gymnasium. The ceremonial check turnover was part of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the Provincial Government of Bulacan's (PGB) educational assistance programs: "Tulong Pang-Edukasyon Para sa Bulakenyo" and "Ayudang Hatid ay Tagumpay."

Five million pesos will be allocated to 1,000 first-year college students pursuing four-year degrees at public or private universities, while the remaining P5 million will support 1,000 students enrolled in technical, vocational, or two-year programs. During the ceremony, Tengco announced PAGCOR's collaboration with the Provincial Government of Bulacan (PGB) to construct 10 three-storey

school buildings across the province. Each building will feature 13 classrooms equipped with complete facilities, funded by PAGCOR.

ENDURING LEGACY FROM THE ASHES: Mekení leads business sector in unveiling Mt. Pinatubo commemorative marker

CLARK FREEPORT ZONE, Pampanga, June 9, 2026 — A commemorative marker honoring the 1991 eruption of Mt. Pinatubo was unveiled at the Clark Parade Grounds, marking the 35th anniversary of one of the most defining natural disasters in Philippine history and highlighting a shared story of resilience, recovery, and regional transformation.

The marker was jointly initiated by the Holy Angel University—Center for Kapampangan Studies (HAU-CKS), the Clark Development Corporation (CDC), the Department of Science and Technology—Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS), and Mekení Food Corporation, which represented the business sector of Central Luzon during the ceremonial unveiling.

Former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo led the guests of honor, alongside CDC President and CEO Agnes VST Devanadera, representatives from the local governments of Angeles City and Mabalacat City, and partners from academia, science, and the private sector.

Mekení Food Corporation President Pruds Garcia represented the business community, underscoring how the Pinatubo eruption reshaped not only the landscape of Central Luzon but also the trajectory of businesses that would later become drivers of its recovery.

Founded as a small backyard enterprise in Pampanga, Mekení was among the many local businesses severely affected by the eruption and its aftermath. However, the crisis also became a turning point that redefined its mission, transforming survival into service, and rebuilding into purpose-driven growth. From these beginnings, Mekení evolved into a nationally recognized food manufacturing company, while maintaining deep roots in community development and regional pride.

In his statement, Garcia emphasized that the story of Mt. Pinatubo is inseparable from the story of Central Luzon's resilience, noting that the disaster "became both a test and a catalyst" for businesses that chose to rebuild not only operations but also lives and communities.

Today's unveiling of the commemorative marker serves as a collective remembrance of the eruption's impact, while also recognizing the enduring legacy of recovery efforts that followed, anchored on collaboration between government, academia, science institutions, and the private sector.

Beyond remembrance, the initiative also



highlights renewed opportunities for collaboration in heritage tourism, public education, and strategic communications, as Clark continues to position itself as a hub for history, innovation, and sustainable development.

For Mekení, participation in the project reinforces its continuing commitment to be more than a business success story. It stands as a living example of how adversity can shape long-term purpose, where growth is

measured not only in scale, but in contribution to community rebuilding and regional identity.

As Central Luzon reflects on 35 years since Mt. Pinatubo's eruption, the commemorative marker stands as a lasting symbol: from the ashes of devastation rose a shared legacy of resilience, with stories like Mekení's serving as enduring proof that rebuilding can become a foundation for legacy.
