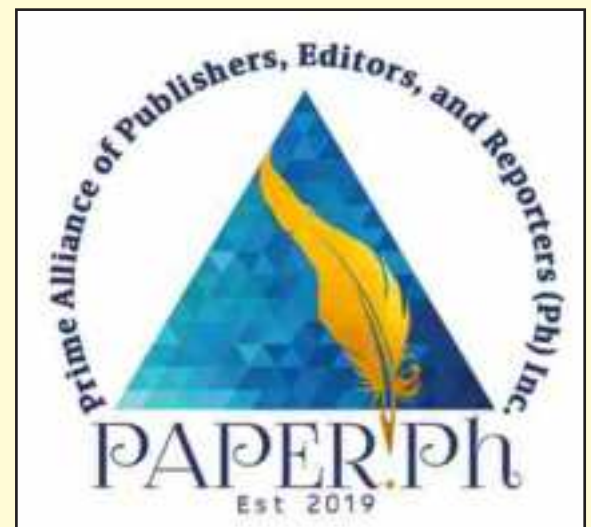

Senate Finance allots P100-M for Cebu Provincial Hospital in Danao City

An initial P100 million has been allocated to complete the delayed hospital building on the Cebu Provincial Hospital (CPH) in Danao City, Cebu.

Senator Joseph Victor Ejercito, the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee made this announcement during his visit in Cebu on Friday.

"One of my priorities is healthcare and i'm happy that Governor Pam Baricuatro jives with such priority, thus an initial P100 million will be allotted for the Danao Provincial Hospital," Ejercito disclosed.

"We had a short talk with Gov PAM and the Senate committee will try to look for funding not only for Danao but to other provincial or district hospitals in Cebu south," the senator added.

It was disclosed that during the previous administration, Ejercito through his efforts has downloaded P50 million for Danao Provincial Hospital and P30 million to the Cebu Provincial Hospital in Balamban in West Cebu.

But the funding was not used for the development or construction of the new building.

Aside from the talk with Governor PAM, the senator visited the Cebu City Medical Center (CCMC) and hinted that the senate committee on Finance May allocate P50 million.

CCMC for more than a decade, has not been fully rehabilitated, and was even declared by Cebu City Vice Mayor Tomas Osmeña as the "most corrupt" infrastructure project in Cebu City.

The Cebu City government already spent more than P1.2 billion for its rehabilitation and reconstruction.

Baricuatro told DAILY TRIBUNE on being thankful to Senator JV and the Senate Committee on Finance to financially assisting Provincial managed Hospitals.

On transportation, Ejercito is hopeful that the province and city of Cebu would already settle on the heritage issue raised for the construction of a Bus Rapid Transit System (BRT) station in front of the Provincial Capitol. "Transportation is my priorities too and any mass transport for Cebu will welcome," he said.

"BRT, LRT, MRT as long as this will provide mass transport for the Cebuanos, we welcome it," he stressed.

BOC-Port of Cebu, Finance Secretary Go Inspect Illicit Cigarette Vans

CEBU CITY – The Bureau of Customs (BOC) – Port of Cebu, joined by Finance Secretary Frederick D. Go, conducted an on-site inspection of 11x40 container vans containing intercepted illicit cigarettes at the Cebu International Port.

The delegation then proceeded to a warehouse in Mandaue City, where separate boxes of confiscated locally manufactured cigarettes was destroyed in a controlled operation led by the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR).

The inspection and subsequent destruction underscored the government's intensified campaign against smuggling and illicit trade, showcasing the close coordination between the BOC and BIR in protecting revenues and ensuring the proper disposal of illegal goods.

The vans inspected at the port are still undergoing processing for eventual destruction, while the boxes destroyed in Mandaue represented a distinct batch of seized items already cleared for disposal.

"This inspection and destruction send a clear signal that we are united in going after smugglers and tax evaders.

Every van we check and every box we destroy protects our economy and public health," said Secretary Go. "I commend both the BOC and BIR for their vigilance and seamless coordination."

Port of Cebu District Collector Atty. Zsae Carrie C. De Guzman reaffirmed the Bureau's commitment: "Our inspection of these vans is just the first step—we are

processing them for destruction to ensure they never reach the market. Today's destruction of a separate batch in Mandaue further demonstrates our resolve. With the full support of the DOF and our partners at BIR, we are tightening our borders and sending a strong deterrent to smugglers."

The visit also included briefings on revenue collection and enforcement updates, reinforcing the shared agenda of the Department of Finance, BOC, and BIR in advancing fiscal stability and border security. Under the leadership of Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno, the BOC-Port of Cebu remains steadfast in its mission to maximize revenue, facilitate lawful trade, and sustain the campaign against smuggling and illicit trade.

Power firms in Visayas under scrutiny after series of red alerts

The Department of Energy (DOE) bared on Thursday that it is now investigating several power companies in the Visayas due to successive red and yellow alerts for the past three days.

DOE Secretary Sharon Garin announced that the Power Bureau of DOE began conducting initial assessments at various generating facilities in the region to identify issues with performance and reliability.

"Our objective is to minimize u scheduled and prolonged plant outages, strengthen long-term grid stability, and make clear that comes with accountability," She told media.

As of August 13, a total of six red alerts have been issued by the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) for the Visayas grid.

By red alert , the energy means that both supply and reserves can no longer meet demand. This is to

prevent overall grid collapse as grid operators usually implement manual load dropping (MLD) such as rotational brownouts.

Usually red alerts are issued during summer due to higher-than-usual demand as consumers use appliances to cool down.

However lately, prolonged forced outages of Visayas' largest coal-fired power plants have been blamed as one of the major contributors in the region's power crisis.

Added to this is the reduced power imports from Mindanao and the isolation of Units 1 and 2 of the Cebu Energy Development Corporation when it's transmission lines within the vicinity of Daanbantayan, Cebu tripped off.

"When government grants a company the privilege to participate in our sector, we expect that company to deliver on its commitments and comply with the standards and conditions that come with that privilege.

Hindi po yan regalo(This is not a gift). It is a privilege," Garin stressed.

The DOE has directed the NGCP to fast-track the completion of contracts that will allow the latter to inject 250 MW of battery energy storage systems (BESS) to the Visayas grid.

A comprehensive master plan is being developed to address the lingering power problems in the Visayas.

Which include assessments of generation facilities regarding their supply reliability and compliance with maintenance programs.

DOE is also working on bringing power barges over the next two years to provide additional energy capacity to the region, and to prioritize updates and establish new transmission projects such as the Luzon-Visayas and Visayas-Mindanao interconnections. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

Nutrition advocates challenged to produce local, protect environment

The Department of Agriculture in Central Visayas (DA-7) challenged on Saturday, nutrition advocates to produce local products and help preserve the environment.

During the Grand Nutrition Award organized by the National Nutrition Council-Department of Health, DA-7 Regional Executive Director Dr. Angel Enriquez said "When you protect nature, you are ensuring a clean and safe ecosystem, and a stable climate condition. And in turn what does it give you?

Well, clean water and healthy soil grow nutrient-rich food; a safe ecosystem prevent toxic chemicals from entering crops, livestock, and aquatic food sources, and a stable weather keeps food prices low and stops food shortages."

She added that nutrition is directly tied up to nature. Do good for nature, in return, nature reciprocates good to the people.

"I am appealing to our Nutrition Champions, fulfill your duties while protecting the environment by integrating sustainable practices into local health programs," Enriquez cited.

She suggested approaches as advocating local produce, encourage communities to eat local and seasonal foods to lower the carbon footprint from food transport.(As every vehicle utilized in transporting food emits greenhouse gases which contributes to global warming, hence, the longer the transport of food is from point A to point B, the more harmful gases it emit).

Secondly, Enriquez said supporting and promoting home and community gardens, as this will provide fresh, nutrient-rich and chemical-free food free of industrial packaging in your locality.



Third, advising plant- forward meals by promoting balanced eating guidelines like Pinggang Pinoy that emphasize nutrient-dense local vegetables and sustainable sources.

Fourth, minimizing single-use plastic by avoiding disposable plates, cups and spoons during dietary Supplementation programs or community feedings.

Fifth, managing food waste by guiding people on how to plan meal portions carefully and set up composting for organic food scraps from feeding center.

And sixth, working closely with local environment and agriculture offices to address how climate change and ecosystem degradation affect local food production and malnutrition.

And the DA can support Nutrition Champions in the region through guiding and connecting to local farmers

or farmer associations in their localities, where food could be sourced.

The DA can provide trainings and orientations in their localities on how to grow their own food, through backyard and/or community gardening; much more, provide the necessary inputs such as seeds/ seedlings, gardening tools and equipment, and even Infrastructure projects (under the NUPAP and HVCDP Projects to include Regular projects for FCAs/ LGUs/NGAs partners, Gulayan sa Bayan, Gulayan sa Barangay, and Gulayan sa Paaralan.

And the DA to provide seminars and orientations on how to manage food waste and in setting up an organic compost. Further, DA can refer to LGUs or Farmer Cooperative/ Association in their localities to avail composting facility. **(By RICO MIRASOL OSMEÑA)**

SSS, CFO strengthen partnership to expand social protection for Overseas Filipinos

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Combating Dengue: Bulacan's Proactive Strategy Amidst Seasonal Surges

Dengue fever surges during the rainy season as stagnant water facilitates mosquito proliferation, placing families at heightened risk. In Bulacan, however, the Provincial Health Office has prioritized the mitigation of this disease through comprehensive campaigns and proactive initiatives that extend to the most remote communities.

Governor Daniel Fernando has directed all city and municipal mayors, in coordination with barangay captains, to personally spearhead these efforts. He ordered strict surveillance of dengue hotspots and case clusters, designating them as top priorities for intervention.

He stated: "We must intensify monitoring of hotspots and clustered areas. Prioritize these locations to eliminate dengue-carrying mosquitoes. Conduct thorough cleaning, regular spraying, and fogging to eradicate the vectors completely."

This guidance remains relevant. Surveillance, sanitation, spraying, and community action are proven solutions; however, these efforts require collective participation. Every household must eliminate standing water, protect against mosquito bites, and seek early

medical intervention. When leaders act and citizens cooperate, dengue can be defeated.

Tsk! Tsk! Tsk! The fight continues. Let us heed the call: monitor surroundings, clean thoroughly, and work together for the health and safety of every Bulakenyo.

BILLIONS SPENT, NO ANSWERS GIVEN: THE INVESTIGATION THAT STALLED.

During a Senate hearing, a witness identified several politicians and private partners allegedly involved in anomalous flood-control projects in Bulacan. Despite billions in expenditures, the flooding persists. Although the accused initially maintained a low profile following these revelations, they have since returned to the public sphere as the Senate inquiry stalled due to procedural delays and political gridlock. Public sentiment reflects frustration, as these individuals are once again visible and moving freely, seemingly unaffected by the disclosures. As the investigation has stalled, no final findings have been issued, nor have any charges been filed.

The prevailing lesson is that truth is meaningless without action. Delays do not protect the innocent; they protect the accused. We call upon the Senate Blue Ribbon Committee, chaired by Senator Erwin Tulfo, to conduct a thorough investigation into these anomalous flood-control projects and restore public trust in the government.

Tsk! Tsk! Tsk! The people deserve answers. We deserve to know why funds vanished while floods persisted. Let this investigation be completed, the truth established, and accountability ensured—not for political gain, but for every family in Bulacan that suffers when the rains come, year after year.

FOOD, CASH, AND A LONG-TERM SOLUTION: GOVERNOR FERNANDO AT SANTA MARIA EVACUATION CENTER

When floodwaters from the Sierra Madre mountains inundated Santa Maria, displacing families and damaging homes, Governor Daniel Fernando arrived at the evacuation center to provide immediate relief and a vision for long-term protection.

Distributing food packs and financial assistance of ₱500 per family, the Governor affirmed his commitment: "We are helping one another. We will not abandon you. We have provided this aid to ensure you can secure your essential needs." He was joined by local officials, DSWD representatives, and the police, forming a united front to serve the public.

Beyond immediate relief, he proposed a long-term solution: the construction of an additional dam and water reservoir in the Sierra Madre to capture rainwater at its source. This addresses the root cause of flooding rather than merely managing its aftermath. Furthermore, he urged residents to take precautions against leptospirosis, emphasizing, "Life matters most. Property can be replaced, but life cannot."

Tsk! Tsk! Tsk! This is leadership—compassion for today and foresight for tomorrow. Relief sustains the body, but dams and watershed protection secure the future. Governor Fernando has demonstrated both heart and vision. We must now ensure that the promise of permanent solutions becomes a reality—not only for Santa Maria but for every community in Bulacan facing rising waters. The people deserve aid during floods, but they deserve more: the prevention of floods altogether.

DSWD lauds LGUs for timely response as gov't assistance reaches Php 20-M

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has credited local government units for the timely completion of their relief operations for the continuous report of the families affected by tropical depression Maymay and the southwest monsoon.

In its August 10 report, the DSWD CALABARZON has logged a total of 100,020 families consisting of 366,427 persons across 554 barangays who were affected by the weather disturbance.

"The increase in the reported affected population is primarily attributed to the completion of Search, Rescue, and Retrieval (SRR) operations conducted by LGUs, resulting in the validation and consolidation of additional affected families and individuals."

The DSWD has accounted for Php 20, 668,403.86 worth of humanitarian assistance for the affected provinces. Of this, the DSWD provided humanitarian assistance amounting to Php 19, 562, 604.96, consisting of Family Food Packs (FFPs), 35 Non-Food Items, and Financial Assistance amounting to Php 20,000.00 provided for the bereaved families of the reported casualties in Rodriguez, Rizal.

Local Government Units also provided various assistance worth Php 1,105,798.00 consisting of hot meals

PhilHealth, ADB, partners rally support for healthcare reforms

The Department of Health (DOH) and the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) presented a 16-month reform plan aimed at advancing PhilHealth's RISE30 Mission and improving access, equity and efficiency in Universal Health Care (UHC) delivery across the Philippines.

The state insurer, in a news release on Friday, said that more than 100 participants, including global development partners, financial institutions, the academe, foundations, civil society organizations, government oversight agencies and other stakeholders, as well as PhilHealth officers and technical staff, convened at the Asian Development Bank (ADB) Headquarters to align resources and technical expertise behind UHC reforms.

DOH Acting Secretary Edwin Mercado, acting PhilHealth President and Chief Executive Officer Beverly Lorraine Ho and ADB Country Director Andrew Jeffries led the 2026 PhilHealth Partners' Forum which facilitated direct alignment of partner resources and expertise with the sector's Shared Agenda and PhilHealth's multi-year Technical Assistance (TA) Agenda.

Mercado shared his vision of establishing a dedicated division for hospital operations to enable a unified hospital command and strategically align healthcare supply and demand.

"That same market-creation model is what we're pointing at for UHC now.

We are looking at implementing a similar one-hospital command to match supply and demand strategically, and also making sure that there will be an agreement between public hospitals and private hospitals," he said.

"That's why I will put up a separate division specific for hospital operation. It's not embedded merely in the CHD (Centers for Health Development). The focus is really making sure there's financial transparency. It's being monitored because I believe that rising tide carries old ship," he added.

Meanwhile, Ho highlighted PhilHealth's efforts to strengthen frontloaded inpatient payments through a global budget using diagnosis-related groups.

She emphasized the shift from simply paying for access to paying for quality, with milestone-based incentives as a way to recognize better health care outcomes.

"And so, now, because providers know that we're paying them substantial amounts of money, I think we can very well ask for results. And so, that's where the quality milestone-based incentives welcome you," she said.

The program also featured a tribute honoring the coordinated success of PhilHealth and its partners over the past 18 months, recognizing the collective effort behind the gains made in advancing UHC reforms.

Department of Finance Secretary Frederick Go expressed his support for, and confidence in, the agencies' shared agenda.

"We recognize that sustainable health financing and a strong institution go hand in hand. Reforms that enhance governance, accountability, and optimize the use of public resources are investments that benefit our health system," he said.

He also highlighted the RISE 30 mission as a clear roadmap for strengthening PhilHealth's reforms.

Meanwhile, ADB Director of the Human and Social Development Sector Office Eduardo Banzon commended the progress PhilHealth has made over the past year.

"Looking forward to this great story to happen and a wonderful ending that we will all tell our children and grandchildren," he said.

Ho reaffirmed PhilHealth's commitment to building this ecosystem of support alongside the DOH.

She said the Technical Assistance Agenda would continue to build on the strong collaboration in long-term planning and to expand the partner network in support of ongoing UHC reforms. (PNA)

LGSF project revives public libraries in Carmona City



CARMONA CITY, Cavite (PIA) — At a time when spaces that promote reading are increasingly rare, the City Government of Carmona built its very own public library and resource center.

A milestone project funded under the Local Government Support Fund-Financial Assistance to Local Government Units (FALGU), the four-storey Carmona City Public Library and Learning Resource Center serves as a hub for audio-visual presentations, community activities and exhibitions aimed at increasing the city's literacy rate.

Completed in 2023, the LGSF-FALGU-funded project cost around P50 million and has served more than 3,026 residents, including students and remote workers.

Located directly across the Department of Education-Carmona's Schools Division Office and Carmona Elementary School, the city library provides convenient access to all students. Given its strategic location, the local government emphasizes that reading materials and learning resources should be readily available to every child in their city.

City Librarian Morena Arellano noted the DepEd's support in driving a strong foot traffic, especially among students.

"Most po ng aming clients ay nasa elementary and high school since dalawang schools sila na magkatabi. After nila mag-lunch, nagpupunta sila dito. Minsan nag-announce kami ng time para maiwasang ma-late sila dahil sa library."

Jodi is one of the top borrowers of learning materials at the Carmona City Public Library. With her school just across the street, she considers a space where she and her classmates can stay and study during their free time a blessing.

"Nakatulong po siya sa pagre-research ko po ng assignments at [sa pagbabasa ng] mga aklat na nakakalibang. Maganda po na mayroong ganitong public library na tahimik."

Beyond promoting a love of reading among children, the public library serves as a safe space for students outside of class hours, Arellano said.

"Mayroon kaming collaboration since mayroon kaming program na Sa Likod ng mga Pahina library orientation. Bale library tour kung saan in-invite namin si SDO Carmona."

Through this collaboration, DepEd Carmona and the Carmona City Public Library launched the Sa Likod ng mga Pahina library orientation program which offered guided tours to help students visit and explore their collection. (PB-PIA CALABARZON)
