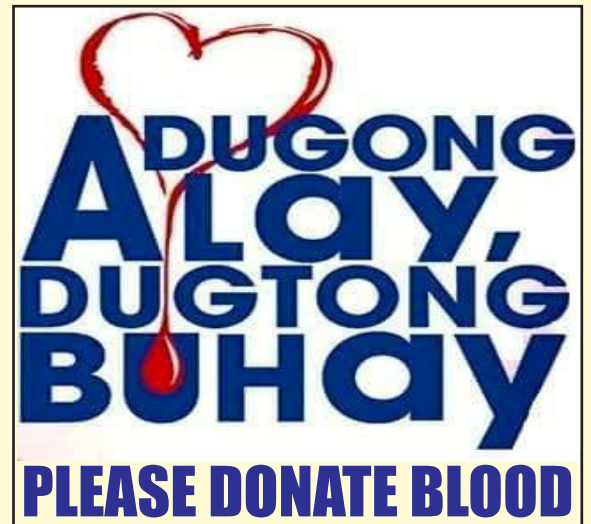

LTO Conducts Orientation and Deputation Seminar-Workshop for DTROs

An orientation and deputation training seminar-workshop for Deputized Transportation Regulation Officers (DTROs) which was conducted by the Land Transportation Office Region-IV-A gathered more than 100 participants from the Road Safety Division of the Office of the Provincial Governor and Tanza Municipal Government at the RFC Mall, Molino, Bacoor City, Cavite recently.



The activity aims to update traffic enforcers and support personnel on existing traffic code, related laws and implementing rules that are currently enforced and to qualify them to become deputized regulation officers.

Mr. Rolando D. Alvaran, OIC, OPG-RSD welcomed all the participants and encouraged everyone to participate for their advantage. An orientation about LTO's functions and mandate was conducted by Ms. Darlene P. Oabel, Regional Deputation and Evaluation Committee (RDEC) Secretariat. Among the topics covered were: R.A. 4136 – Land Transportation and Traffic Code and Other Related Laws, Rules and Regulations; Traffic Signs, Signals and Pavement Markings; Understanding and Avoiding

Road Rage which were delivered by Ms. Clarisa A. Sulit, Chief Operations Division – LTO IV-A. On the other hand, DOTC Joint Administrative Order (JAO) 2014-01 dated June 2, 2014, Driver's Licensing and Motor Vehicle Registration and Salient Features of Special Laws being implemented by LTO were discussed by Mr. Derwin E. Panganiban, Team Leader, Regional Patrol-Operations Division, LTO IV-A. Among the Special Laws were R.A. No. 8749 – The Philippine Clean Air Act; R.A. No. 8750 – Seat Belts Use Act of 1999, and R.A. No. 10913 Anti-Distracted Driving Act of 2013.

A Road Safety Scenario was initially given by Assistant Regional Director Francisco P. Ranches Jr. Jr., CESO VI, RDEC Chairman before the participants were given

information on R.A. NO. 10586 – Anti Drunk and Drugged Driving Act of 2013; R.A. No. 10054 – Motorcycle Helmet Act of 1999 and R.A. No. 10666 – Children's Safety on Motorcycles Act of 2015; Road Safety, Courtesy and Discipline for TROs, Law Enforcement and its Types, Rights of the TROs and Drivers and Good Qualities of TROs. Lastly, the Filling up of Temporary Operator's Permit (TOP) and related topics were communicated with the participants by Mr. Panganiban.

To assess the participants and be qualified as Deputized Transportation Regulation Officers (DTROs), a written examination was facilitated by Ms. Lovely P. Pesor, RDEC Secretariat. The awarding of certificates concluded the event. (PICAD)

CEBU CUSTOMS UNDER SIEGE?

Is the Bureau of Customs (BOC) of the Port of Cebu under military siege? This after stakeholders, officers and personnel and guests were surprised and even threatened as Customs Commissioner Rey Leonardo B. Guerrero ordered to augment security in the port with Philippine Navy (PN), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and Manila based members of the Customs Police Division (CPD).

Com. Guerrero on Monday even installed an alleged Unqualified District Collector in the name of Lawyer Charlito Martin Mendoza, who admitted of getting a Customs plantilla position as "Customs Attorney V." Atty. Mendoza in an interview with media said his assumption as Cebu District Collector is covered by Customs Personnel Order (CPO) which he was unable to present when

requested.

"I don't have copy of my CPO but its with the administrative division," he said. Media then went to the administrative division but officers and personnel there denied having the copy of the CPO. Atty. Mendoza assured though that his appointment and designation has gone through the legal processes with BOC and Civil Service Commission (CSC).

However, Lawyer Zeus Librojo, the counsel for Collector Atty. Elvira Cruz said there were no documents like the CPO and other pertinent proofs that Atty. Mendoza was legally appointed and designated.

Which made them to file a case yesterday before the Court of Appeals (CA) seeking to stop illegal orders being made by Com. Guerrero. Coll. Atty. Cruz for

her part insisted that her removal from office was in violation of Civil Service rules.

In July 1, 2019, the Office of the Customs Commissioner (OCCOM) enforced its earlier order to re-assign Atty. Elvira Cruz as District Collector Port of Cebu to the Collection Monitoring Unit (CMU).

The enforcing team came in full force with several armed Coast Guard men in fatigue, and did not show any Customs Personnel Order or any document. Coll. Cruz questioned Mendoza's appointment and designation as Customs Attorney V as it was for promotion from the ranks not for hiring.

Secondly, a district collector post have qualifications....'years of service' in BOC of which Mendoza never had. On January 10, 2019, the (turn to page 4)

MALASAKIT CENTER BILL TO COMPLEMENT UNIVERSAL HEALTH CARE SAYS CEBUANA REP. OUANO-DIZON

Cebu Province Sixth District Representative Emmarie "Lolypop" Ouano-Dizon as one of the her campaign promises has filed before the House of Representatives a bill "An Act Institutionalizing Malasakit Centers in accredited public hospitals over the Philippines" to complement the Universal Health Care law.

Ouano-Dizon told DAILY TRIBUNE that the House Bill(HB) she filed "will actually complement the Universal Health Care law. With the Universal Health Care law all employed, unemployed and informal sector are already covered by PhilHealth, but there are limits in terms of benefits, so the Malasakit Center bill will cover the limits and in such proposed bill, it will speed up the delivery of assistance of PhilHealth by having a one stop shop in Malasakit Centers."

She cited the 1987 Constitution in Section 15 of Article II provides that: "The State shall protect and advance the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them." In Section 11 of Article XIII, it also mandates that: "The State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health, and other social services available to all the people affordable cost. There shall be priority for the needs of the underprivileged sick, elderly, disabled, woman, and children. The State shall endeavor to provide free medical care to paupers."

Ouano-Dizon added that the health care system in the Philippines has undergone dramatic changes in the last 20 years as the government has instituted various reforms and policies to provide easy access to health benefits for every Filipino. As of 2018, the Department of Health(DOH) listed 721 public hospitals and 70 of these are managed by DOH while the remaining 651 are being operated by Local Government Units(LGUs) and State-run agencies.

Statistics would show that a significant number of indigents and poor Filipinos continues to have no access to adequate health services. But the "NO ACCESS" is attributed not to the non-availability thereof but to its non-accessibility due to the actual distant locations and duplicitous requirements of the various concerned government offices. For these and in order to concretize the President's directive to help the poorest of the poor, the MALASAKIT CENTER was conceptualized.

The Cebuana Solon explained that the Malasakit Center is a presidential mandate initiated by the Office of the Special Assistant to the President(OSAP) in cooperation with the Department of Health and its retained hospitals in selected regions, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation(PHIC), Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office(PCSO), Department of Social Welfare and Development(DSWD), and the Office of

the Presidential Assistant for the Visayas(OPAV). It is a one stop-shop service center of government services instituted for the purpose of expediting processes in availing of services relevant to healthcare, primarily for, but not limited to, financial assistance. Presently, there are 34 Malasakit Centers nationwide with 14 in Luzon, 10 in the Visayas and 10 in Mindanao and approximately 100,000 patients nationwide that has been served on a monthly basis. The vision of the bill is to provide indigent patients with zero balance billing and to unburden indigent patients of documentary requirements for them to avail of various medical assistance and treatments in hospitals by providing a one-stop shop comprised of different agencies which can provide help to families of patients who wish to settle medical expenses.

This will being government services closer to the poor and the marginalized people as these centers are and will be located in hospitals run by government, most of them retained by the DOH. This will help ease complicated medical assistance processes and hasten delivery of medical services as agencies will be housed in one location.

Hospitals can accommodate more patients, with hospital congestion being minimized since patients who can be released from admission can process payment of their bills at a faster pace with the assistance from the Malasakit Centers.

DOTr-TESDA launches TSUPER ISKOLAR for Central Visayas

The Department of Transportation(DOTr) and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority(TESDA) yesterday launched the Tsuper Iskolar program in Central Visayas as the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program(PUVMP) is on its full swing implementation.

TESDA Director-General(DG) Isidro Lapena told the crowd of more than 1,000 Tsuper Iskolars in the region. "I appeal to all our Tsuper Iskolars, the beneficiaries of this scholarship program to complete and finish their chosen course or training, and get the proper assessment so they will earn their National Certificates(NC). Companies on the lookout for skilled workers require potential employees with appropriate NC's."

He said that these scholars will receive free skills training and assessment, Php350 daily transportation and food allowance, and free entrepreneurship training (for Cluster Competencies(CoC) qualifications) to aid them in the possible effects of the PUVMP.

Under the Stakeholder Support Mechanism Component of the PUVMP, both TESDA and DOTr will help "provide training on various skills which include qualifications for the metals and engineering sector, electrical and electronics sector, tourism, garments and textiles, automotive and information and communications technology(ICT) sectors among others," Lapena added.

There will be different qualifications in other skills training program like that of Heavy Equipment Operation(Forklift) NC II, Hilot (Wellness Massage) NC II, Food and Beverage Services NC II, Shielded Metal Arc Welding(SMAW) NC II, Housekeeping NC II, Caregiving NC II, Driving NC II, Bread and Pastry Production NC II Beauty Care Services NC II, and Electrical Installation and Maintenance NC II are being offered in the regions where the scholarship program is being implemented.

For his part, DOTr Undersecretary for Road Transport and Infrastructure Mark Richmond de Leon said the DOTr has allotted initial Php350 million budget that will be utilized by TESDA for the skills training

OCCOM issued CPO or the reassignment order but Atty. Cruz timely appealed the CPO before the CSC.

Last June 7, Atty. Prisco S. Rivera Jr., Officer-In-Charge (OIC) Director IV of CSC issued a directive suspending the reassignment order stating that "Pending appeal of such reassignment Order, the reassignment shall not be executor."

Coll. Cruz asked, "Is the Department of Finance aware of this? Does Secretary Carlos Dominquez know of the Civil Service directive? The said directive from CSC is quite clear. The OCCOM should not have prematurely implemented the reassignment of Atty. Cruz because of the pending appeal.

Her reassignment is therefore premature and violates the right of Coll. Cruz to due process and fair play. To arbitrarily enforce the OCCOM order, with military-like fashion, does not sitwell with a government department which must adhere to the rules and policies of the Civil Service.

Coll. Cruz maintained that she is a long time civil servant and has been respectable and Professional track record in service of the country. All she asks is to be given the proper due process and be heard by the Civil Service Commission, and be accorded a decent and fair chance to defend her honor.

and assessment and development of training regulations and curricula for the transport sector. Of this budget, Php175 million was already transferred from DOTr to TESDA in December 19,2018. The Tsuper Iskolars will be endorsed by the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board(LTRFB) through its regional offices on who are qualified to avail.

LTRFB Chairman Martin Delgra said that there are about 500,000 public utility vehicle(PUV) drivers and operators in the country including transport corporations, who can afford to avail of the PUVMP.

He added in Central Visayas alone, there are more than 11,000 drivers and operators of public utility jeepneys(PUJs) and more than 44,000 public utility vehicle(PUVs) drivers and operators. Lapena added that as of this time, more than 4,500 drivers, operators and their beneficiaries have already enrolled as Tsuper Iskolar.

The target beneficiaries of this project includes but not limited to: 1.) displaced persons affected by the PUVMP; 2.) stakeholders who opt to voluntarily exit from the transport industry; 3.) stakeholders who opt to continue in the transport industry; 4.) new stakeholders in the transport industry; and 5.) family members/dependents of the affected stakeholders up to the third degree of consanguinity or affinity.

Salceda vows to push DDR, TRABAHO as top priority bills

Albay Rep. Joey Sarte Salceda has vowed to strongly and immediately push as priority measures in the 18th Congress the Department of Disaster Resilience (DDR) and the Tax Reform for Attracting Better and Higher Quality Opportunities (TRABAHO) bills. He principally authored the same measures.

The two bills are among the 34 measures he filed in the 17th Congress, 12 of which he considers priority legislations, topped by the DDR and TRABAHO. The 10 others are the Housewives Compensation Act, Amendments to the Public Service Act, Public Schools of the Future, Internet Speed and Connectivity Emergency Act, 35-hour Work-week Act, Last Mile Schools, Science for Change Program, Mandatory Overpass near schools for students safety, Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Modernization Act, and Protection for Freelance Gif Workers in the Gif Economy Sector.

His 22 other bills include amendments to the Retail Trade Liberalization Act, Foreign Investments Act, Fiscal Regime for the Mining Industry, Real Property Valuation and Assessment, National Transportation Act, Capital Income and Financial Taxes Reform, Excise Tax Rates on Alcohol, National Competition Policy Act, Productivity Incentives, National Innovation and Policy Act, Public Schools of the Future bill or PSOFT, Collective Investment Scheme, the New NEDA Law, PNR Authority and PNR Corps, Compensation for SK Kagawads and officers, SKOK or Special eligibility for SK Officers, Moving Barangay and SK elections to 2021, Proof of Parking, National Land Use Act, FinLit Law, Scam Finder Act, Mandatory Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC), and Lowering of Age of Criminal Liability. Salceda, who won his second term unopposed as Albay 2nd district Representative in the last May elections, said the administration's supermajority win in the last polls would ensure the passage of the needed legislations that would lead the country towards more economic, political and social reforms.

The proposed Department of Disaster Resilience will serve as the primary agency to lead, manage, and coordinate national initiatives to prevent, mitigate risks, prepare for and respond to disasters, spearhead recovery and rehabilitation, and build on forward. The DDR measure is deemed long overdue. President Duterte has repeatedly called for the passage of such law in the past three years. The TRABAHO bill, on the other hand, is the second package of the Duterte administration's tax reform agenda, and is actually the biggest incentive promo package.

Salceda said the Housewives Compensation Act aims to give salaries to women serving their husbands and families, who are out of the labor force and are commonly considered "unproductive." The measure amending the Public Service Act clarifies the definition of "public utilities" and thus expands industries eligible for higher foreign investments, while the Public Schools of the Future bill or PSOFT, will serve as a pillar of basic Philippine education and provide "Filipino students the benefit of technological innovations and prepare them for the challenges of future economic and employment realities."

The Internet Speed and Connectivity Emergency Act, aims to address and declare the country's poor internet connectivity as a national emergency which merits immediate solution. The 35-hour Work-week for Public and Private Employees seeks to reduce the number of work hours from 40 down to 35, and promote a more productive labor force, while giving workers more time for their families.

The Last Mile Schools Act seeks to provide access to education, particularly, in geographically isolated, disadvantaged and conflict-affected areas or GIDCA, where school children are known to walk long stretches of mountain paths and poorly maintained roads, cross stream rapids and flood-prone areas, exposing themselves daily to dangers just to learn.

Salceda said the Science for Change Program aims to boost scientific

innovations and inventions, research and development towards social progress, and global competitiveness. The Mandatory Overpass for Students Safety seeks to construct overpasses near schools along roads, especially along the main route of the Pan-Philippine Highway, to better ensure the safety of students and teachers from unnecessary harm from vehicles.

The Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Modernization Act, on the other hand, will shorten the project approval process from 30 months to 18 months and prescribes "clearer parameters on government undertakings." It also allows the "creation of a Risk Management Fund to ensure fiscal sustainability and enhance the ability of implementing agencies in the discharge of their mandates and contractual obligations.
