Entrepreneurs in Cavite who gathered for one of the biggest affairs to capacitate them under the banner "Future-Proof MSMEs: Converging Stakeholder for Inclusive Growth" were welcomed by Provincial Administrator for Community Affairs Mr. Alvin Mojica who also delivered an inspiring message on behalf of Governor Boying Remulla.

Meanwhile, in her keynote speech, Usec. Maglaya told Caviteños how fortunate they are to have a total of 24 DTI Negosyo Centers in the province to assist MSMEs and would-be entrepreneurs. She also disclosed that the agency is also preparing to put up same centers in the barangay level and bring free services closer to those interested in starting their own business. Usec. Maglaya was proud to know that Director Guevara has already committed to start right away, targeting around 35 barangays as pilot for the Negosyo Serbisyo sa

Barangay program.

The program continued with the overview of the activity by PCLEDO Entrepreneurial Division Head, Ms. Liza Gabatan and with the presentation of the BIZ iCreate graduates to further motivate participants to pursue their dreams. The BIZ iCREATE stands for Cavite Responsible Entrepreneurs Aiming Toward Economic Sustainability, a progressive training designed to reach out to entrepreneurs and cultivate in them the proper mindset for ease of management.

Among the resource speakers who helped PCLEDO and the provincial government capacitate entrepreneurs and improve their business skills were Mr. Joey Espiritu, Owner of Tent King, Manang A's Catering, Forrent and Food Chow; Mr. Johner Fernandez, President and CEO of Life with A Plus Learning Resources Inc. and JE Fernandez Publishing House, plus representatives from Pinoy Biznet-Cyber Optimus Philippines, Inc.; First Circle Financial Technologies, Union Bank Global Linker, ROC.ph and PNB Bayad Connect. Everyone provided useful tips to expand business opportunities while sharing true success stories of each business. Participants were moved by the story of Mr. Joey Espiritu who started in the industry as a small entrepreneur doing decorative balloon-making business for party needs and different occasion. Mr. Espiritu shared some guidelines on how to identify business opportunities, saying that for every

problem, the mind of entrepreneurs always work best, being able to think of creative ways on how to turn problems into profit. Com. GUERRERO, Installed New BOC District Collectors!

THE Nine [9] newly designated Bureau of Customs (BOC) District Collectors and two Deputy Collectors were installed by Commissioner Rey 'Jagger' Leonardo B. Guerrero approved by Secretary Carlos Dominguez III.

Designated as Port of Manila (POM) Acting District Collector is Collector ARSENIA C. ILAGAN while former POM District Collector Atty. Ma. Rhea M. Gregorio is now the new Acting District Collector of the Port of San Fernando La Union. Atty. RUBY CLAUDIA M. ALAMEDA takes the reign as Acting District Collector of the Port of Clark, while Atty. Micheal D.C. Vargas is designated as Acting District Collector, Port of Limay. Atty. Francis T. Tolibas, as Acting District Collector Port of Tacloban and Coll. Atty. LILIBETH SANDAG, reassigned as Deputy Collector for Operations Ninoy Aquino International Airport [NAIA].

Also installed earlier were Manila International Container Port Acting District Collector GUILLERMO PEDRO A. FRANCIA IV, Atty. Romalino G. Valdez as Acting District Collector of the Port of Batangas, Port of Davao Acting District Collector Atty. Erastus Sandino B. Austria, Atty. CHARLITO MARTIN R. MENDOZA as Acting District Collector of the Port of Cebu and Batangas Deputy Collector for Assessment Atty. Edward R. Ibero. In his message delivered during the installation ceremony, Com. Guerrero emphasized that graft and corruption is the reason for decrease in revenue collection. It is also the reason criminals are able to sneak in illegal drugs. "Graft and corruption in the Bureau involves not only BOC personnel but also those transacting business with the agency. And it continues to exist because it is tolerated by unscrupulous individuals" Com. Guerrero added.

Com. Jagger Guerrero encouraged all BOC personnel and stakeholders to expose, report and file cases against corrupt employees, importers, brokers, fixers and other entities involved in smuggling, bribery, illegal drugs and other illegal activities.

Despite the numerous challenges faced by the Bureau, it never wavered in its determination and commitment to perform its mandated tasks to increase revenue collection, to comply with President Rodrigo Duterte order to stop corruption and to help boost the country's global trade competitiveness.

DOST Showcases Solutions to UN Sustainable Development Goals in Science Fair

This year's exhibit of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in celebration of the 2019 National Science and Technology Week will be especially relevant as the country transitions into what has been termed as the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

Scheduled to be held on July 17 to 21, 2019 at the World Trade Center in Pasay City, the 2019 NSTW carries the theme "Enabling Technologies for Sustainable Development", and will showcase how science and technology is addressing the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which aim to end global poverty, protect the planet, and ensure peace and prosperity for all. There will be multiple displays put up by the different DOST agencies highlighting the S & T solutions for each of the 17 SDGs. The Regional Offices (ROs) booth, for example, will showcase three (3) of these goals, namely: No Poverty (SDG 1), Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8), and Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (SDG 16).

For the No Poverty exhibit, DOST will show how the Community Empowerment through Science and Technology (CEST) program has contributed to poverty alleviation in the countryside. To increase the public's awareness about the assistance of DOST to MSMEs and communities, success stories of beneficiaries assisted by the different DOST Regional Offices will be presented in dioramas. Majority of those stories will focus on CEST beneficiaries especially the Best CEST Awardees. CEST products will also be on display, such as bags and candles from Barangay Poblacion, Muntinlupa City, a DOST-NCR-assisted community.

The Decent Work and Economic Growth exhibit will focus on making micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) SMARTER – Socially Responsive, Market-Oriented, Agile, Resource-Efficient, Technology-Intensive, Environment Friendly, and Resilient – through the

Coll. Barte Seizes P1.2 Million Worth of Smuggled Cigarettes in Zamboanga!

THE Bureau of Customs [BOC] under the leadership of District Collector Segundo Sigmundfreud Z. Barte JR., and Joint Task Force Zamboanga confiscated 2,125 reams of Smuggled Cigarettes worth P1.2 Million onboard three (3) passenger vessels from Jolo, Sulu, MV Mama Mia, MV Mary Joy 1 and MV Asian Stars.

Operatives from the BOC Enforcement and Security Service ((BOC-ESS) and Customs Intelligence and Investigation Service (CIIS) were assisted by other government agencies the Naval Intelligence and Security Group - Western Mindanao and the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG).

Zamboanga District Collector Segundo Sigmundfreud Z. Barte expressed concerns over the prevalent entry of smuggled cigarettes in the area. Barte emphasized that the Bureau, in coordination with other law enforcement agencies will continue its fervent effort to fight illicit cigarette trade as part of the marching orders of Commissioner Rey 'Jagger' Leonardo B. Guerrero.

The said seized cigarettes were already turned-over to BOC for the issuance of Warrant of Seizure and Detention (WSD) for violation of Executive Order No. 245, the Amended Rules and Regulations Governing the Exportation and Importation of Leaf Tobacco and Tobacco Products and Section 117 of RA 10863 otherwise known as Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA).

It may be recalled that from April to June, this year, over P60 Million worth of smuggled cigarettes were successfully confiscated by BOC officers and operatives of this port.

The seized articles will now be subject to immediate destruction as part of the pre-condemnation procedure considering that the Port of Zamboanga lacks manpower and available storage area. Again....C O N G R A T U L A T I O N S ! ! ! ! !

BOC Imposes Provisional Safeguard Duty to Protect Local Ceramic Industry!

IN line with the Bureau of Customs' commitment to protect domestic industries and producers, the BOC on June 17, 2019 issued Customs Memorandum Order (CMO) No. 28-2019 which imposes a provisional safeguard duty on imported ceramic floor and wall tiles. The said duty shall come in the form of cash bonds and shall be imposed in the amount of P3.00/kg of imported ceramic tiles.

The CMO is pursuant to Department Order No. 19-06, series of 2019 which was issued by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) as it implements Section 8 of R.A. 8800 also known as "The Safeguard Measures Act" as well as the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the said R.A.

DTI determined that the domestic ceramic floor and wall tiles industry suffered significant loss in revenue due to the influx of similar products from overseas, thus diminishing the market share of domestically produced products from 96% in 2013 to a measly 15% share in 2017 and 2018. The determined loss in market share lead to revenue losses for local enterprises prompting the imposition of a provisional safeguard duty on imported tiles.

The provisional safeguard duty shall be imposed for a period of 200 days only and shall be applied to specific tariff headings enumerated in CMO No. 28-2019. The CMO can be viewed at the BOC website through .

MICP Coll. FRANCIA Seizes Misdeclared Agricultural Products!

THE Bureau of Customs [BOC] under the stewardship of Customs Commissioner Rey 'Jagger' Leonardo B. Guerrero and the Manila International Container Port (MICP) District Collector Guillermo Pedro A. Francia seized four shipments from China containing Misdeclared Agricultural Products worth P 15.5 million.

According to Coll. Jay Francia, the misdeclared shipments which arrived at MICP on separate dates last month were issued corresponding alert orders, per request of Customs Intelligence and Investigation Service [MICP-CIIS] Chief I03 Alvin Enciso. After examinations conducted by BOC

Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP) 2.0, with technology demonstrations featuring equipment of SETUP beneficiaries such as CNC laser marking machine, 3D printing machine and form fill seal machine. The concept will show how DOST's SETUP helps in increasing the capability and productivity of MSMEs and subsequently contribute to the country's economic growth. Lastly, the Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions booth will highlight the S&T initiatives in Marawi's Rehabilitation such as livelihood and innovation system support projects, scholarship, and complementary feeding programs for Maranaos who have been displaced by the Marawi Conflict. These are but a few of the DOST assistance that helped the affected residents to start their lives anew.

The Regional Offices' exhibit will also have a Gamezone area featuring interactive activities for kids, an Innovation Lounge to provide a venue for sharing of innovation best practices, training series, and technical consultancies, a Wellness Garden introducing the vertical helophyte technology used in water filtration and a Souvenir Shoppe by OneStore where visitors can buy souvenir items produced by DOST beneficiaries.

NSTW is celebrated every third week of July by virtue of Proclamation No. 169 of 1993, to highlight the significant contributions of science and technology to national development. It has also become a platform for heralding S&T advocacy in the country.

As in previous years, DOST-NCR has taken the lead role in the execution of the ROs exhibit booth. Admission to the 2019 NSTW is free and the exhibits will be open from 1PM to 6PM on July 17, and 8AM to 6PM on July 18-21. officers revealed that there are discrepancies in the weight and declared value of the shipments.

Based on x-ray and physical inspection, one of the four shipments was declared as 3,300 boxes fresh apples but the containers were actually found to contain red onions. Two of the shipments were declared as red beans but were found to contain 5,300 sacks of refined sugar. Another shipment was declared as 1,058 packages of t-shirts but actually contained 200 sacks of rice, 1,300 packages of other food products, 30 packages of medicine and 425 packages of other non-perishable items.

The seized sacks of onions were estimated to be worth 1.8 million at market price, while the seized sacks of refined sugar is estimated to be worth P9.6 million. The sacks of rice and other merchandise were valued at P4.1 million.

BOC on track to meet the P10 billion rice tariff target!

IN line with the commitment of the Bureau of Customs (BOC) to the implementation of Republic Act (RA) No. 11203 also known as the Rice Import Tariffication Law, Commissioner Rey Leonardo B. Guerrero reported that the Bureau is on track to meet the P10 billion target tariff collection set under the law.

Historically, R.A. 11203 which took effect on March 5, 2019 was created to address the crisis that the country faced due to the shortage of rice in the country in 2018. The rice tariffication law replaced the former quota system being implemented on rice imports making it easier for importers and traders to import rice to meet local demands and lower market prices as well as the country's inflation rate. The BOC has reported an increase in privately imported rice under R.A. 11203 with a volume of 966,690 metric tons for the months of March to June 2019 as compared to only 185,100 metric tons for the same period in 2018. An increase of 422.25% in volume was observed which can be attributed to R.A. 11203. An average of 256,445 metric tons per month of rice importation after implementation of RA 11203 was recorded compared to 46,275 metric tons average per month for the same period last year.

The steady volume of rice importation is a strong indication that the BOC will be able to meet the target of P10 billion pesos in tariff collection for the year for remittance to the Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF) as well as other concerned agencies in connection to RA 11203. The RCEF was created to help palay growers and rice farmers' cooperatives transition to a new rice regime. At present, BOC already collected P5,889 Billion from rice importation. Indeed, as the country is aimed to improving its food security, the BOC is likewise committed to do its part to generate revenue and contribute to the advancement of the nation's rice industry.

BOC Widens Its Accessibility Towards The Public!

THE stakeholders can now process and follow up their requests through the use of the Customer Care Portal System (CCPS) and the Document Tracking System (DTS) which were introduced by the Bureau of Customs (BOC) on 17 June 2019.

The CCPS is a web-based system that enables stakeholders to lodge their inquiries, requests, and concerns thru the said portal. Among the features of CCPS is the ticketing system wherein unique ticket number is given to the stakeholders for each of their issue or concern. Through this ticket number, stakeholders can easily track online the status and progress of their request or concern.

Another feature of the system is it ensures that the concerned BOC office or offices attend to the issues and concerns of the stakeholders through a track-based mechanism. Here, a dedicated customs personnel from all BOC offices is assigned to monitor and answer issues and concerns of the stakeholders. The system does not only provide convenience to customs services but also allows users to print and archive conversations, creating a more transparent environment to the stakeholders.

Accreditation requirements can now be submitted to BOC online through the CCPS. Before, stakeholders have to go to the Account Management Office to submit documentary requirements for accreditation. Now, CCPS offers a convenient way for importers and customs brokers to apply for accreditation with BOC.

The DTS, on the other hand, enables the public to view and monitor the status of documents received by the Bureau. These letters/documents are acknowledged, provided a unique barcode number and endorsed to the office concerned. The generated barcode numbers are given to the client upon acknowledgment. Follow-up requests are accommodated upon client's request.

The stakeholders are encouraged to use the two newly implemented information systems to gain convenient access to Bureau of Customs and easily process their requests and concerns.

With the recent developments in its computer systems, the Bureau of Customs has become more efficient and seamless.

"I was very surprised when we inspected the earth-moving when I assumed but they continued excavating and now it has become "very deep," Garcia said.

"To show their good faith(WT Construction),they have to backfill this very risky areas and the Province of Cebu do not have the more than Php7 million funds to do it," she insisted.

She added that WT Construction Inc. knew for a fact that the construction of the 20-storey Resource Center building is not her priority program and it was being awarded to them, she was very vocal against it.

As the Development Bank of the Philippines (DBP) will no longer be releasing the Php1.5 billion loan entered into by then Governor and incumbent Vice Governor Hilario Davide III.

To continue that loan, there should be a loan ordinance that the Provincial Board have to pass, but since majority of its members are against, this will no longer be consumed.

DAILY TRIBUNE tried to get the side of Davide but he refused to answer before the regular session yesterday. The Capitol Resource Center building was supposedly a monumental project of Davide which was called as "Torre ni Davide."

LTFRB-7 LAUNCHES MORE THAN 450 PUVs IN CEBU ON JULY 11 AS IT TARGETS 34K PUVs TO MODERNIZE BY 2020

The Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board(LTFRB) in Central Visayas will launch this week more than 450 modern Public Utility Vehicles(PUVs) for the Province and Metro Cebu areas as part of the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program(PUVMP).

LTFRB-7 Regional Director(RD) Eduardo Montealto in an interview with DAILY TRIBUNE disclosed that initially they already approved the franchises for 110 P2P (Point2Point) high quality buses,100 Electronic Jeepneys(E-Jeeps) and 250 taxicabs for Cebu alone.

This will ply the routes from Cebu City to Lapu-Lapu City with 20 buses, Cebu City to Danao City with designated special stops in the towns of Consolacion, Liloan and Compostela with 45 busses and Cebu City to the town of Sibonga with designated special stops in the cities of Talisay, Naga and Carcar and towns of Minglanilla and San Fernando.

While the 100 E-Jeeps/solar powered will be deployed in Lapu-Lapu City to the town of Cordova and vice versa. And the 250 taxi units have been issued Notices of Selection of the 300 units opened as available.

Montealto clarified though that on July 11, 2019 (Thursday), it launching there will be only 16 buses units,25 E-Jeeps and 50 taxi units that will start to augment the mass

Park and from Duterte Ave.(Banawa) in Guadalupe Cebu City to Ayala and barangay Kasambagan. Euro 4 are diesel fed engines.
