PGC holds Provincial Women's Summit 2019

Hundreds of women from different cities and municipalities in the province representing women's organizations, Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) beneficiaries, LGUs, barangay health workers, uniformed personnel of the PNP, the academe and employees of the provincial government gathered at the Provincial Gymnasium on November 25, 2019 for the Provincial Women's Summit 2019.

In an opening message, Provincial Administrator Mr. Alvin Mojica addressed the guests and participants with affirmation that Cavite is one of the most gender-sensitive provinces promoting programs and initiatives for the protection and empowerment of women. He concluded with high hopes that the event will be fruitful for all the participants.

Representing Governor Jonvic Remulla was Executive Assistant and former Board Member Irene Bencito who is a known advocate of women empowerment in the province. She lauded the efforts of the of the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office and the Cavite GAD Focal Point System for organizing the event. In her message, she pointed out that the fight for women's rights are equally beneficial to men as it is to women since it protects the rights of their wives, mothers, sisters and daughters.

On behalf of keynote speaker Mayor Agnes D. Tolentino, Tagaytay City

Councilor Lorna Sarabia Toledo delivered her message of inspiration and challenge for all the women in attendance. It acknowledged the role of women in development and how they can influence society amidst the challenges that confront them. It also underscored the positive impact of the summit as it provided women with opportunity to assess their contribution in all aspects of society while fostering solidarity in the advocacy for women empowerment.

Ms. Mylene Sotolombo, Local Legislative Staff from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan discussed the Provincial GAD Code and some of its salient features for the information of the participants. From the Department of Education, Ms. Felisa C. Matel, Education Program Specialist talked about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) and how it has been an instrument for providing lifelong skills and learning through continuing education for non-completers of formal elementary and secondary education.

PLTCOL Atty. Arvie

Paraon-Bueno of Cavite Provincial Police Office presented in brief the Magna Carta of Women and its focus on eliminating discrimination against women in all aspects, promoting women empowerment and pursuing equal opportunities for men and women. She stressed that it is not the sole duty of the state to uphold these rights but called on all women to assert and fight for these rights as a personal responsibility recalling how cases of abuse go down the drain whenever women victims withdraw their complaints on accounts of forgiving the perpetrators.

TESDA GAD Focal Person Ms. Jenelyn Dino enumerated the programs being offered by their institutions for different clients including women. Simultaneous activities were done in the afternoon which include medical and dental Mission, livelihood training on decorative balloon making, beauty and wellness services including manicure/pedicure and free haircut and the mini trade and agri fair set up outside the venue. Hard Truths About Happiness No One Wants to Admit

Some people appear to be happy-go-lucky on the outside, but they struggle desperately behind closed doors and never give the matter much thought as to why. They distract themselves with TV, or social media, or whatever it takes to drown out the pain and the truth about their unhappiness. Other people make lavish, life-long plans based on what they have been told "should" make them happy: "I'm going to marry the perfect man/woman, we're going to buy our dream house and a couple cars, and we're going to raise our children in the suburbs." But then they wake up ten years into their plan feeling unfulfilled and depressed. Can you relate at all? Many of us suffer in similar ways.

As long as we're busy doing whatever it is that distracts us from the truth – the whole truth about our happiness and ourselves – we go through life like stones tumbling aimlessly down a mountainside. We bounce and react impulsively to the surrounding environment, and we blunder onward with no clear idea as to where we're headed or why.

We awake every morning wishing we could sleep in. Then we begin each day's work with the foremost intention to stop working as soon as feasibly possible. Our minds grow numb to the monotony of a comfortable yet draining routine. And somewhere along the line, as each day fades into the next, we get our house (sometimes a really big one) and cars (sometimes really fancy ones), and we start a family under pressure... and we never stop to question it all until we feel empty inside, often a decade or two later... as our smiles continue to betray the sadness that we refuse to speak of, and perhaps don't even fully know we carry. This is how many of us live our lives – in a state of denial. We deny the truth about how unhappy we are. We deny the truth about how distracted we are. We deny the truth about how little time and effort we put into the things that matter most to us. And so it goes. But the good news is, we can change. All of us can. Right here, right now, we can start by admitting that...

We often choose to focus on the wrong things – the things that do NOT make us happy. – Here's a universal law of happiness and success: What you pay attention to grows! So focus on what truly matters, let go of what does not, and feel the genuine, positive power that flows from your decision to rise above all the drama and petty distractions.

Most of us don't need more to be happier – we need less. – When things aren't adding up in your life, start subtracting. Life gets a lot simpler and more enjoyable when you clear the clutter (emotional and physical) that makes it unreasonably complicated. Our expectations tend to get in the way of otherwise good days. – On a daily basis, wouldn't you rather be pleasantly surprised than hopelessly disappointed? You can be. A big part of your immediate contentment relies on your willingness to let go of what you assumed your life is supposed to be like right now and openly appreciate it for everything that it is.

Most of what worries us today has absolutely nothing to do with today. – If you worry too much about what might be or what might have been, you will ignore and totally miss what is. Worry is the greatest opposition to the present moment. It does nothing but steal your joy and keep you incredibly busy doing absolutely nothing worthwhile at all.

Old wounds have nothing to do with the present potential for happiness. – Do your best to let GO! And remember, letting go isn't about having the ability to forget the past – it's about having the wisdom and strength to embrace the present. You have a choice, to be positive and free or to be imprisoned by your own negativity – to live in the past or to be mindful about the present.

It isn't what happens, but how we respond that makes us or breaks us. – Being happy and positive does not mean ignoring the negative – being happy and positive means overcoming the negative. There is a big difference between the two. Truly, the biggest and most complex obstacle you will ever have to overcome is your mind. If you can overcome that, you can overcome anything.

The draw of short-term comfort often robs us of long-term happiness. – Don't just make the safe and easy choices because you're afraid of what might happen; if you do, nothing good will ever happen. You can be comfortable or courageous, but rarely both at once. Remember this... remember to stretch yourself in the right direction, one tiny step at a time. Don't let fear and complacency decide your fate. Quit talking about what you want to do and begin doing it. Laziness may appear attractive, but meaningful work leads to happiness.

There are friends and family members in our lives who bring us down. – Although happiness comes from within, it's never



in your best interests to share lots of time with people who constantly bring you down (even if they're a friend or family member). Because, if you're the kind of person who believes there's something out there for you beyond whatever it is you're expected to do – if you want to be extraordinary – you can't get there by shackling yourself to those who hold you back. Instead, you will very likely become just as ordinary as they expect you to be. And there's absolutely no reason to do that to yourself.

Workers in Central Visayas maybe happy as the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board (RTWPB) in its final deliberations has pegged the increase of Php 18 minimum daily wage.

The compromise increase was disclosed by Jose Tomongha, one of the seven board members of the RTWPB-7 on Tuesday, who represents the labor sector.

"It was a win-win solution as management sector wanted only Php 10 increase daily but the labor sector demanded for Php 40 daily," Tomongha said.

He added that the management sector adjusted its proposal to Php 13 daily while labor sector asked for Php 20, thus both agreed to Php 18 increase daily.

This will make the minimum wage in Metro Cebu to Php 404 from Php 386 daily minimum wage. But for Cebu Labor Coalition (CELAC) spokesman Metudio Belarmino Jr. the Php18 increase was "shocking" as they compared it as a "tip" because all prices of basic commodities have increased.

He insisted that the increase is "LIBING WAGE" or burial wage. Central Visayas has four classes namely: A,B,C and D. There are agricultural and non-agricultural and companies with less than 10 employees.

Class A is Metro Cebu with Php 386 daily to Php 404 while Class B is outside of MetroCebu excluding Bantayan and Camotes islands. Class C are Negros Oriental and Bohol and Class D are Siquijor, Bantayan and Camotes islands.

Metro Cebu comprises the cities of Cebu, Mandaue, Talisay, Lapu-Lapu, Naga, Carcar and Danao and the towns of Consolacion, Liloan, Compostela, Mingla-nilla and San Fernando.

Meanwhile, the Kasambahays will have an increase of Php 5,000 monthly from Php 3,500 minimum wage in Metro Cebu. While outside of Metro Cebu but within Central Visayas, the increase will be Php4,000 from Php2,500. Central Visayas comprises the provinces of Bohol, Negros Oriental, Siquijor and Cebu.

The new wage order will be signed by the members of the RTWPB-7 and this will be endorsed for approval by the National Wages Productivity Commission (NWPC). It will take effect within 30 days upon signing and public pronouncement of the NWPC.

FREE SCHOOL SUPPLIES/UNIFORMS/SHOES FOR CEBU CITY'S PUBLIC ELEMENTARY STUDENTS

Cebu City Mayor Edgardo Labella on Tuesday signed the city ordinance providing annual school supplies, uniforms and shoes to all elementary public school pupils in the City.

Labella said that Php500 million will be appropriated from the 2020 annual budget for the program.

"There are more or less 190,000 public elementary school students and it is high time that we give them school supplies and even uniforms," he reiterated. The mayor added that this will encourage the children to go to school.

Labella cited many pupils stopped going to school because their parents could not afford to sustain their education as these free supplies would help cut cost that marginalized households spend for, their children's schooling.

RTWPB-7 WAGE HIKE TO P18 DAILY

The ordinance will be implemented on June 2020 for school year 2020-2021. The sponsors of this ordinance were Vice Mayor Michael Rama and City Councilors Raymond Alvin Garcia and Raul Alcoceba.

CEBU PROVINCIAL BOARD OKS P12-B 2020 ANNUAL BUDGET AS BIG HIKE TO 2019 AT P4.6-B

The Cebu Provincial Board's Budget and Appropriations Committee during its regular session Monday endorsed the proposed annual (2020) budget of Php 12 billion for approval in the next "out of town" session on November 25 in Camotes island.

Sixth District Provincial Board Member Glenn Soco, chairman of the Budget and Appropriations Committee expressed optimism that the 2020 annual budget will be approved without opposition from the other members of the board.

In an interview with DAILY TRIBUNE, Soco said " There's no ceiling on the increase so as long as the LGU can fund the expenditures. The bigger the budget the more programs and projects that we can implement to benefit our constituents."

This after some members of the board questioned the increase of the proposed annual budget to Php12 billion for the 2019 annual budget of Php4.6 billion.

The other question was the expected income of Php180 million from the four provincial and 12 district hospitals in the use of private rooms as income generation.

Governor Gwendolyn Garcia disclosed that the province expects by 2020 about Php 4.2 billion from the implementation of the Universal Health Care program through the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PHILHEALTH).

Citing in 2018, PHILHEALTH reimbursed Php475.8 million to Cebu Province while as of October 2019, it has already reimbursed Php370,043,979 with two more months left.

Garcia aside the health programs will prioritize infrastructure projects especially the concreting of roads in the province. For this year alone by December at least Php670 million has been appropriated for road concreting projects in four cities and 34 municipalities.
